### **Item Title:**

Discussion and presentation regarding the FY 2018 proposed budget for the City of Bellaire, Texas, with a focus on compensation and benefits - Submitted by Paul A. Hofmann, City Manager.

### **Background/Summary:**

The FY 2018 proposed Budget was presented and submitted to City Council on July 17, 2017 with compensation and benefit parameters that allowed for a 5% increase across the board. The City's Five Year Fiscal Forecast incorporates this 5% each year to account for health insurance increases as well as implementation of the City's pay plan. In the preparation of the FY 2018 budget process these parameters are kept to maintain a structurally balanced budget. The compensation and benefits approach presented to the City Council is a result of maintaining these parameters. Our approach to budgeting compensation and benefits is to maintain the integrity of our pay plan and our benefits in order to stay competitive with the market for full cycle recruitment and to implement what is affordable to the City long term.

### 2018 Health Insurance Projections

Higginbotham, our benefits consultants, will provide a brief overview of the status of our 2017 health insurance plan including 2018 renewal projections based on year to date data, as well as strategies for cost containment.

### Compensation and Benefits Study Report

The City adopted a step and grade pay plan philosophy in 2001. Currently, two structures exist: a general employee structure with a 46% range spread with eleven steps and a Public Safety structure with a 36% range spread with nine steps. Both systems progress horizontally with 3.5% between each step.

In 2008, a complete comprehensive review of classifications and job descriptions was performed and a new pay structure was implemented in January 2009. The review met internal equity requirements and separated out the public safety structure from the general employee structure. At that time the general employee structure had a 41% range spread with ten steps and the Public Safety structure had a 36% range spread with nine steps. The general structure range spread was updated to 46% in 2014 based on market data.

In 2009, the economy took a downturn and our region felt those impacts through the end of 2013. Over the past eight years the City's structures have had the following adjustments:

In 2014, the City engaged Arthur J. Gallagher & Company to conduct a study similar to what is being presented today. Prior to the engagement of Arthur J. Gallagher & Company, the City knew there were challenges recruiting and retaining certain positions.

Much like in 2014, at the inception of the study, we were confident that our benefits package was and is competitive. However, we knew some positions were behind in the market. Today we are presenting a review of our Pay Plan and Benefits structure and an implementation plan that will allow us to stay competitive with our market, and, in some instances, catch up.

Implementing the recommendations presented in the FY 2018 budget will allow us to continue to provide a place of work that will allow us to attract and retain excellent employees while providing them with competitive pay and benefits, great working conditions, a focus on a team orientated culture, meaningful work, and a fair and responsive management team.

### THE STUDY

The study was performed by Arthur J. Gallagher & Company and was a collaboration with the City of West University Place, City of Bellaire, City of Sugar Land, City of Dickinson, and City of Webster. The City paid \$22,000 for this study. The study is based on salaries, benefits, and other data in effect as of February 1, 2017, for all participants. The following is a summary of the study.

### **Objectives**

The objectives set out in the study, which are the same objectives behind the City Pay Plan from inception, are as follows:

- Develop a compensation program that is internally equitable and externally competitive;
- Update the salary structure utilizing market data results;
- · A total compensation approach, including benefits;
- Market parity was assessed at the market actual average base at the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile for non-sworn positions and at the actual average minimum at the 75<sup>th</sup> percentile for sworn positions.

### **Survey Methodology**

- Criteria utilized to determine comparator organizations is as follows:
  - Employer size & complexity
  - Geographic proximity
  - Nature of services provided
  - Exceptions may exist to achieve recruitment objectives

### **Summary of Salary Data Comparisons**

### **KEY MEASURES:**

- From an aggregate perspective, current midpoints of all positions combined are highly competitive (0.1% difference between City midpoints and market actual pay);
- Sworn Fire range minimums lag the market by 10.9% which is slightly misaligned with the market;
- Sworn Police range minimums lag the market by 6.1%, which is competitive;
- Individual comparisons vary;
- Longevity, performance and hiring conditions may explain some differences in actual salary;
- Regression analysis was utilized to blend market data with internal equity.

### **Salary Data Recommendations for Ranges**

- Current range spreads for all positions, excluding public safety, at the City are 46%. The average market spread from range minimum to range maximum is 51%; however, the City's range spread is considered competitive and no changes are recommended.
- Sworn structures maintained their 36% spread and difference between steps of 3.5%

### **Salary Data Recommendations for Market Alignment**

Six options were recommended with different costs associated with them. Several scenarios in addition to the recommendations presented here have been discussed. However, these are the recommendations that would allow for varying degrees of market alignment.

