Item Title:

Background/Summary:

In December 2013, City Manager, Mr. Bernard Satterwhite authorized Pierce Goodwin Alexander and Linville (PGAL) to implement the Municipal Building Planning Studies. The purpose of the studies was to assist City Council with making a final decision as to the size, configuration and location of new municipal facilities, which includes: City Hall, Civic Center, Police Station and Municipal Courts. Mr. Jeff Gerber, Chief Executive Officer, PGAL, will present various opportunities as well as a recommendation.

Consideration for the site options included existing Parks Master Plans, existing City Ordinances related to Loftin Park, existing tree locations in Town Center, proposed development of the new elementary school across the street from City Hall on South Rice Ave., existing residential areas, existing amenities in and around Town Center, 2013 Conceptual Studies and previously held public hearings. Parking was also an important consideration in selecting sites and building configuration options.

Previous Council Action Summary:

During the February 25, 2013 City Council meeting Mr. Jeff Gerber, PGAL, presented to City Council an update to the Facilities Plan which reported on the current conditions of City Hall, Police Station and Municipal Courts. City Council voted to replace both facilities during their April 1, 2013 Council meeting. In November 2013, through a bond referendum, the voters of the City of Bellaire voted in favor of funding new facilities.



Item Title:

Presentation of and possible action on a recommendation from the Department of Facilities Management that will outline the procurement process for the selection of Architectural and Engineering services and construction methodology options for the new municipal facilities to include: City Hall, Police Station, Municipal Courts, and Bellaire Civic Center.

Background/Summary:

The Director of Facilities Management, Karl Miller, will present to City Council the proposed process for selecting a firm to provide architectural and engineering services for the Municipal Facilities Project (City Hall, Police Station, Municipal Courts, and the Bellaire Civic Center) and various options available for construction services that meet the State of Texas procurement laws. The presentation will also include a time line addressing the various steps required to ensure sound management of the processes that will assure all City and State procurement laws and ordinances are in compliance.

The State of Texas, Government Code, Title 10. General Government, Subtitle F. State and Local Contracts and Fund Management, Chapter 2254. Professional and Consulting Services, Subchapter A. Professional Services, provides the requirements that the City of Bellaire must follow in selecting an Architectural Firm for the City's Municipal Facilities project. Section 2254.004, Contract For Professional Services of Architect, Engineer, or Surveyor identifies that the City must, "(1) first select the most highly qualified provider of services on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualifications; and (2) then attempt to negotiate with the provider a contract at a fair and reasonable price." The Director of Facilities Management will use the same process followed during the selection of a architectural firm for the Fire Station. This includes advertisement of a Request For Qualifications (RFQ) which will allow interested parties to submit their qualifications for review based on predetermined criteria and an interview process prior to selection. Once that has occurred, the City will then be able to negotiate professional service fees and terms of an agreement prior to making a recommendation to City Council.

There are several options identified when hiring a construction company in the State of Texas Local Government Procurement Code related to construction methodologies, options include:

- <u>Design-Bid-Build</u>: Traditional government procurement method for construction projects. Facility is designed, bids are received and low bid that meets requirements is awarded the contract. This method will attract the most bidders and usually results in the lowest price but often attracts companies that are not as qualified as others. Often the most qualified construction companies don't submit bids figuring less qualified companies will come in with a lower price. This process is good for straight forward projects that are not subject to change. Changes often result in change orders which usually have costs associated. In a strong construction market this method can result in a final product that doesn't necessarily meets expectations.

- <u>Competitive sealed proposal</u>: This method is similar to the Design-Bid-Build method but allows the owner to include qualifications into the evaluation process. It is also good for straight forward construction projects that aren't likely to have many changes or potential

problems. It will also attract a variety of qualified and unqualified contractors to a project. Pricing is based on the submitted bid and change orders often have costs associated. Like the Design-Bid-Build this method isn't as effective in attracting the most qualified contractors in a strong economy.

- Construction Manager at Risk (CMR): The CMR is the construction method used for the Bellaire Fire Station. It is qualification based and the contractor is responsible for providing the City of Bellaire with a guaranteed price (Guaranteed Maximum Price or GMP). Once the GMP is accepted by the City Council the construction company is responsible for ensuring the GMP. If the project is over budget the contractor is responsible for the overage. If the project is under budget the City realizes the cost savings. This method also requires a great deal of documentation and is probably the most transparent method available due to the amount of documentation required since the selected contractor must follow State procurement laws though out the project. The CMR method also fosters a collaborative process by bringing the contractor into the design process early which allows them to begin pricing at an early stage, identifying construction and/or design problems early, allows their expertise to be realized, assists with eliminating potential obstacles, forecasting necessary time lines, optimizes flexibility in procurement options, and reduces change orders. The Fire Station is a good example, no change orders were issued and the contractor worked in a collaborative effort by identifying problems early in the process and bringing them to the attention of the City and the Architect while helping us resolve issues as they were identified. Although time consuming, the selection process is a very important aspect of the process since not all contractors are qualified to provide this level of service nor are they equipped to provide the necessary mechanisms required in the procurement process. It also requires a great amount involvement by staff to ensure the integrity of the process and in decision making.

