I. SPECIAL SESSION - 6:00 PM

A. Call to Order and Announcement of a Quorum - Dr. Philip L. Nauert, Mayor

Dr. Philip L. Nauert, Mayor, called the Special Session of the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, to order at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, May 5, 2014. He announced that a quorum was present consisting of the following members of City Council:

B. Municipal Facilities Design

1. Presentation and possible action regarding the results of the Municipal Building Planning Studies prepared by Pierce Goodwin Alexander and Linville and presented by Mr. Jeff Gerber, Chief Executive Officer.

Karl Miller, Director of Facilities, advised members of City Council that a presentation would be made by Jeff Gerber, Chief Executive Officer of Pierce Goodwin Alexander & Linville (PGAL), regarding Municipal Building Concept Studies ("Studies") prepared by his firm for the City's proposed new facilities. The purpose of the presentation was to assist City Council in making some planning decisions.

Jeff Gerber, Chief Executive Officer ("CEO") of PGAL, began his presentation with a review of the pre-design planning scope objectives utilized in the Studies. Scope objectives included a refinement of the project program, identification of possible building configuration options, identification of parking requirements and opportunities, and a recommendation of a site configuration to be used in the future design process.

City Council initiatives for Bellaire were also considered in the Studies. Studied initiatives specifically included public art, City markers and wayfinding, Comprehensive Plan, Parks Master Plan, City branding, and the Facilities Master

Plan.

CEO Gerber advised that the construction of a new municipal building or buildings provided an opportunity to link together City priorities, such as the creation of a pedestrian-friendly environment, integration of existing or planned community spaces, and enhancement of green spaces, among others.

Sheila Condon, Principal and CEO of Clark Condon Associates, provided four options for district markers and walkable streetscapes for South Rice Avenue and the intersection of South Rice Avenue and Jessamine Street for possible future consideration by City Council.

After showing slides depicting indoor/outdoor spaces that could open to the Park (i.e., Bellaire Zindler Park located in Bellaire Town Square), as well as interior spacing, perimeter parking zones and the possibility for enhancing pedestrian pathways, CEO Gerber provided departmental space program requirements totaling 41,713 gross square feet, apportioned as follows:

Also provided were three municipal facility configuration options with short- and long-term term master plans for each option, as well as the pros and cons for each option.

Consolidated Building Option

The first option presented to City Council was a two-story consolidated building option consisting of a 30,000-square foot footprint to house the Police Department, Municipal Court, Civic Center, and City Hall, the location of which would be on the existing footprint of the City Hall and Civic Center.

The pros listed for the consolidated building option were: 1) having all City departments in the same building, 2) more efficient construction, and 3) maximization of green space. Cons included a large impact on existing trees and remote parking options.

Split Building Option

The second option presented to City Council consisted of one three-story building with a 15,000 square foot footprint to house the Police Department, Municipal Court, and City Hall, the location of which would be on the existing footprint of the City Hall and Civic Center; and one one-story building with a 9,000 square foot footprint to house the Civic Center and Senior Center, the location of which would be on the existing footprint of the Police and Municipal Court Building.

The pros listed for the split building option were: a minimal impact to existing trees and the provision for the largest parking zone among the three options. The possibility for an expansion of the Civic Center to house a future library was

also presented as a pro, along with the ability to open the City's Great Lawn (Bellaire Town Square) to South Rice Avenue.

One con, less green space than other options under consideration, was cited for the split building option.

Campus Building Option

The third and final option presented to City Council was a Campus Building option. This option would consist of three buildings. One building, with a 15,000 square foot footprint, would house the Municipal Court and City Hall, the location of which would be on the existing footprint of the City Hall and Civic Center. A second building, with a 9,000 square foot footprint, would house the Civic Center and Senior Center, the location of which would be on the existing footprint of the Police and Municipal Court Building. The third building would consist of a 10,000 square foot footprint to serve the Police Department. The location of this building was between the existing Fire Station and Library.

The pros listed for the campus building option included the creation of a public safety zone, the separation of City functions, and the ability to open the City's Great Lawn (Bellaire Town Square) to South Rice Avenue.

One con, somewhat less green space than other options under consideration, was cited for the campus building option.

Conclusion and Recommendation

CEO Gerber indicated that one big decision to be made by members of City Council was whether or not to continue to house the Police Department and Municipal Court in the same building. Benefits for housing the Police Department and Municipal Court in the same and different buildings were provided at this point in CEO Gerber's presentation.

The configuration recommended by PGAL was the campus of building options as it created a public safety zone, expanded the existing park, maximized pedestrian corridors, and moved parking to the perimeter of the various sites.

Mayor Nauert thanked CEO Gerber for the efforts put into his presentation and opened the floor for questions from City Council.

Following questions from members of City Council, Mayor Nauert suggested that City Council be given time to review the presentation and that City Council take any necessary action(s) related to municipal facilities at a future City Council meeting.

Mayor Nauert adjourned the Special Session at 7:04 p.m. for a recess. He indicated that City Council would reconvene in the Special Session to consider the municipal facilities procurement process at the completion of the Regular Session of City Council.