### **Implementation Based on Current Grade**

Option 1 - Annual Cost to bring employees up to the minimum of the proposed pay range is approximately \$49,000 and represents 0.5% of payroll and a small percentage of the workforce. This option will create substantial compression.

Option 2 - Annual Cost to move employees to the step closest to their current rate of pay, without reducing pay, is approximately \$179,000 which represents approximately 1.8% of payroll and the entire workforce by varying amounts. This option does not resolve misalignment of some positions above or below market.

Option 3- Annual Cost for employees to maintain existing grade and step is approximately \$532,000, which would place all employees in the proposed structure while allowing for greater external market alignment and internal equity, and mitigating compression that may occur with options 1 and 2, and represents approximately 5.4% of payroll. This option does not resolve misalignment of some positions above or below market and is prohibitive at this time.

### **Implementation Based on Realigned Grades**

Option 4 - Annual Cost to bring employees up to the minimum of the proposed pay range is approximately \$67,000 and represents 0.7% of payroll and a small percentage of the workforce. This option will create substantial compression.

Option 5 - Annual Cost to move employees to the step closest to their current rate of pay, without reducing pay, is approximately \$195,000 which represents approximately 2.0% of payroll and the entire workforce by varying amounts.

Option 6- Annual Cost for employees to maintain existing grade and step is approximately \$539,000, which would place all employees in the proposed structure while allowing for greater external market alignment and internal equity, and mitigating compression that may occur with options 1 and 2, and represents approximately 5.5% of payroll. This option is prohibitive at this time.

After several weeks of analysis and determining the best approach for the City and its employees, a decision was made to go with the recommendation that would allow Bellaire to be aligned with the market. Option 5, with an implementation date of October 1, 1017, meets these objectives. The cost to the general fund would be \$211,000 and the Enterprise Fund \$24,000. In addition to the recommendation given by the consultant, the City Manager is also proposing a step increase (3.5%) for police officers and paramedic firefighters only for an additional \$85,000. All figures account for vacancies. To mitigate compression issues, contingency funds of \$25,000 is also recommended. This option meets

the budget parameters set forth and allows the City the best option to stay competitive at this time.

Additionally, the City has fallen behind the market in the number of vacation days offered to its employees. Staff is currently evaluating the following adjustments to the Employee Handbook with no changes to the maximum accrual of 240 hours (360 hours for Fire):

### **Item Title:**

Presentation of the FY 2017 Third Quarter Report for the City of Bellaire, Texas - Submitted by Terrence Beaman, Chief Financial Officer.

### **Background/Summary:**

The third quarter report reflects the nine months ending June 30, 2017 or the year to date actuals. In addition, the third quarter report includes year-end projections for both the General and Enterprise Funds.

General Fund FY 2017 projections will result in a net decrease to the year-end balance in the amount of \$18,344 when compared to the FY 2017 adopted budget ending balance. The main reason for this shortfall is the result of property and sales tax revenues coming in under budget. In addition to revenues coming in under budget, expenditures are projected to come in under budget mainly due to salary and benefit savings. More detailed explanations can be found in the attached staff report.

Enterprise Fund FY 2017 projections will result in a net decrease to the year-end balance in the amount of \$49,839 when compared to the FY 2017 adopted budget ending balance. Due to lower than anticipated water revenues coupled with a budget entry error in the Solid Waste division, enterprise revenues are coming in under budget. As with the general fund, expenditures are coming in under budget due to salary and benefit savings, as well as operational savings due to lower than expected water purchases from the City of Houston, and expenditures for natural gas, electricity, and fuel are coming in under budget. More detailed explanations can be found in the attached staff report.

This report also contains the monthly financial report for June 2017.

A summary of Capital Improvement and Management Projects will also be given during this presentation.

# **General Fund**

The General Fund is projected to end FY 2017 with a fund balance of \$3,442,959. This is the beginning fund balance used to prepare the FY 2018 budget.

The projected FY 2017 ending balance is less than budgeted by \$18,344.

The nine months ending FY 2017 is projected to come in under the adopted budgeted revenues. As discussed previously, key revenues for the City are coming in under budget such as sales tax, property taxes and permit revenue.