- <u>Design-Build</u>: This method is exactly what it is termed; the design and building process take place simultaneously and can result in the lowest cost for a project. The General Contractor is required to provide a GMP. The design-build method works well for a project that needs to be expedited, but it requires the owner to be flexible in the end result of the project. There are minimal checks and balances and limited transparency. The Architect is under contract with the General Contractor. It is not a recommended process for complex projects.

- <u>Design-Build-Finance</u>: Developer holds the contract with the owner, general contractor and architect. Project provides a guaranteed price and requires no financing by the owner. The developer is responsible for securing finances and the lending process is usually at a higher rate. There are at best minimal check and balances with limited transparency and requires the owner to be flexible throughout the process and with the end result. Owner's requirements must be defined at the project outset. This would not be a recommended process for the Municipal Facilities Project.

It is the opinion of the Director of Facilities Management, the best construction method for the new Municipal Facilities is the Construction Manager at Risk option. This will ensure the City secures a highly qualified construction company and allows for flexibility in making changes as problems arise and eliminates budget over-runs during construction. It is important that the construction company is identified and brought into the design process early on since they will be an integral part of the design team. This will allow the City the opportunity to utilize their expertise and create a collaborative project team.

The RFQ selection process for professional services and the Construction Manager at Risk construction method are both the same methods used for the Bellaire Fire Station. The end

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result of the Bellaire Fire Station was a tremendous success, no change orders related to original design, the project was completed a month ahead of schedule and the original contract came in \$100,000.00 under budget which resulted in a cost savings to the City of Bellaire.

The Director of Facilities Management is also recommending that the City utilize the American Institute of Architects (AIA) Standard Form of Agreement Between Owner and Construction Manager as the contractual terms of the agreement with the Contractor. These documents will be reviewed by the City Attorney and brought back to City Council for review and approval. The AIA construction contracts were used for construction services at the Bellaire Fire Station.



Background/Summary:

History:

As you know, each May, the nation celebrates "Older Americans Month" in recognition of older Americans' contributions to their communities.

According to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Community Living, "Older Americans Month" was established in 1963. In April of 1963, John F. Kennedy, 35th President of the United States, met with the National Council of Senior Citizens and later issued a proclamation, which served as a prelude to designating May as "Senior Citizens Month."

In 1980, Jimmy Carter, 39th President of the United States, designated what was once called "Senior Citizens Month" as "Older Americans Month." Since that time, "Older Americans Month" has become an annual tradition. The theme for "Older Americans Month 2014" is "Safe Today. Healthy Tomorrow."

Request for Proclamation:

In order to show the City of Bellaire's appreciation and acknowledgement of the contributions made by our older residents, Senior Services Specialist Valerie Langdon, Director of Parks and Recreation Jane L. Dembski, and Recreation Superintendent Cheryl Bright-West have asked Mayor Nauert to proclaim the month of May 2014 as "Older Americans Month" in the City of Bellaire, Texas.

E. Personal/Audience Comments

John Gajewski and Liz Gajewski

Mr. and Mrs. Gajewski addressed City Council regarding new sidewalk construction planned for the 800 Block of Jaquet Drive.

Mr. Gajewski commented that he had received a sewer reconstruction notice several months ago with a reference at the bottom of the notice referring to sidewalk and driveway reconstruction. Mr. Gajewski assumed that the reference to sidewalk reconstruction meant repairs to existing sidewalks, not construction of new sidewalks.

After learning that new sidewalk would be constructed, the Gajewskis distributed a

petition against the installation of a sidewalk on the 800 Block of Jaquet Drive to residents. Mr. Gajewski indicated that 25 homes would be impacted by the installation of a sidewalk, and he had obtained signatures from 20 of the homes.

Several reasons were cited by Mr. Gajewski for the residents' opposition to the installation of sidewalks, which included the impact to trees and sprinkler systems, reduction of green space, and an increase in messes by dogs. Also of note was the fact that Jaquet Drive was not a through street.

Mr. and Mrs. Gajewski urged City Council to take the concerns of the residents be taken seriously and inquired as to what could be done to prevent further construction.

Lynn McBee

Ms. McBee addressed City Council and indicated that she greeted the City Manager's Strategic Planning Process with excitement. Her only concern was with the use of the term "comprehensive" in relation to the strategic planning process or model.

She concluded by noting that she appreciated the newness of the process.

F. Reports

1. City Manager's Report dated April 21, 2014, regarding the Public Works Department Transition, Project(s) Update, and Upcoming Events.

