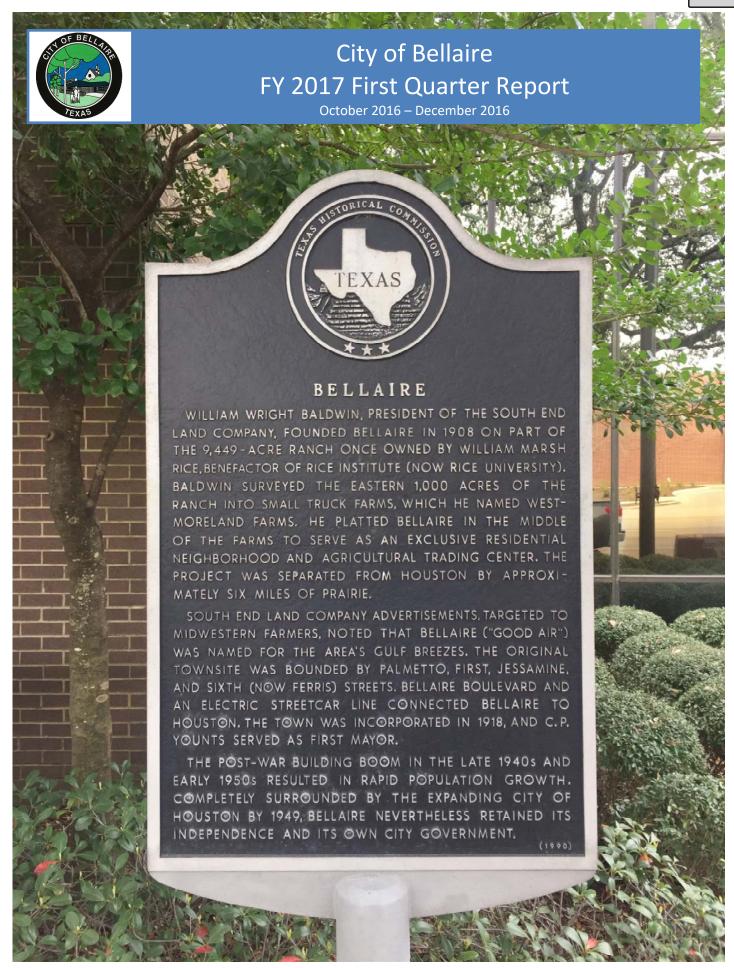


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Personnel Analysis

As this report is being written, new hires in January 2017 include a Police Officer, Permit Technician, and Director of Information Technology, while the Director of Public Works and a Permit Technician separated in January, all of which will be reflected in the FY 2017 second quarter report.

General Fund

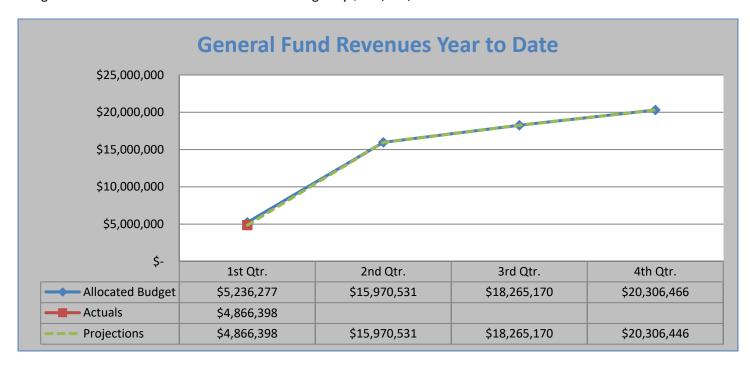
The General Fund is projected to end FY 2016 with a fund balance of \$4,901,070. The ending balance for FY 2016 is used for the beginning balance of FY 2017 and has been adjusted at this time as an unaudited increase of \$222,463 when compared to the adopted budget. This is a one-time source not yet appropriated. The recommended use is to off-set the projected deficit of the 60-day fund balance requirement in the General Fund five-year fiscal forecast.

The recommended use of any unanticipated increase to the fund balance is as follows:

- Offset the projected deficit of the sixty (60) day fund balance requirement in the five-year fiscal forecast
- Reduce the "catchup" needed for the vehicle and equipment replacement plan
- Increase the contribution to the General Fund transfer to the CIP

The allocated budget is a five-year average of the percentage of revenue collected as of the end of each month in the fiscal year by major categories. For the three months ended December 2016, the General Fund collected 24% of its total budgeted revenues and is under its allocated budget by \$369,794, or 7%.



Property Taxes

Property tax collections will peak in January before dropping off dramatically. This payment trend is driven by the January 31 due date for property taxes. The City has collected 26% of budgeted property taxes for the First Quarter or \$3,218,807.

Overall, the General Fund ultimately expects to collect approximately \$12.3 million in property taxes in FY 2017, an increase of \$1.0 million over FY 2016's \$11.3 million. The expected increase in property taxes is driven by a \$0.005 increase in the operations and maintenance portion of the property tax rate and an increase in taxable values.

Franchise Taxes

Franchise taxes for the three months ended December 2016 of \$397,311 are over the allocated budget by \$45,249, or 13%. Electric franchise tax payments are generally received monthly. Gas, telephone, and cable franchise tax payments are generally received quarterly.

Sales Tax

Sales tax revenue for three months ended December 2016 of \$515,146 is under the allocated budget by \$96,127, or 16%.

The City's current inter-local agreement with METRO, effective October 2014, requires Metro to pay the City one-half of all sales taxes collected by METRO within the Bellaire city limits. The City records these revenues in the METRO Fund. The City has experienced a similar decline in METRO sales tax receipts in the METRO fund.

Permits, Fees, and Licenses

Development permits, fees, and licenses of \$202,184 are under the allocated budget by \$97,336, or 33%. Permits are budgeted to be significantly higher in FY 2017 due to the planned construction of a new H-E-B grocery store. No permit revenue related to the new store was recorded in three months ended December 2016, and the timing of that permit revenue will likely not follow the historical trends reflected in the allocated budget so we may experience significant variances in actual permit revenue as compared to the allocated budget this year. Permitting for the H-E-B project occurred after the end of this reporting period and will be reflected in the report for the period ending January 2017.

PARD Charges & Fees

Parks and Recreation fees of \$99,840 are over the allocated budget by \$19,650, or 23%.