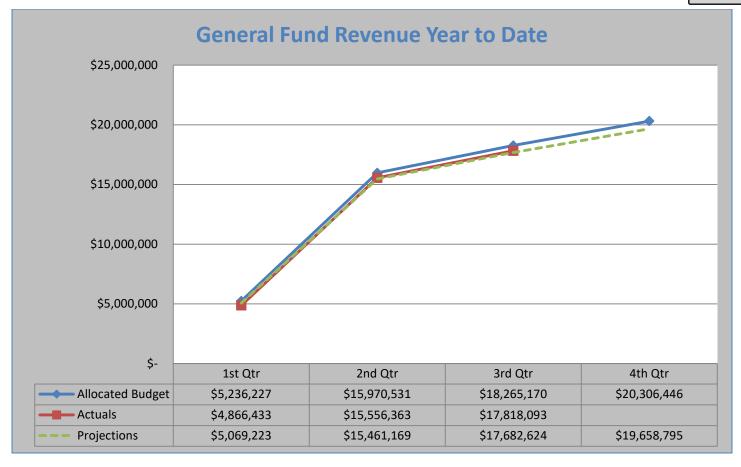
FY 2017 revenues are projected to come in under budget by approximately \$647,000. This is due to sales tax payments from the Texas Comptroller's office that were reported to Bellaire incorrectly. In addition, there were refunds to property tax payers as a result of Harris County Appraisal District modifications to assessed values.

Third quarter expenditures are at 71% of budget. The year-end projections anticipate a year-end savings of \$458,000 or a little over 2% of the overall budget. The following are the main drivers behind the savings projected at year-end.

- Salary and benefits savings as a result of various vacancies earlier in the year
- Expenditures for natural gas, electricity, and fuel running below budget
- Reduction in cost related to Evelyn's Park due to delayed grand opening

Staff will continue to closely monitor the budget to ensure the projected ending balance comes in close to the adopted budget at year-end.

The allocated budget accounts for cyclical trends in revenues and expenditures versus allocating a straight 1/12 of the annual budget per month. The allocated budget is based on the actual revenue/expenditures incurred by month as a percentage of the total revenue/expenditures incurred by year for the most recent historical five-years.



### **Property Tax**

The City collected 98%, or \$12,108,630, of its budgeted property tax revenue during the nine months ended June 30, 2017, which is under the allocated budget by \$165,139, or 1%. The timing of property tax collections is driven by the January 31, 2017 due date, after which penalties are incurred.

Overall, the General Fund ultimately expects to collect approximately \$12.3 million in property taxes in FY 2017, an increase of \$1.0 million over FY 2016's \$11.3 million. The expected increase in property taxes is driven by a general tax rate increase of \$0.005 per \$100 of assessed value increase, or 2.0%, and a 6.2% increase in taxable values.

### **Franchise Taxes**

Franchise taxes of \$1,088,796 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, are over the allocated budget by \$26,160, or 2%. Electric franchise tax payments are generally received monthly. Gas, telephone, and cable franchise tax payments are generally received quarterly.

### Sales Tax

Sales tax revenue of \$1,660,759 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, is under the allocated budget by \$210,178, or 11%.

The City's current inter-local agreement with METRO, effective October 2014, requires METRO to pay the City one-half of all sales taxes collected by METRO within the Bellaire city limits. The City records these revenues in the METRO Fund. The City has experienced a corresponding decline in METRO sales tax receipts in the METRO fund.

### Permits, Fees, and Licenses

Development permits, fees, and licenses of \$879,798 are under the allocated budget by \$71,216, or 7%. Permits and plan check fees are budgeted to be higher in FY 2017 due to the construction of a new H-E-B grocery store. The budget includes \$153,000 of building permit and plan check revenue related to the H-E-B store construction. In May, we recorded the first of the H-E-B related fees. The majority of the anticipated H-E-B fees were recorded in May and June, \$142,719 out of a budgeted \$153,000. As a result, the year-to-date June results are much closer to the allocated budget than prior months (year-to-date May results were 21% below allocated budget).

Numerous categories of permit/fees/license revenue have been trending below historical averages for most of the year, but they seem to show improvements in June. As reflected in the previous chart, actual fiscal year-to-date permit/fees/license revenue is now slightly higher than last year. However, despite having received the bulk of the budgeted H-E-B related fees, the category as a whole is 7% below allocated budget and several individual revenue accounts are below last year's results.

### **PARD Charges & Fees**

Parks and Recreation fees are weighted heavily toward the summer months when Camp Paseo is operating and the swimming pools are open daily.