Paul A. Hofmann, City Manager, presented the City Manager's Report dated April 21, 2014 ("Report"), to members of City Council. Topics covered in the Report included a brief summary of the Public Works Department transition, major project(s) update, and an overview of upcoming events.

Following questions of City Manager Hofmann by members of City Council regarding his Report, action was taken to accept the Report into the record.

2. Presentation and discussion of a Strategic Planning Process to include a Five-Year Fiscal Forecast, Preliminary Five-Year CIP, Comprehensive Plan Update and Mid-Year Review.

Paul A. Hofmann, City Manager, presented the process in which the City was preparing the fiscal year 2015 (FY 2015) Budget and the draft Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). It was noted that the FY 2015 Budget and draft Five-Year CIP would be presented to City Council on July 21, 2014, and considered for

possible adoption no later than September 30, 2014.

City Manager Hofmann's presentation outlined a strategic planning process for the City that included the following objectives/benefits: linkage of short- and long-term decision making, linkage of long-term objectives with financial planning, assurance of financial stewardship, implementation of community high expectations, and communication to create effectiveness.

Strategic Planning Model:

A Strategic Planning Model was presented to City Council which consisted of the following six elements: Comprehensive Plan (20-year planning horizon with a review every five years); Council Priorities (five-year planning horizon with a review on an annual basis), Capital Improvement Plan (five-year planning horizon with a review on an annual basis), Fiscal Forecast (five-year planning horizon reviewed continuously), Departmental Plans (three-year horizon with a review every three years on a rotating basis), and the Budget (with a planning horizon of one year reviewed on a quarterly basis).

City Manager Hofmann provided a "Strategic Planning/Budget Development Calendar" to City Council that would be used in preparing the City's FY 2016 Budget.

Comprehensive Plan Update:

A Comprehensive Plan Update was presented to City Council which outlined goals that were in progress or had been accomplished, as well as a summary of work that still needed to be completed. The four main focus areas of the update were as follows: Land Use and Community Character, Mobility, Public Infrastructure, and Commercial Area Development and Enhancement.

With respect to the "Land Use and Community Character" focus area, City Manager Hofmann identified the goals adopted by City Council that were in progress or completed, as follows: Goal 2.1 - protection of residential atmosphere; Goal 2.2 - greater housing choice/life cycle housing; and Goal 2.3 - quality parks and recreation.

One goal was in progress or completed under the "Mobility" focus area. A police pedestrian safety program and enhanced signal timing were cited for that goal (i.e., Goal 3.1 - multi-modal transportation/enhanced mobility).

Public infrastructure projects that were in progress or completed included water well improvements, storm drainage and street improvements, new Fire Station, Bellaire City Library renovations, and planning for the new City Hall/Police Station/Municipal Court facilities.

With respect to the fourth focus area, "Commercial Area Development and Enhancement," the following goals were cited as in progress or completed: Goal 5.1 - transition of RDD to mixed-use TOD (i.e., creation of UV-T zoning district); Goal 5.2 - revitalized City Center (i.e., rezoning of downtown and commercial corridor - UV-D and CMU); and Goal 5.3 - vibrant commercial corridors/improved aesthetics (i.e., design standards in new zoning districts).

In concluding his overview of the Comprehensive Plan Update, City Manager

Hofmann provided a summary of substantial work to be completed.

Council Priorities

A high level overview of Council priorities was provided by City Manager Hofmann which included the following focus areas: Residential/Commercial, Public Infrastructure and Facilities, Budget and Finance, Residential and Recreational, and Economic Development.

Capital Improvement Plan

City Manager Hofmann defined a Capital Improvement Plan as a program that provided a link between the City's comprehensive plan, parks master plan, the annual budget, and the five-year financial forecast. In summary, the plan would focus attention on community-wide goals and needs, allow for an informed public, encourage more efficient program administration, identify the most economically sound means of funding projects, enhance and maintain the City's credit rating, help plan for future debt issues; and define the impact of master plans and studies.

The objectives of projects included in the Capital Improvement Plan were identified as follows: asset protection, beautification, public safety, quality of life, economic development, and/or city services. Funding sources included General Fund contribution, Enterprise Fund contribution, METRO funds, bond authority issued but not appropriated; bond authority issued and appropriated, and new bond authority.

City Manager Hofmann provided an overview of the status of projects currently included in the Capital Improvement Plan within the General Fund, Enterprise Fund, Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Program, METRO Street and Sidewalk Program, 2005 Rebuild Bellaire Program, and the 2013 Municipal Buildings and Parks Program.

Funding challenges included a successor to the Rebuild Bellaire Program, water and wastewater infrastructure, parks and open space, and the Street Pavement Management Program.