Parks and Recreation fees are weighted heavily toward the summer months when Camp Paseo is operating and the swimming pools are open daily.

Due to water leak at the Bellaire Family Aquatic Center, the pool was closed from December 15 through January 20 while repairs were made. Fortunately, this occurred during the low season and not during the peak attendance and revenue months of May through September.

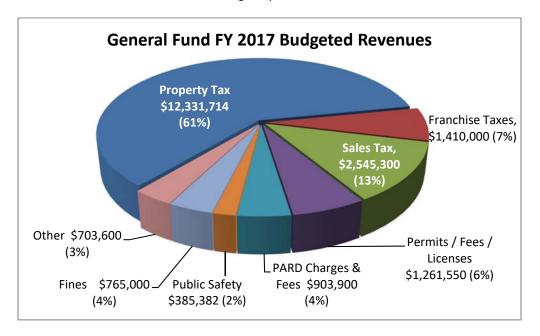
Public Safety

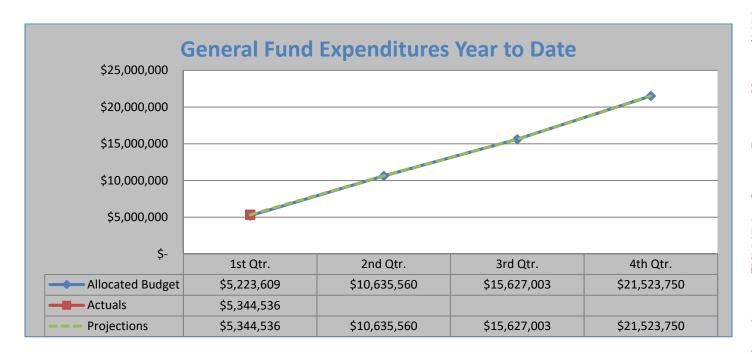
Public Safety revenues of \$101,204 are over the allocated budget by \$18,068, or 22%. Public Safety revenues for the three months ended December 2016 are \$7,326 higher than the same period in the prior year.

Ambulance revenue is 75% of the budgeted public safety revenues. The three months ended December 2016 included ambulance revenue of \$84,730. The average of the prior five years for the comparable period is \$77,810.

Fines

Fine revenues of \$158,488 are below the allocated budget by \$10,616, or 6%.





For the three months ended December 2016, the General Fund expended 25% of its total budgeted expenditures and is over its allocated budget by \$120,927, or 2%.

Salaries and benefits make up the largest category of expenditures in the General Fund at 66% of all FY 2017 budgeted expenditures, followed by purchased services at 19% of all budgeted expenditures.

Salary and Benefits

Salary and benefits of \$3,697,672 are over the allocated budget by \$253,490, or 7%, due to FY 2017 having seven (7) payrolls during the reporting period instead of the typical six (6) payrolls. As the City payrolls are bi-weekly, there occasionally is a month which has three (3) payrolls instead of two (2) and December 2016 had three (3) payrolls.

Purchased Services

Purchased services of \$915,357 are under the allocated budget by \$150,889, or 14%.

Some of the larger departmental level variances contributing to this category being below the allocated budget include:

- Human Resources NeoGov employment applicant tracking software license fees of approximately \$9,900 are typically paid in November; however, in FY 2017 these fees were not paid until January.
- Legal Legal fees were \$7,254 for the three months ended December 2016 as compared to an average of the prior five years of \$13,575 for the comparative period as a result of the timing of billings.
- Police Department Maintenance, which is primarily related to vehicles, was \$7,347 for the three months ended December 2016 as compared to an average of the prior five years of \$14,288 for the comparative period.
- Parks Pool maintenance was \$909 for the three months ended December 2016 as compared to an average of the prior five years of \$11,197 for the comparative period.

Supplies

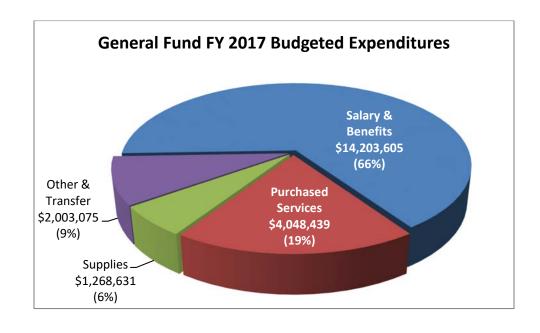
Supplies of \$211,635 are under the allocated budget by \$58,616, or 22%.

Some of the larger variances contributing to this category being below the allocated budget include:

- All Departments Fuel expenditures of \$25,209 for the three months ended December 2016 represents just a 7% increase over last year, which is not as large as the budgeted increase in fuel costs for FY 2017.
- Information Technology Hardware and Software supplies were \$6,901 for the three months ended December 2016 as compared to an average of the prior five years of \$16,424 for the comparative period. Technology expenditures for this line item have been under evaluation since the departure of the IT Director.

Other Expenditures and Transfers Out

The "other expenditures and transfers out" category is mainly the monthly transfers from the General Fund to (1) the Capital Improvement Fund and (2) the Vehicle and Equipment Replacement Fund. Other expenditures and transfers out in the three months ended December 2016 of \$514,250 are over the allocated budget by \$76,942, or 17%. Total budgeted transfers out of the General Fund are \$2,057,000, or \$171,417/month. The year-to-date expenditures are \$5,621 higher than the transfer amount because of banking fees.

Enterprise Fund

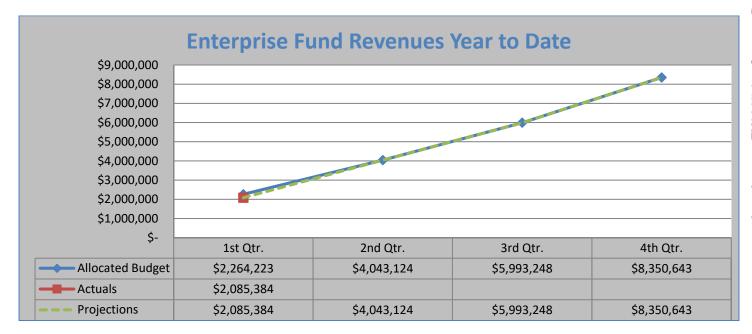
The Enterprise Fund is projected to end FY 2016 with a fund balance of \$1,576,203. The ending balance for FY 2016 is used for the beginning balance of FY 2017 has been adjusted at this time as an unaudited increase of \$131,875 when compared to the adopted budget as reflected in the chart below. This is a one-time source not yet appropriated. The recommended use is to off-set the projected deficit of the 60-day fund balance requirement in the Enterprise Fund five-year fiscal forecast.