 Presentation of and possible action on a recommendation from the Department of Facilities Management that will outline the procurement process for the selection of Architectural and Engineering services and construction methodology options for the new municipal facilities to include: City Hall, Police Station, Municipal Courts, and Bellaire Civic Center.

Members of City Council reconvened in Special Session on Monday, May 5, 2014, at 8:59 p.m.

Mayor Nauert advised that he and City Manager Hofmann discussed tactical approaches to the items listed on the Special Session agenda. It was suggested that City Council consider the physical schematic of the proposed facilities and various options available for project administration at a future City Council meeting to be scheduled by the Mayor and City Manager.

No objections were voiced by members of City Council. (Requested by Karl Miller, Facilities Management)

F. Personal/Audience Comments

Soumya Regge:

Ms. Regge addressed City Council regarding the agenda item under consideration this

evening to remove the sidewalk planned for Jaquet Drive [i.e., a part of the Rebuild Bellaire, Phase Four Paving and Drainage Improvements Project]. Ms. Regge advised that she was in favor of installing sidewalks on the entire street. She advised further that the City had a responsibility to build a safe neighborhood and urged City Council to consider the safety of children rather than the loss of green space.

Charles and Diana Willis:

Mr. and Ms. Willis also addressed City Council regarding the agenda item under consideration to remove the sidewalk planned for Jaquet Drive. The Willis' indicated that they had never desired sidewalks on Jaquet Drive and stated that the street was not a thoroughfare. The Willis' cited lack of green space and concern for trees as reasons for their opposition to sidewalks. Also referenced was a petition submitted by Jaquet Drive residents to the City of Bellaire opposing the sidewalks. The Willis' indicated that 80% of the residents on Jaquet Drive had signed the petition.

Bob Henschen:

Mr. Henschen addressed City Council regarding the agenda item under consideration to remove the sidewalk planned for Jaquet Drive. He indicated that there was no need for sidewalks on Jaquet Drive, a horseshoe-shaped street, in terms of safety. He also cited a further delay in the use of the street by residents for the installation of a sidewalk. Mr. Henschen urged City Council to take a look at the street, noting that very few cars traveled on the street.

Dr. Julieana Nichols:

Dr. Nichols addressed City Council regarding the agenda item under consideration to remove the sidewalk planned for Jaquet Drive. She indicated that she knew some neighbors had created a petition in opposition of sidewalk construction, but did not know that most of the residents would oppose sidewalks. Dr. Nichols cited statistics regarding injuries to children on streets with and without sidewalks. The chance for injury on a street with a sidewalk was 88% lower than a street without a sidewalk according to Dr. Nichols.

Dr. Nichols shared an incident that occurred in the Galleria area resulting in the loss of a friend's child while crossing the street to go to school. Dr. Nichols regretted that she and others had not done enough to advocate for changes in the area. In closing, Dr. Nichols urged City Council to install sidewalks on Jaquet Drive for the safety of children and adults.

Lynn McBee:

Ms. McBee addressed City Council on two issues. The first issue dealt with the Democrat and Republican Primary Runoff Election to be held on Tuesday, May 27, 2014. She indicated that Democrats in all five Bellaire precincts would vote in the Bellaire Civic Center. Three of the Republican precincts would vote in the Bellaire Civic Center; she was uncertain as to the voting location of the remaining two Bellaire Republican precincts. Ms. McBee advised further that it was her understanding that a total of 24 Harris County precincts would vote in the Bellaire Civic Center on Tuesday, May 27, 2014. She urged residents to get out and vote.

Richard Franke:

Mr. Franke addressed City Council regarding the agenda item under consideration to

remove the sidewalk planned for Jaquet Drive. He stated that old attitudes needed to change. He referenced several nearby planned communities and indicated that all of them had sidewalks for residents to travel to parks and through the neighborhoods.

In closing, Mr. Franke indicated that although he was not a resident of Jaquet Drive, he was in favor of sidewalks for the protection of children and any pedestrians.

John and Liz Gajewski:

Mr. Gajewski and Ms. Gajewski expressed their appreciation to City Council for reconsidering the request from residents on Jaquet Drive to remove the sidewalk planned for construction.

Mr. Gajewski recognized members of the audience that were present and in support of the petition opposing sidewalks.

Scott Blair:

Mr. Blair addressed City Council regarding the agenda item under consideration to remove the sidewalk planned for Jaquet Drive. He indicated that children would play in the street regardless of whether there were sidewalks or not. He cited the loss of trees as a reason for his opposition to the sidewalks on Jaquet Drive.

Ovidiu Moise:

Mr. Moise addressed City Council in opposition to the installation of sidewalks on Jaquet Drive. He referenced other planned communities, such as The Woodlands and Katy, where there were streets without sidewalks. He closed and stated that children were not the issue; the issue was a reduction in lawns and green space, as well as the loss of trees.

Chief Financial Officer Linda Symank provided a brief overview of the bidding and evaluation process the Finance Department conducted to contract with a company that would provide personnel and handheld devices necessary to perform meter-reading services for the City of Bellaire's water utility system.

Following Chief Financial Officer Symank's overview, Mayor Nauert called for a motion on the Finance Department's recommendation.