Fiscal Forecast:

City Manager Hofmann advised that a five-year fiscal forecast that was structurally balanced provided a planning tool that avoided fluctuating debt service rates, created an operations budget that included all recurring expenditures, transfers to capital, vehicle and equipment purchases, and funded capital improvements projects. Reference was made to the process the City followed in prior years. City Manager Hofmann provided the following suggested approach:

To make maintenance and equipment recurring/base budget items (i.e., budgeted for upfront);

Continue to use conservative budget practices;

Continue to emphasize paying cash for capital projects;

Present a comprehensive five-year CIP and Fiscal Forecast; and

Assumptions regarding Debt Service were discussed and a fiscal forecast for Debt Service with projections through the fiscal year 2019 was provided.

Assumptions regarding the General Fund and Enterprise Fund were discussed and a fiscal forecast provided for both funds.

Mayor Nauert opened the floor for questions regarding City Manager Hofmann's presentation. Following questions, City Council recessed for a five-minute break.

FY 2014 Mid-Year Budget Review:

Assistant City Manager Diane K. White provided the mid-year budget review to members of City Council. It was noted that the purpose of the review was to provide City Council with the status of the City's current budget; to communicate substantial impacts on revenue and/or expenditures; and to discuss the possibility/probability of needed adjustments and the impact of such adjustments to the fund balances.

With respect to revenue collections in the General Fund, it was noted that 81% of the budgeted revenue had been collected as of March 31, 2014. As for expenditures, 49% had been expended in the General Fund as of March 31, 2014.

For the Enterprise Fund, revenues and expenditures were noted to be on target at this time.

Within the Vehicle, Equipment and Technology Fund, all vehicles had been purchased on budget, equipment had been received or was underway and on budget, and technology projects had been completed or were underway and on budget.

Potential budgetary impacts to the General Fund consisted of the following unbudgeted items:

Retirement Pay;

Legal Representation (TXDOT improvements to the IH 610/US Highway 59 corridor);

Final Payment to City Manager Search Firm;

New City Manager Relocation Expenses;

Reclassification of Finance Manager Position to Assistant Director of Finance;

Potential to Collaborate with West University Place on a Compensation Study; and

Pay Out of Compensatory Hours Earned.

In closing, Assistant City Manager White presented a draft FY 2015 Budget

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Calendar to members of City Council.

Following questions of Assistant City Manager White, action was taken to accept the Bellaire Strategic Planning Model and FY 2014 Mid-Year Budget Review into the record.

Background/Summary:

During the month of April 2014, the City Clerk's Office received notification from CenterPoint Energy ("CenterPoint") that CenterPoint had filed its annual 2014 gas reliability infrastructure program ("GRIP") interim rate adjustment (GRIP Filing) for their Houston Division with the Railroad Commission of Texas. The GRIP Filing *could* result in an increase of approximately \$0.48 to a residential customer's monthly charge during 2014.*

*Suspension/deferral of the interim rate adjustment for a period of one year has been requested (see paragraph three of this summary).

According to the *Texas Utilities Code, Title 3, Gas Regulation, Subtitle A, Gas Utility Regulatory Act, Chapter 104, Rates and Services, Subchapter G, Interim Cost Recovery and Rate Adjustment, Section 104.301, Interim Adjustment for Changes in Investment, an interim adjustment in a utility's monthly customer charge may be filed with a regulatory authority as a means for a utility to recover the cost of investment in service for gas utility services. CenterPoint has reported in its GRIP Filing that an investment in safety and dependability of over \$66.6 million was made in its Houston Division during calendar year 2013.*

CenterPoint has also filed a request with the Railroad Commission of Texas for an operational suspension of the interim rate adjustment for a period of one year. If the request is granted, recovery of the cost of investment will be deferred. In other words, customers in the City will experience **no increase** in gas utility rates for one year.

CenterPoint has requested that the City affirmatively approve its request to suspend operation of the interim rate adjustment for one year at any time prior to May 30, 2014, and has provided a transmittal letter that may be signed by a City Official approving the request.

Previous Council Action Summary:

This is the first request the City has received in 2014 for approval of a suspension of an interim rate adjustment for changes in investment.

CenterPoint Energy Resources Corp., d/b/a CenterPoint Energy Entex and CenterPoint Energy Texas Gas ("CenterPoint" or the "Company"), hereby submits its annual 2014 gas reliability infrastructure program ("GRIP") interim rate adjustment ("IRA") filing for the Company's Houston Division and requests that the operation of the adjustment be suspended for one year. In support of its request CenterPoint files the enclosed tariffs and supporting documents, including a CD of the electronic files, with the City of Bellaire ("City"). If the Company's operational suspension request is granted, customers within the City will experience no increase in gas utility rates for one year.¹

The Company's IRA filing is required by Section 104.301 of the Texas Utilities Code. It is an annual filing that would ordinarily result in an increase of \$0.48 to the residential customer's monthly customer charge in 2014.² This is because the Company invested over \$66.6 million in its Houston Division during calendar year 2013 and Section 104.301 requires an annual adjustment to CenterPoint's rates to account for this new investment in safety and dependability. Approval of the Company's operational suspension request however, will avoid an immediate increase and will defer recovery of this investment. If suspended, the Company's current monthly customer charges will remain in effect until superseded by the earlier of (1) the effective date of the Company's next annual GRIP adjustment for the Houston Division; or (2) the issuance of a final order in a rate setting proceeding for the Houston Division.