The recommended use of any unanticipated increase to the fund balance is as follows:

- Offset the projected deficit of the sixty (60) day fund balance requirement in the five-year fiscal forecast
- Reduce the "catchup" needed for the vehicle and equipment replacement plan
- Increase the contribution to the Enterprise Fund transfer to the CIP

For the three months ended December 2016, the Enterprise Fund collected 25% of its total budgeted revenues and is under its allocated budget by \$178,839, or 8%. The largest variance contributing to the divergence from the allocated budget is water revenue, which is \$133,808 below the allocated budget., overall budget to actual if allocated over 12 months is right on target at 26%.



Water and Wastewater Revenue

Water revenues of \$1,072,762 are below the allocated budget by \$133,808, or 11%.

Sales of water makes up the largest category of revenues in the Enterprise Fund at 50% of all FY 2017 budgeted revenues, followed by charges for wastewater at 26% of budgeted revenues, and charges for solid waste at 23% of budgeted revenues.

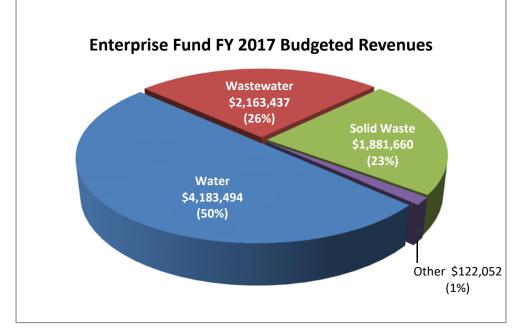
Changes in water revenues directly correlate to changes in water consumption; however, there was a rate increase implemented effective October 1st. The allocated budget uses the prior five years' monthly revenues to allocate the current year budget. In each of the prior five years, water rates remained constant; however, in the current year water rates were increased effective October 1st. The revenue actually collected in October relates to September usage and was billed under the old rate structure; therefore, only water revenues collected from November 2016 through December of 2017 will be at the new water rates. While still under the allocated budget for the three months ended December 2016, water revenues are trending closer to allocated budget each month. Water consumption is also up over this same period last year.

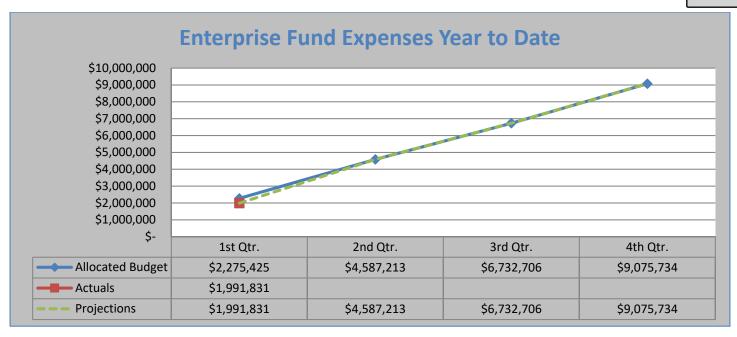
Wastewater revenues of \$568,006 are over the allocated budget by \$19,232, or 4%.

Solid Waste

Solid Waste revenues of \$421,958 are below the allocated budget by \$48,417, or 10%. During the budget process the recycling revenue was doubled up. This will require minor adjustments on the expenditure side as we go through the

year.





For the three months ended December 2016, the Enterprise Fund incurred 22% of its total budgeted expenses and is under its allocated budget by \$283,594, or 13%. The variance from allocated budget is due mainly to "Supplies".

Salary and Benefits

Salary and benefits of \$449,061 are under the allocated budget by \$22,667, or 5%.

Purchased Services

Purchased services of \$316,197 are under the allocated budget by \$20,589, or 6%.

Supplies

Supplies (which includes water purchased from the City of Houston) makes up the largest category of expenses in the Enterprise Fund at 31.2% of all FY 2017 budgeted expenses, followed by "other and transfers" at 30.4% of all Enterprise Fund budgeted expenses. Other and transfers includes \$11,000 of budgeted operational expenses and \$2,746,000 of transfers out, including (1) \$624,000 to the General Fund to reimburse overhead expenses, (2) \$950,000 to the Debt Service Fund, (3) \$522,000 to the Vehicle and Equipment Replacement Fund, and (4) \$650,000 to the Capital Improvement Fund.

Supplies of \$537,225 are under the allocated budget by \$236,208, or 31%.

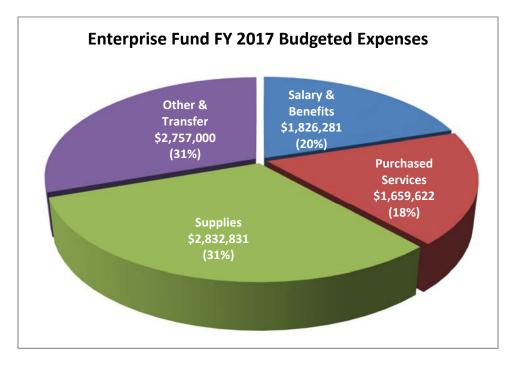
The City budgeted a significant increase in fuel costs for FY 2017 as compared to FY 2016 actual fuel expense; however, fuel expense of \$16,258 for the three months ended December 2016 represents a 2% decrease compared to last year.

The supplies category includes ground water credits. Ground water credits are usually purchased once a year, but the purchase date varies from year to year. Twice in the five-year history included in the allocated budget there was a ground water credit purchase in the first three months of the fiscal year. In each of November 2013 and December 2015, the City purchased \$170,770 of ground water credits, which increases the allocated budget for the period; however, there were no ground water credit purchases in the first three months of the FY 2017 fiscal year, but ground water credits are expected to be purchased in February 2017.

The budget for garbage bags increased by \$15,000, from \$85,000 to \$100,000; however, there were no garbage bag purchases in the three months ended December 2016. The City plans to bid out and potentially purchase garbage bags in the second quarter of FY 2017.