Pursuant to applicable law, CenterPoint's IRA will become effective on May 30, 2014, unless the City suspends that date for a period of no longer than forty-five (45) days. The City may affirmatively approve the Company's request to suspend operation of the IRA for one year at any time prior to May 30, 2014. For convenience purposes, CenterPoint has also included with this filing a transmittal letter that may be signed by a City Official approving the Company's request. Alternatively, if no action is taken by the City, the Company will deem its request to suspend operation of the tariff approved as of May 30, 2014.

¹ CenterPoint is filing the same request with each city within the Houston Division, as well as the Railroad Commission of Texas, which has original jurisdiction over the unincorporated areas of the Houston Division, as well as authority in those cities of the Houston Division that have ceded original jurisdiction to the Commission.

² The Company's filing would also normally result in an increase of \$0.75 for General Service Small and \$21.91 for General Service Large Volume Customers.

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As required by Section 104.301 of the Texas Utilities Code, in support of the Company's filing, CenterPoint also includes the following:

- (a) An Interim Cost Recovery and Rate Adjustment Report containing accounting schedules and project reports for the GRIP Adjustment Period including a description of (i) the projects undertaken during the GRIP Adjustment Period, (ii) the investment to provide utility service in the Houston Division, which were both completed and placed in service during the GRIP Adjustment Period, (iii) the Company's prior utility investments in the Houston Division that were either retired or abandoned during the GRIP Adjustment Period, and (iv) the cost, need and customers benefited by those investments and retirements (under the "Investment and Retirement Project Report" section of the enclosed filing).
- (b) The Company's calculation of the GRIP Adjustment amount that would go into effect absent the Company's operational suspension request.
- (c) Affidavits by Walter Fitzgerald, Beverly Melchisedech, and Steven Greenley (under the "Affidavits" section of the enclosed filing).
 - Mr. Fitzgerald's affidavit verifies (i) that the Houston Division's books and records are kept in accordance with the rules of the Commission and (ii) that the reports enclosed accurately reflect the Houston Division's books and records related to the information in those reports.
 - Ms. Melchisedech's affidavit verifies the notice of the GRIP filing through customer bill inserts.
 - Mr. Greenley's affidavit concerns the reimbursement of relocation expenses.
- (d) An earnings monitoring report showing the Company's earnings for the Houston Division during the 2013 calendar year (under the "Earnings Report" section of the enclosed filing).

The Company requests that the City return the enclosed copy of this letter with your file mark thereon to acknowledge such filings for our records. In addition, the source documentation and workpapers supporting the data and calculations contained in the foregoing reports is maintained in CenterPoint's electronic databases which are available for review. Consideration of and possible action on a recommendation from the Bellaire Finance Department to award a contract for meter reading services to the lowest responsive bidder, Alexander's Contract Services, Inc., and on the adoption of an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, authorizing the Mayor and the City Clerk of the City of Bellaire, Texas, to execute and attest, respectively, for and on behalf of the City of Bellaire, Texas, a Standard Form of Agreement with Alexander's Contract Services, Inc., for the provision of sufficient personnel and meter-reading handheld devices to complete monthly water meter reads within a seven (7) day work cycle to the Finance Department, Utility Billing, of the City of Bellaire, Texas 77401, on a contract basis for three (3) years, commencing on June 1, 2014, and expiring on May 31, 2017, with an automatic renewal for two (2) consecutive one (1) year periods upon mutual agreement of both parties.

Background/Summary:

The City of Bellaire outsources water meter reading services. The City has approximately 7,600 water and sprinkler meters that are read each month at an annual cost of approximately \$56,000.

Severn Trent Services has provided meter reading services to Bellaire for the past 17 years. These services were last bid in 2005 and awarded to Severn Trent with a price of \$0.60 per meter read with an annual renewal unless either party elected not to renew. In March the City was notified that Severn Trent was proposing a rate increase from \$0.60 to \$1.00 per meter read. In reviewing the existing contract approved by the City Council, it was determined and verified by our City Attorney that the contract did not include a provision for a rate increase. Mr. Fry, Regional General Manager with Severn Trent, also reviewed the contract and concurred that there was not a provision for a rate increase, but stated that they could not continue the contract at the current rate.