Other Expenses and Transfers Out

The "other expenses and transfers out" category is mainly the monthly transfers from the Enterprise Fund to (1) the General Fund, (2) the Debt Service Fund, (3) The Vehicle and Equipment Replacement Fund, and (4) the Capital Improvement Fund. Other expenses and transfers out in the three months ended December 2016 of \$689,348 are under the allocated budget by \$4,130, or 1%. Total budgeted transfers out of the Enterprise Fund are \$2,746,000, or \$228,833/month. The year-to-date expenses are \$2,849 higher than the transfer amount because of banking fees, which are budgeted at \$11,000, and are relatively immaterial to the category total.

FY 2017 Management Projects

MP 1701 – Public Works Site Planning:

The City contracted with Pierce Goodwin and Alexander (PGAL) to review and develop a proposed site plan for the City of Bellaire's Public Works Complex. The site plan will incorporate all of the City's property in the area, and will be a guiding document for future decision making regarding a new Public Works Building. Work on this project will begin in late summer.

MP 1702 - GIS, Work Order/Online Permits:

This project was initiated in FY 2016 and has many phases. Phase one of project has been completed by geographically locating all above-ground public works infrastructure assets. The City started a program for the block inspections which led to changes orders for the Pavement Maintenance Program to address the results of the inspections. This will be presented to Council in the second quarter of FY 2017.

In FY 2016 the City purchased the software and hardware for Geographic Information System (GIS). The City's internal technology team still has a lot of work to do for full implementation. Full implementation will not occur until FY 2018. The team is working through a needs analysis on the appropriate software to manage the asset management system that will provide access and capability to expand the program to all City departments. The team will be preparing justification and information to present to the City Manager for possible incorporation into the FY 2018 Budget.

MP 1703 – Mosquito Control:

The City completed dropping larvacide tablets in storm drains in September 2016 but continued spraying to control mosquitos through October 2016. Both programs will resume in late spring and end around October 2017. The City has the ability to start the program sooner or extend the program longer if necessary.

MP 1704 – Landscape Enhancements:

Improve the aesthetic look of public rights of way by adding additional seasonal color plantings to specific areas identified throughout the city working within the guidelines set forth by the Beautification Master Plan and other landscaping beautification projects once adopted. The City is currently working with its landscape contractor Hou-Scape to develop landscape options for enhancing landscape beautification efforts. With the unfortunate elimination of the rock entry sign at the railroad track on Bellaire Blvd., we our looking at options to shift funds to this location to enhance that specific median.

MP 1705 - Career Website:

The intent is to brand Bellaire as a Premier Employer and establish a comprehensive approach to online recruitment. The Premier Employer Team met and selected Recruiting.com to lead the City of Bellaire through the development of a career site. A kickoff meeting was held to discuss the project components as well as help the developers better understand our employee value proposition, biggest recruiting challenges, organizational culture, and more, including content. Following the kickoff meeting, the Team was required to gather assets critical to building the new career site to provide to Recruiting.com. These assets include brand guidelines, existing photos, benefits guide, testimonials from employees in each department and other department insights. The next steps will be a pre-shoot video and photo conference call and a mock presentation of the career site design and content based on all of the information and assets provided. Following that, the team will provide feedback/edits on the mock site, the video and photo shoot will be scheduled and take place, a demo site presentation will be held, the subdomain will be setup, the team will provide final feedback, and schedule the launch.

FY 2017 Capital Improvement Projects

Rebuild Bellaire Phase 5A:

Total Contracting Limited was awarded the construction contract. The final release of retainage and project close out is scheduled for the March 6, 2017 City Council meeting.

Rebuild Bellaire Phase 5B:

Reytec Construction Resources was awarded the construction contract. The 4400 block of Nancy, 4400 block of Glenmont, 1000 - 1200 block of Howard Lane, and 5300 block of Valerie are open to traffic. Alder from Valerie to Braeburn is currently under construction and is scheduled for completion mid-February. Ferris from Linden to Jessamine is under construction and the estimated completion for these blocks is the end of February. The entire Alder segment from Maple to Evergreen and the entire Ferris segment from Jessamine to Bissonnet is scheduled for completion by the end of July 2017.

Streets and Drainage Project (Bonds for Better Bellaire):

A list of project locations is scheduled to be taken to City Council for review February 20, 2017. Prioritization will be given for adequacy of the existing area drainage system, pavement condition, lots served by street reconstruction, drainage improvements, traffic, and open ditch systems. Staff is currently reviewing the Statements of Qualifications for Design Engineering, Construction Management, Construction Administration and Third Party Plan Review for this project. The recommendations will be taken to City Council March 20, 2017 for approval.

Sidewalk Project (Bonds for Better Bellaire):

A list of sidewalk locations is scheduled to be taken to City Council for discussion February 20, 2017. Prioritization will be given for closing gaps in the sidewalk system, connecting activity nodes, and completing the sidewalk network. A team of staff is currently reviewing the Statements of Qualifications for Design Engineering, Construction Management, Construction Administration and Third Party Plan Review for this project. The recommendations will be taken to City Council March 20, 2017 for approval.

FY 2015 Pavement Management (Construction):

The original scope of the project is complete. Work for the change order began early January and is scheduled for completion May 2017. It includes 20 identified drainage maintenance locations city-wide for areas such as Mimosa, Laurel, and Larch Lane.

FY 2016 Pavement Management Program:

The original scope of the project is complete. A change order will be taken to City Council in the upcoming months to address additional maintenance items identified from the Block Inspection Program, including street and sidewalk point repairs and curb and gutter repairs.

FY 2017 Pavement Management Program:

The design contract was approved at City Council January 24, 2017 to ARKK Engineering. Design for the street and sidewalk maintenance should be completed by March and bid in May. The following streets will be repaired with this contract: 5200-5300 Grand Lake, 4500 Holt, 5100 Linden, and 4900-5000 Maple. The following sidewalks will be repaired with this contract: 100 Beverly, 4500 Birch, 4600 Birch, and 4500 Braeburn. If funding is available, these streets were included as add alternates: 4700-4800 Evergreen and 100 Pembrook.

City-Wide Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) Systems Upgrade Project Phase 2 & 3:

Phase I included a needs analysis and was completed in March of 2015 which led to the development of Phase II in the FY 2016 budget and Phase III in the FY 2017 budget. City Council approved a contract with JACH Controls & Automation, LLC (JACH) to perform Phase II work in March of 2016, which included new computers and software development to be installed at the Wastewater Treatment Plant to serve as master hub for City-Wide SCADA. This work is complete. The purchase of cellular modems to convert to wireless communication complete. Feld Park, Central, and Renwick are tied into new SCADA system but are currently on standby pending start-up. JACH is currently working on installing SCADA to the City's three lift stations. City is awaiting quotes for electrical panel repairs at the Bellaire Lift Station. Phase II is expected to be online and complete by March 1, 2017. Our operations consultant, H2OMC.LLC, is working with JACH controls to implement Phase III items such as on and offsite remote access in order to get the City fully operational with Phase III project scope will be reevaluated by the City Engineer.

Rehabilitation of the Renwick Ground Storage Tank:

This project was awarded to the lowest bidder, Central Tank Coatings, at the January 24, 2017 City Council meeting. The bid came in approximately \$100,000 less than the budgeted amount. The contractor plans to mobilize in mid-February with a two-month construction timeline.

Water and Wastewater System Upgrades:

This expenditure is a budget item for large ticket maintenance items such as pump or motor repair or replacements, and other costly maintenance items. They are not regularly scheduled and can be emergency expenditures. To date this project has been utilized to repair Lift Pump #2 at the Rice Lift Station, rebuild Blower #2 at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, purchase and install a new 100hp motor at the Treatment Plant, and for "de-ragging" service calls at the Treatment Plant.

Water Line Improvements (Bonds for Better Bellaire):

A list of waterline locations is scheduled to be taken to City Council for review February 20, 2017. The most critical waterlines will be constructed with this funding. Staff is currently reviewing the Statements of Qualifications. The recommendations will be taken to City Council March 20, 2017 for approval.

Wastewater Line Improvements (Bonds for Better Bellaire):

A list of wastewater locations is scheduled to be taken to City Council for review February 20, 2017. The most critical waterlines will be constructed with this funding. Staff is currently reviewing the Statements of Qualifications. The recommendations will be taken to City Council March 20, 2017 for approval.

Water Meter Installation and Improvements to Wastewater Treatment Plant (Bonds for Better Bellaire):

Siemens was provided the Notice to Proceed January 25, 2017. The design will be completed in March. The project will be split in two phases. During phase one, all meters will be updated to automatic meter reading capabilities. Installation of these meters is scheduled to begin in late March and completed by October of 2017. Phase two of this project is the improvements to the Wastewater Treatment Plant (including improvements to the aeration system, digesters, main lift station, disinfection system, return activated sludge pumps, and flow control.) Jones and Carter is finalizing the design of the project for submittal to the TCEQ and ARKK Engineers for approval. Upgrades to the plant are scheduled to begin in May and are anticipated to be completed by April 2018. The internal team for this project is working through messaging opportunities for the public as well as holding meetings to prepare for the implementation of the project.

Evelyn's Park Phase I:

Construction is nearing completion at the park and event center. Landscaping is nearly complete, and the contractor is finishing up installation of water fountains, the slide, paver walkways, and other site amenities. Windows, doors, and solar panels have been completed in the buildings. The exterior finishes of the buildings are nearly complete, including painting. Currently the interior floor finishes, wall finishes, and kitchen equipment installation is occurring. Substantial completion of the project will occur in February 2017. The close out for this project is scheduled for April 17, 2017. The

City and the Conservancy continue to evaluate change orders as needed. The Grand Opening for the park is scheduled for April 22, 2017.

Nature Discovery Center Improvements:

Underground utilities have been completed, and plant material has arrived on site and is being installed. Site paving sealant will be applied soon, and the restroom and storage structures are mostly complete. New fencing is being installed in the project area. Completion is expected in Spring 2017, and the "reveal" is planned for May 6, 2017.

Community Pathways Master Plan:

A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) is in development to solicit consultants to perform this work. The RFQ is expected to go out the second quarter of FY 2017. The ROW study will need to be complete before this work can begin since the study will provide much of the data that will be used during the Master Plan. The ROW analysis maps and evaluates City of Bellaire properties and easements, and some of them may be good candidates for sidewalk connections. The project will be completed in the late summer and will then inform the Sidewalks Project, as well as identify potential new projects that could be incorporated into the future CIP.

Park Signage Master Plan:

This project will begin later in the year. This project will be informed by aesthetic considerations and direction provided as part of the Beautification Project and the review of the Terrain Studios planning efforts.

Decorative Standards for Major Streets:

Last year, a family of products (light poles, etc.) was presented to the various boards and commissions, and the majority of input suggested the desire for a certain style of fixtures. However, when Terrain Studios presented their Beautification Study, the style recommended was not similar in any way to the previously recommended family of products. Additional guidance regarding style and aesthetics will be requested from Council in spring 2017.

Playground and Shade Structures:

In November, the Parks Board voted to spend \$30,000 to purchase new trash and recycling can enclosures. They also recommended spending up to \$70,000 on shade structures and swing sets at Loftin, LaFayette, and Mulberry Park, which Council approved (\$54,314.68) on January 9, 2017. Trash and recycle containers were installed the last week of January 2017. Swing sets have been installed at Mulberry and LaFayette Parks and shade covers have been ordered and should be installed by the end of March.

Bellaire Family Aquatic Center Pool Area Improvements:

The planning for this project is currently underway. The goal is to have plans complete and ready to implement after the summer peak season ends. Planned improvements include additional shade structures, improved drainage around the slide and added decking to better serve pool patrons. The contract for this project will be presented to Council in the late summer.

Bellaire Town Square Municipal Facilities Design & Library Conceptual:

Plans are under review for code compliance, finish materials are being considered, and landscaping plans are under development. The Transition Management Plan was presented to Council on December 20, 2016. In the coming weeks, we will begin coordination with utility companies for necessary relocations. The project will be bid this coming quarter and a Guaranteed Maximum Price contract is to be presented to Council on April 17, 2017.