Finance solicited bids for meter reading services with a bid closing date of April 9, 2014. We received three responses and one No Bid to Bid #14-005 Meter Reading Services as summarized below:

Alexander's Inc.	\$0.82	\$0.82
Olameter Corporation	\$0.82	\$2.12
Severn Trent Services	\$1.20	\$1.20

The low bid was submitted by Alexander's Inc., a corporation whose main office is located in Atascadero, California, but have offices throughout the United States. They have been in this business since 1968. They currently provide meter reading services to Bryan and

Temple, Texas and provide software and other services to El Paso, Orange, and Lubbock. We have contacted Bryan and Temple for references. Both cities gave very positive references with a high degree of satisfaction with the customer service provided and the response time from Alexander's Inc.

Bonnie Lumpkin, Utility Billing Representative, Bill Mize, Accounting Manager and I had a conference call with representatives of the company. They discussed their meter reading methodology, demonstrated their cloud based technology, and identified the manager and crew that would be servicing the City of Bellaire. Their reading service also includes assistance with ensuring efficient and accurate reads from each meter through their note system. Readers will enter a note and picture, if needed, to identify problems with a meter such as leaks, broken meters, meters with lids missing, or other issues that prevent an accurate read in a timely manner. The Utility Billing staff can obtain a report of all notes and submit a work order to Public Works for repairs. Their employees wear uniforms with ID's and drive vehicles that clearly identify who they are. We feel that they are a very professional organization using the latest technology for meter reading and can meet all our contract terms.

Finance recommends awarding our meter reading contract to the low bidder, Alexander's Inc. The contract is for the period June 1, 2014 through May 31, 2017 with an option to renew the contract an additional two one year periods, provided both parties agree.

Previous Council Action Summary:

City Council awarded this contract to Severn Trent Services in 2005 with automatic annual renewals unless either party gave notice. Severn Trent Services has performed this service for the City for the past 17 year.

Fiscal Impact:

The current contract with Severn Trent Services is for \$0.60 per meter read and averages about \$4,600 per month. The new rate is \$0.82 per meter read and will average about \$6,300 per month. The new contract will be in effect for the last four months of the fiscal year. The current Utility Billing budget in the Enterprise Fund will cover this increase.

Recommendation:

The CFO and Accounting Manager recommend awarding the meter reading services contract to Alexander's Inc.

The ultra-rugged meter reading Mobile 6.1 handheld supplied by ACS is equipped with an 802.11 b/g wireless or Verizon M2M secure interface that can link to the Smart Server from the field for data upload and download from the field. Data can be transferred to and from the wireless field handhelds throughout the day.

This allows ACS supervisors to manage routes efficiently by transferring routes to readers in the field, or as an option, to allow the meter readers to transfer data directly to the Cloud Smart Server Technology (CSST) meter reading system when routes are completed. No time is wasted in an administrative office. Routes can easily be changed or updated in the field as needed, allowing supervisors to manage more effectively and meet deadlines consistently.

All field data is made live on the client's secure area of the Cloud Smart Server from the first read to the last. This simple solution allows for the client to respond to early reading exceptions as they occur. Misreads, unreads and problem meters can be quickly addressed as the information is passed from the field to the office.

Since the CSST product is web based, constant communication and notification can be provided to client management via email and text message regarding the status of read and the various unread and misread conditions coming from the field.

The web based reports populate from the beginning of the read cycle and become complete upon the last meter read in the cycle. Cloud Smart Server Technology comes with dozens of standard reports, yet customized reporting is available by request of each ACS client.

When a reading cycle is complete, an email or text message can be sent to an authorized customer manager or staff member. There are many automated notifications that are triggered by different reading events, and all reports can be accessed from the client's CSST web site. This allows for the most efficient sharing of data possible between client's key personnel, supervisors and managers.

Streamlining Data Flow

The ACS CSST meter reading product will easily provide a seamless interface with the client's utility billing system. There will be no requirement to alter any of the existing interface formats for the upload and download files as related to the billing system.

During the pre-installation phase of the project, ACS will request a data format document of both the upload and download files and a sample of the data so that the proper file interface configuration and testing can be accomplished.

Once the client completes the upload of the data file to the CSST, an email and/or text message is sent to the appropriate supervisor notifying them of the upload. The supervisor can immediately receive and begin reading the file in the field. This same message can be sent to any number of the client's management team.

Since the ACS Smart Server product is interactive, any approved client staff member will be able to log onto the website and see live data regarding the reading process. Among other activity, the staff member will be able to affect some of these features:

Meter ID Locks

ACS's CSST meter reading product provides superior accuracy due to its ID lock solution programmed into the handheld application. ACS does not allow the meter reader to view the previous read or meter ID number making it nearly impossible for a meter reader to enter an erroneous read.

When the meter reader reads a meter, the read must be within the high/low limits set by the billing system. If the read is outside of this range, the reader must enter the meter's ID number that is only found on the meter in question. Once the proper ID number is entered to the unit, it will unlock and show the reader the previous read and the ID number for that single meter only. A photo taken of the problem meter will also be required of the ACS meter reader. Then, at this point the reader is prompted to reread the meter taking the previous read into consideration. This simple function transforms to accuracy in the ACS system and guarantees that each read is authentic.