ROW Analysis, Integration, & Planning Project:

Project data collection was completed in December 2016. Our consultant is reviewing and analyzing data with projected completion of report by early 2017. Presentation to Council is scheduled for April 22, 2017. This study will provide an inventory of ROW as well as necessary maps in identified areas, which will assist with policy discussions related to ROW management policy, property valuation, and planning of park, trail, and pedestrian facilities. The results of this study will be incorporated into the Community Pathways Master Plan mentioned above.

Flood Plain Hazard Mitigation Plan:

The existing Flood Hazard Mitigation Plan will be revised to update the flood risks and identify mitigation efforts. This plan will identify possible future projects in an effort to reduce flood risks. The update is expected to begin in April 2017. Citizen participation in creation and review of the final plan will occur after the first draft is complete.

SUBJECT: Bonds for Better Bellaire 2016 Project Selection

The February 20 City Council meeting will include a presentation on the recommended locations for many of the projects funded in the Bonds for Better Bellaire 2016 (BBB16) bond program. We will also provide a master project schedule for the next three years. In general, the schedule can be described as follows:

For water/wastewater line replacement, and street/drainage/sidewalk construction, design will commence and be completed during the current fiscal year (FY 2017). Phase 1 construction will commence in early FY 2018. Phase II construction will commence in FY 2019, and Phase III construction in FY 2020.

The projects are organized into four separation Project Groups, described below:

Group A – Water and Wastewater

Proposition 3 provides \$11.58 million for critical water and sewer line replacement over the next three years, \$11 million is to be used on water line replacement. The project selection criteria were first described in the water/wastewater system assessment completed by ARKK Engineers in 2015. Attached is a list of the proposed locations of water line projects, broken down by phase. Also attached is a map of those locations. According to our schedule, water line design will begin late March, and construction will begin on the Phase 1 projects in October 2017.

Group B – Remaining Rebuild Bellaire Streets

Group C – Street and Drainage BBB16

We are allocating \$20 million from Proposition 1 proceeds for street and drainage improvements. As has been the city's practice, our reconstruction projects will accommodate both street and drainage improvements. The drainage ranking criteria developed with the City Engineer is described in the attached "storm drainage priority rating system", the application of which is informed by the drainage study presented by the City Engineer last September.

The street system ranking is the result of a recently completed and comprehensive pavement condition analysis. The data collected from this analysis supplements the pavement condition analysis performed by the City Engineer in 2013.

The attached street ranking list combines the drainage ranking with the street ranking, of which the drainage ranking receiving a higher weight (60% drainage, 40% street).

Our ranking approach places a good deal of emphasis on "project readiness". Several locations were identified, and designed, as part of the Rebuild Bellaire Program. These are worthy projects, the City has already invested in the design of these projects, and there is some amount of expectation from residents that these streets will be improved.

As a result, the recommended Group B projects would include 4700 Willow, 4900 – 5000 block of Mayfair, 4700 Linden, and 4900 – 5000 Imperial. The water line in Imperial is identified as a Phase I need, which will be included in the project, and paid for from Proposition 3 bond proceeds. Sidewalks would be constructed on one side of each of these streets, except for Linden, which does and would have sidewalks on both sides. The current construction cost estimate for these Group B locations is approximately \$4.5 million.

While design is complete, work needs to be done to create construction documents. The projects would be ready for construction by the time we receive funding from the August 2017 bond sale, that is, October of 2017.

Design can also begin this Spring on Group C projects. As currently identified, those locations would be:

Project Group C Phase II
500 Bolivar
4500 Maple
4600 Cedar
5100 Spruce
6700 N. 5 th
5200 Spruce

Construction on these projects could begin as early as Spring 2018. The construction costs of these projects may exceed what is currently planned for the bond sale scheduled for August 2017. The design process will provide more precise estimates than what we currently have. As a result, we may recommend adjusting the bond sale amount.

Group D - New Sidewalk Construction

We are allocating \$4 million from Proposition 1 proceeds for new sidewalk construction. That doesn't represent the sum total of our new sidewalk work, as sidewalks will be included in the Group B and C projects described above. The interim criteria for additional sidewalk construction were discussed with the City Council last August. The first priority is to complete the network, so that blocks with minimal gaps in their sidewalks would be rated higher. The projects identified on the attached list and map reflect that priority, and thought was also given to prioritizing those block segments that tie into existing developed pedestrian facilities.

We're only identifying Phase 1 locations at this point, and looking forward to completing the Community Pathways study to help identify future locations. The construction cost of the Phase 1 locations is estimated to be approximately \$1 million.

Design is scheduled to begin in late March. Construction would begin in October.

I am recommending that we begin to implement a 5-foot sidewalk design standard on sidewalks built in project groups B, C, and D. This decision has implications for the standard we impose on private development, and should be the subject of future discussion and Council decision – making.

Next Steps

We look forward to receiving Council's questions and feedback regarding these proposed projects and schedules.

At the March 6 Town Hall meeting, the City Engineer will present the project recommendations and the analysis that went into our recommendations.

Should we stay on schedule, we will ask Council to authorize design and construction management for the projects identified.