Supervisor Reads

Rereads can be generated as a filter in the supervisor's handheld in the field. Supervisors can verify rereads are accurate before the data is uploaded to the Smart Server. This eliminates change of schedules for the field readers, and also eliminates the need for the client's staff to process and request these reads for reread since it will have already been accomplished.

These verified reads then have been through two levels of scrutiny before they are uploaded to an interactive report on the Smart Server. The client's staff can decide to accept a read for billing or send the read in question to the field operators for additional verification.

Background/Summary:

Change Order No 1 - Removal of Sidewalks from 800 Block of Jaquet - Total Contracting Ltd. - Rebuild Bellaire, Phase Four Paving and Drainage Improvement Project amending Ordinance No. 13-041

Background/Summary:

During Personal Audience Comments on April 21, 2014 Mr. and Mrs. Gajewski at 845 Jaquet Drive requested City Council reconsider the placement of sidewalks adjacent to residential lots on Jaquet Drive. Jaquet Drive is part of the Rebuild Bellaire Phase 4 Pavement and Drainage Improvement Project. Mr. and Mrs. Gajewski presented a petition signed by 20 of the 37 residents that live on Jaquet. Councilmember Reed requested that this item be on the May 5, 2014 agenda for City Council to consider the removal of sidewalks from the construction documents for the 800 block of Jaquet.

Rebuild Bellaire, Phase Four Paving and Drainage Improvement Project, was approved by City Council on August 5, 2013 by Ordinance No. 13-041 which included the 800 Block of Jaquet Drive. It was designed by HDR, Inc. for a cost of \$429,435, (Ordinance No.12-042) and Construction Observation and Engineering was also awarded to HDR for \$282,290 (Ordinance No.13-042). City Council awarded this project to Total Contracting Limited for a total construction cost of \$5,702,990. The following streets are included in this project.

A neighborhood meeting was held on April 24, 2013 at City Hall where the project was described to the residents. Residents were given a presentation on the plans for all aspects of construction. The neighborhood meetings are designed to communicate as well as to receive feedback from residents on any concerns they may have. Such as special access to their property, special needs, tree concerns, general restoration concerns and preference for no sidewalks; etc.

All attendees are asked to fill out an action form and/or special needs form if they have any concerns. The forms are reviewed by HDR and the City of Bellaire and addressed with each resident before and during the project. At this meeting 27 residents from the various streets above attended. Six residents from four addresses were in attendance from Jaquet.

At the neighborhood meeting for this project in April of 2013, some Bellaire Court residents expressed their desire to have the proposed sidewalks deleted from the project. They were advised to include that in their action form and turn it in that night or later to Public Works. On August 5, 2013 the night that City Council awarded the bid and amendment was made by City Council to remove the sidewalks from Bellaire Court.

Construction began September 16, 2013 on Rebuild Bellaire Phase Four specifically on Aspen and Beech. Jaquet construction began in early January of this year.

At this time there were concerns expressed to the former City Manager from one resident regarding the timeliness of notification and the level of detail given in the flyer. The resident stated that the information that was given was insufficient received during the holidays while many people were on vacation. No request for sidewalks to not be constructed was expressed at this time.

Not constructing the proposed sidewalks adjacent to the residential lots on Jaquet would result in a decrease of approximately \$17,400. The City has installed 500 linear feet of sidewalk in front of the Ware Family Park. This sidewalk in not adjacent to any residences and connects to Elm and then to the sidewalk on IH 610 frontage road.

This project has been delayed two weeks due to the possible deletion of sidewalks from the 800 block of Jaquet. Restoration cannot be completed in the yards where roadway and driveway improvements have been constructed already until the sidewalk is constructed or City Council approves Change Order 1 as presented in the attached.

Right of way restoration includes irrigation system and yard drain repairs, grading behind the curb, and placement of topsoil and sod.

In addition, to this delay the City has experienced a delay with concrete delivery. HDR did request that the City consider an earlier delivery time of 5am which would put delivery to Bellaire first on the concrete companies dispatch list. However, after seeking input from the residents that they were not amenable to an earlier start time we were not able to accommodate HDR's request. We continue to have issues with concrete delivery. Concrete delivery was cancelled for delivery on April 25th.

A tree protection and disposition plan is always prepared for any major project that the City undertakes. The City's Urban Forest Consultant, Jeff Hanawalt prepared a report for the City and was incorporated into the Design and Construction Bid Documents that were approved

by City Council. In addition, limb clearance, pruning, root prune trenching and tree protection fencing are critical to all City projects. Mr. Hanawalt is an International Society of Arboraculture (ISA) Certified Arborist and has consulted for Bellaire for over 24 years regarding protection and preservation of trees.

Terry Maher with HDR and Jeff Hanawalt have met with residents who requested a meeting when construction was beginning on Jaquet including 828 Jaquet where Mr. Anstead was very concerned of the health of the oak in front of his house.