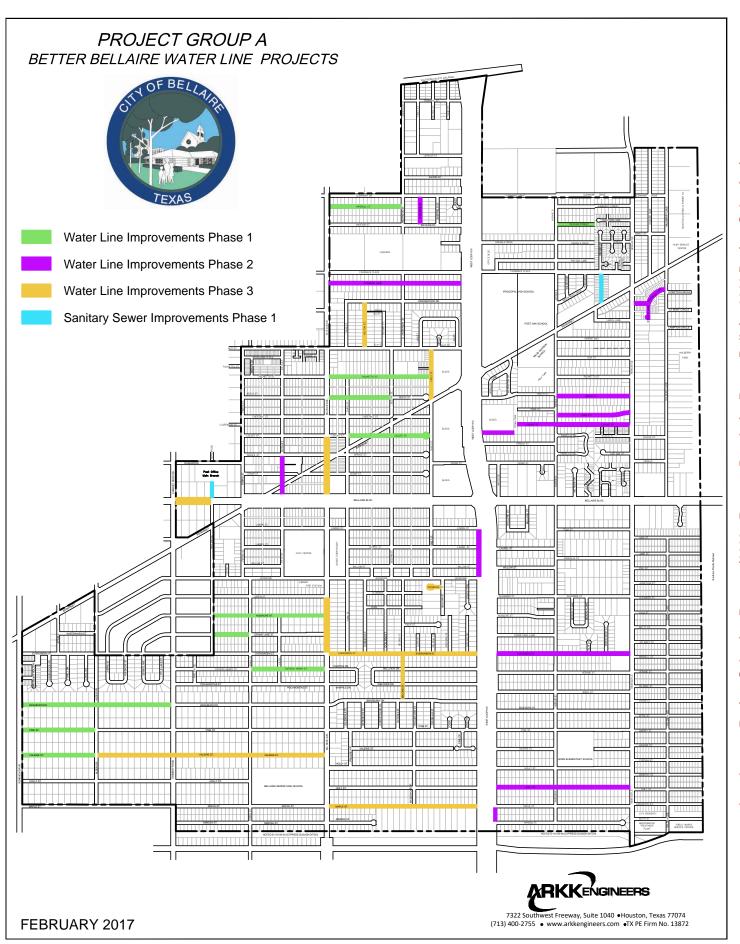

D. Inspirational Reading and/or Invocation - David R. Montague, Council Member.

David R. Montague, Council Member, provided the inspirational reading for the evening.

E. Pledges of Allegiance - David R. Montague, Council Member.

Council Member Montague led the members of City Council and the audience in the U.S. Pledge of Allegiance and the Pledge to the Texas Flag.

F. Recognition of Proclamation - Andrew S. Friedberg, Mayor.

Issuance of a proclamation by Mayor Andrew S. Friedberg proclaiming January 9, 2017, as "Jared, Justin and Lexi Clark Day" in the City of Bellaire, Texas, in recognition of their notable achievements and in support of their cause to help find a cure for Giant Axonal Neuropathy (GAN).

Mayor Friedberg announced that he had a very special proclamation presentation this evening. He noted that many neighbors throughout the City of Bellaire were aware of the Clark family and their tireless mission through their nonprofit, Justin's TRIumph Over GAN, to help find a cure for Giant Axonal Neuropathy (GAN), a rare, fatal genetic disorder with only 72 patients currently diagnosed worldwide, of whom two are Justin and Lexi Clark.

Mayor Friedberg advised that he had recently read an article about the Clark family and was so moved that he had invited them to the City Council meeting this evening in order to present a proclamation to them proclaiming **January 9, 2017, as "Jared, Justin and Lexi Clark Day" in the City of Bellaire** in recognition of their notable achievements and in support of their most worthy cause.

At the conclusion of his reading, Mayor Friedberg presented the proclamation to the Clark family.

I. PUBLIC HEARING (PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE R-MF ZONING DISTRICT)

[NOTE: THE OFFICIAL NOTICE OF THE PUBLIC HEARING SPECIFIES A START TIME NO EARLIER THAN 6:00 P.M.]

A. Reading of the Notice of Public Hearing - Tracy L. Dutton, City Clerk.

Tracy L. Dutton, City Clerk, read the "Notice of Public Hearing" into the record. City Clerk Dutton advised that the notice was published on the City's official bulletin board and website on January 12, 2017, and in the legal notices section of the Southwest News on January 13, 2017. Notices were also mailed to property owners of record and residents within 500 feet of the Residential Multi-Family Zoning District.

Before continuing to the next agenda item, **Mayor Friedberg** announced that the City Clerk had published and mailed the notices a week early so as to avoid the notice getting caught in the holiday commotions.

B. Summary of Public Hearing Procedure - Paul A. Hofmann, City Manager.

Paul A. Hofmann, City Manager, summarized the public hearing procedure for the evening.

C. Presentation:

Public Hearing on proposed amendments to the Code of Ordinances, Chapter 24, Planning and Zoning, Sec. 24-535, R-MF Residential-Multifamily District, and related sections, including Sec. 24-513 Landscaping, Screening and Buffering; and Sec. 24-513a, Design Standards in Commercial and Mixed-Use Districts; to ensure that future redevelopments are compatible with existing commercial regulations, and to establish improved buffering of existing adjacent single-family residential districts - Submitted by John McDonald, Director of Development Services.

John McDonald, Director of Development Services, presented a recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Bellaire, Texas, to members of City Council regarding proposed amendments to three sections within Chapter 24, Planning and Zoning, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Bellaire, Texas, related to development in the Residential Multi-Family (R-MF) Zoning District.

Director McDonald advised that two goals were predominantly addressed in the recommendation to enhance the design standards for any future development in the residential multi-family zoning district to an equal level of compatibility with neighboring commercial development in the Corridor Mixed-Use (CMU) Zoning District (CMU) along Bissonnet Street, as well as to establish rules better protecting the existing single-family residences adjacent to the R-MF Zoning District.

Director McDonald advised further that there was only one area of Bellaire that was zoned R-MF. That area was noted to be the Pont Alba Apartments located at the corner of Mulberry Lane and Bissonnet Street (on the northeast side of town). He stated that there was no specific plan to redevelop the site. Director McDonald also stated that the same regulations that currently affected the CMU Zoning District were proposed to be added to the RM-F Zoning District.

D. Public Comment.

Mayor Friedberg recognized speakers who had completed a sign-up sheet prior to the commencement of the public hearing. It was noted that each speaker had a time limit of five (5) minutes, with notice after four (4) minutes that one (1) minute was left.

Richard Franke:

Mr. Franke addressed City Council and indicated that his concern was related to parking associated with a new development, such as a five-story apartment complex, in the R-MF Zoning District. He urged City Council to ensure that there would be no risk of overflow parking and no adverse impact from such a development on the adjoining neighborhoods.

Cody Moore:

Mr. Moore advised that many of his concerns had been alleviated or tabled until the required public hearing for a specific project. He indicated that he lived on the street

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that immediately backed up to the Pont Alba Apartments and stated that the apartment complex was a quiet, well-kept community.

Mr. Moore referred to a potential flooding problem on his street and advised that each time there was a serious storm, water reached the front of residents' porches. One resident had gotten water in his home. Mr. Moore encouraged City Council to make sure there was a thorough expectation of what the drainage would look like around a new development, if and when it happened.

Mike Manning:

From the audience, Mr. Manning referenced drainage issues as a concern and noted that the concern had been adequately addressed by a prior speaker.

Lynn McBee:

Ms. McBee advised that she had attended many of the Bellaire Planning and Zoning Commission ("Commission") meetings, noting that the Commission had paid a great deal of attention to ensure that the regulations were protective. She indicated that she did not have any real problem with most of the changes and congratulated the Commission and Director McDonald for recommending under-building parking, which greatly reduced on-street parking.

Ms. McBee referenced the need for senior living and housing for single residents starting out on their own, noting her encouragement for those types of developments.

In closing, Ms. McBee stated that she felt that the recommended setbacks were too minimal to be accommodated by a reduced impact from the height plane. She felt the setbacks ought to provide green space and should be increased from ten feet to fifteen feet in the front. She also encouraged a reduction in lot coverage and regulations for storm water detention.

Leon Caruthers:

Mr. Caruthers addressed City Council and expressed concerns regarding traffic and drainage. He indicated that if a multi-unit structure were to be developed in the R-MF Zoning District, there would likely be one to two cars associated with each unit. Additionally, an increase in lot coverage could cause additional drainage problems.

Beth Soletsky:

Ms. Soletsky thanked City Council for her new street, noting that she no longer had standing water in front of her home for the first time in ten years. She expressed concern with possible drainage issues resulting from the proposed 75% lot coverage recommendation for new developments in the R-MF Zoning District. She also indicated that she did not understand why a multi-family property could cover more of a lot than a single-family property.

Mayor Friedberg, after hearing no further requests to provide public comment to City Council, moved to the next item on the agenda.

E. Questions from the Mayor and City Council.

Mayor Friedberg opened the floor for questions from the City Council. Following questions of Director McDonald regarding proposed amendments to the R-MF Zoning

District, Mayor Friedberg expressed his appreciation to the speakers that attended the public hearing.

F. Close of Public Hearing.

Mayor Friedberg announced the conclusion of the public hearing before City Council at 6:57 p.m. on Monday, January 9, 2017. He indicated that oral comments would no longer be received. Written comments could be submitted to the City Council in care of the City Clerk until final deliberation on the matter. It was anticipated that final deliberation would occur on Monday, January 23, 2017, and that written comments should be submitted by noon on Thursday, January 19, 2017, in order to be included in the record.

G. Adjourn.

Mayor Friedberg announced that the public hearing before City Council was adjourned at 6:58 p.m. on Monday, January 9, 2017.

C. Personal/Audience Comments.

James A. Rowe:

Mr. Rowe addressed City Council as follow up on a City Council meeting he attended before the new year. He indicated that he had three questions that he was seeking answers to as follows:

1. What were the findings regarding the certificate of occupancy and building procedure?

- 2. Who was responsible for writing protocol when a builder held a certificate of occupancy from a homeowner?
- 3. Why could a new home be sold without a certificate of occupancy?

Mr. Rowe advised that he felt there should be some accountability and a protocol for the protection of homeowners. He urged City Council to consider developing a protocol if one did not already exist.

Mayor Friedberg advised that the current order of business did not contemplate a back and forth dialogue and suggested that staff might be able to address or comment on the questions Mr. Rowe had raised during the City Manager's Report.

Written Comment:

Mayor Friedberg indicated that City Council had received one written comment from **Dean Hunt**. The Mayor advised that Mr. Hunt's comments related to the agenda item regarding a proposed curfew for Evelyn's Park. Consideration of and possible action on the adoption of an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, authorizing a change order to the FY 2016 Pavement Management Project Contract with Main Lane Industries for an amount not to exceed \$275,000.00 for the purpose of addressing additional street and sidewalk point repairs and curb and gutter repairs identified in the block inspection program - Submitted by Paul A. Hofmann, City Manager.

Background/Summary:

The City of Bellaire has made a strong commitment to improving and maintaining the City's roadways and sidewalks. The continuous funding of the Pavement Management Program is evidence of this commitment.

The original FY 2016 Pavement Management Project Contract was awarded to Main Lane Industries for \$1,175,150 and included the removal and replacement of sections of distressed street and sidewalk pavement, curbs, and gutters. The only work left on the original scope is to install speed bumps on Valerie. There is approximately \$150,000.00 in contract capacity remaining. This capacity exists because the actual amount of point repairs estimated and bid is less than what was actually required.

The Public Works Department and the City Engineer have identified numerous areas still in need of maintenance. The City conducted a city-wide Block Inspection Program last year and identified many items in need of repair or replacement. This change order will be repair various sections of streets, sidewalks and curbs and gutters city-wide.

The Public Works Department proposes increasing the total contract amount by \$275,000.00. The \$275,000.00 in additional contract authority, plus the \$150,000.00 in the original scope provides for additional work to be completed in the amount of \$425,000.

A separate contract with the City Engineer will be executed to assist with prioritizing the identified repairs along with any design and field assistance needed. This extra engineering work should not exceed \$41,520.00, and is covered by prior project savings.

INTRODUCTION

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2016 budget totaled \$2,030,618 for the Pavement Management Program. These funds were allocated \$1,200,000 from METRO Revenue, \$800,000 from the General Fund for Pavement Management, and \$30,618 from carry over Capital Improvement Program funds from the previous year. This program consists of various maintenance projects to improve the overall quality of the roadway systems through repair of pavement failures and distresses. The goal is to bring the streets maintained by the City up to an acceptable level of service.

The planned expenditures and the actual bid amounts for each project in the FY 2016 Pavement Management Program are detailed in this table. The item indicated by an asterisk (*) is what is recommended for approval in this City Council agenda item.

UPDATE ON THE BLOCK INSPECTION PROGRAM

The Public Works Department Staff made the first run through with the Block Inspection Program last year. Assets within the right of way were collected in the field and spatially with GIS systems and reported in a list if they need to be maintained. Example items that need to be addressed include sections of pavement, curbs and gutters, sidewalks, curb ramps, driveway approaches, traffic signs and signals, manhole covers, water meter boxes and valves, and fire hydrants, among others.

An aggressive approach has been taken to address these items by Public Works Staff, Contractors or through existing programs such as the Pavement Management Program, future Capital Improvement Projects or with Maintenance funding.

This first table details items that are currently being addressed by the active FY 2015 and FY 2016 Pavement Management Projects (PMP) and the estimated completion date of them. You will notice the last three columns in this table are planned for this agenda item, the FY 2016 PMP Streets and Sidewalks Change Order #1.