There is an existing sidewalk within the street right of way in front of 828 Jaquet. It was discussed that the sidewalk would need replacement due to some offset joints and the least impact to the tree would be to remove and reconstruct the sidewalk exactly where it is now, raising it slightly to keep it off the roots. City constructed sidewalks are steel reinforced, including steel bars through the expansion joints and are less likely to be displaced and broken by the tree roots.

Previous Council Action Summary:

Approval of Ordinance No: 12-042 - Awarding Contract and Agreement for Engineering Services with HDR Engineering, Inc. for Engineering services, as well as, surveying, geotechnical, urban forester and special subsurface utility location services for Rebuild Phase Four in an amount not to exceed \$429,435.

Approval of Ordinance No: 13-042 - Awarding Contract and Agreement for Construction Observation Services with HDR Engineering, Inc. for Rebuild Bellaire Phase Four in an amount not to exceed \$282,290.

Approval Ordinance No: 13-041 Awarding Construction Contract to Total Contracting Limited, Inc for the replacement of existing asphalt and concrete pavement with a reinforced concrete curb and gutter street, and the construction of storm sewer and associated sanitary sewer and water line adjustments in an amount not to exceed \$5,702,990.

Fiscal Impact:

Negative Variance of \$17,400 to the Rebuild Bellaire Phase Four Program - Change Order No: 1 would reduce the total construction project from \$5,702,990 to \$5,685,590.

Recommendation:

The Interim Public Works Director, Diane K. White recommends constructing the sidewalks as adopted and approved by City Council as per Ordinance No: 13-041 in order to provide safe travel of pedestrian mobility throughout the 800 block of Jaquet and not approving Change Order No. 1 as attached.

RE: Jaquet Drive Sidewalks

Dear Terry,

I recently met with Charles at Jaquet to look at the location of the sidewalks and determine the impact of the trees.

As a rule, I think the trees will be OK if we follow these guidelines within root zones:

- 1. Grade from the new curb up to existing grade in as short a distance as possible.
- 2. Pour the side walk at the new top of the slope and as far from the tree as possible. Typically pouring the sidewalk next to the curb will require more cut and impact more roots.
- 3. Pour the walk with minimal cut +/- 2 to 3 inches and no base stabilization.
- 4. Pour the walk on roofing felt.


The exceptions are:

At 828 – Carefully remove the existing walk and pour back in the same place. At 834 – Put the felt down on grade and pour with minimal or/no cut.


There is a Pecan tree in the vacant lot left of 836. This tree will most likely need to be removed to allow for a driveway when a new house is built. I think the sidewalk can be built in front of the tree for now.


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
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TREE PROTECTION AND PRESERVATION GENERAL NOTES

1. NO SITE PREPARATION WORK SHALL BEGIN IN AREAS WHERE TREE PRESERVATION AND TREATMENT MEASURES HAVE NOT BEEN COMPLETED AND APPROVED.

- 2. THE SEQUENCE OF TREE PRESERVATION TREATMENT MEASURES SHALL BE: A. TREE PRUNING AND CHEMICAL TREATMENT B. ROOT PROTECTION TRENCHING
- TREE PROTECTION FENCING D. SIGNAGE INSTALLATION

3. SITE IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE STAKED BY CONTRACTOR AND/OR OWNER'S REPRESENTATIVE IN ORDER TO FACILITATE LOCATION OF TRENCHING AND FENCING OPERATIONS.

4. TREE PROTECTION FENCING SHALL BE MAINTAINED AND REPAIRED BY THE CONTRACTOR DURING SITE CONSTRUCTION.

5. ACCESS TO FENCED AREAS WILL BE PERMITTED ONLY WITH APPROVAL OF OWNER'S REPRESENTATIVE.

6. ANY EXCAVATION OR GRADING REQUIRED WITHIN THE FENCED ROOT ZONE AREAS SHALL BE DONE BY HAND, WITH NO ROOTS OVER 3/4" DIAMETER BEING CUT.

7. GRADING, IF REQUIRED, SHALL BE LIMITED TO 3" CUT OR FILL WITHIN THE FENCED ROOT ZONE AREAS.

8. TREE, SHRUBS OR BUSHES TO BE CLEARED FROM PROTECTED ROOT ZONE AREAS SHALL BE REMOVED BY HAND AS DESIGNATED BY OWNER'S REPRESENTATIVE.

9. TREES DAMAGED OR LOST DUE TO CONTRACTOR'S NEGLIGENCE DURING THE CONSTRUCTION PHASE SHALL BE APPRAISED BY THE OWNER'S REPRESENTATIVE, REPAIRED OR REPLACED BY CONTRACTOR AT NO COST TO THE PROJECT.



2. ALL TREE PROTECTION TRENCHES ARE TO BE LINED ON BOTH SIDES WITH 6 MIL THICK POLYETHYLENE SHEETING