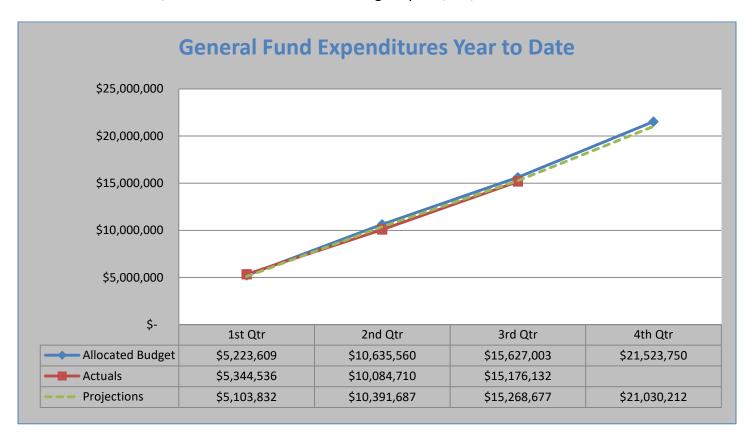
Parks and Recreation fees of \$702,910 are over the allocated budget by \$24,766, or 4%.

### **Public Safety**

Public Safety revenues of \$288,451 are under the allocated budget by \$9,847, or 3%.

### <u>Fines</u>

Fine revenues of \$562,766 are under the allocated budget by \$29,449, or 5%.



For the nine months ended June 30, 2017, the General Fund expended 71% of its total budgeted expenditures and is under its allocated budget by \$454,365, or 3%.

Salaries and benefits make up the largest category of expenditures in the General Fund at 64% of all FY 2017 budgeted expenditures, followed by purchased services at 19%.

### **Salary and Benefits**

Salary and benefits of \$10,106,685 are over the allocated budget based on 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter projections by \$111,189, or 1%. When compared to the adopted budget, salaries and benefits are tracking under the allocated budget due to vacancies during the beginning of the fiscal year.

### **Purchased Services**

Purchased services of \$2,770,651 are under the allocated budget by \$251,517, or 8%.

Some of the larger departmental level variances contributing to this category being below the allocated budget include:

- Parks (Maintenance) Parks Maintenance is running under budget due to the delayed opening of Evelyn's Park and because some costs which will be City funded maintenance costs are being funded under short-term construction warranties.
- Parks (Maintenance) Other contract labor was \$7,118 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017 as compared to the prior five-year average of \$11,130. This budget is being conserved for a large tree inventory project that commenced in June and will run through mid-August.
- Parks (Recreation) Instructor pay was \$54,041 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, as compared to
  reduced budget of \$88,000, or 61% of budget. We are experiencing a steady shift away from the historical
  model of the City administering programs, collecting registration fees, and paying instructors to a new model of
  instructors administering programs, collecting registration fees directly, then remitting a portion of the fees to
  the City.
- Parks (Aquatics) Partially offsetting the decreases is Pool Maintenance, which was \$103,572 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, as compared to the prior five-year average of \$41,604. A severe water line break and related repairs exhausted 95% of the pool maintenance budget before the summer busy season even began. As a result of the unexpected repairs, the FY 2017 budget was increased from \$107,000 to \$119,000 during the mid-year budget adjustment process.
- Public Works (Streets) Engineers, Planners, Arborists was \$42,975 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, which is 38% of the \$113,000 FY 2017 budget. This variance is due to several outstanding invoices. Once paid, this category should no longer be significantly below budget.
- Public Works (Streets) Paving Maintenance was \$10,718, which is 31% of the \$35,000 FY 2017 budget.
- Public Works (Streets) Traffic Signal Maintenance was \$21,864, which is 62% of the \$35,000 FY 2017 budget.
- Police Other Professional expenditures were \$3,439 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, as compared to
  the prior five-year average of \$7,366, and an annual FY 2017 budget of \$30,750. The budget included \$10,000 to
  update the job description of sworn police personnel. We have been able to leverage state resources for job
  description updates and will not need to spend the \$10,000.

• Police – Vehicle Maintenance expenditures were \$36,034 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, as compared to the annual FY 2017 budget of \$60,000. Through 75% of the fiscal year, only 60% of the budget has been expended.

### **Supplies**

Supplies of \$720,746 are under the allocated budget by \$114,995, or 14%.

Some of the larger variances contributing to this category being below the allocated budget include:

- All Departments Natural gas expenditures are a contributor to supplies being under the allocated budget. Natural gas expenditures were \$18,575 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, as compared to a five-year average of \$28,992, and FY 2017 Budget of \$35,175. The City's primary use of natural gas relates to heating the swimming pool at the Bellaire Family Aquatics Center. The pool was closed for repairs from December 15 through January 20 and was not heated causing a significant reduction in natural gas usage. Additionally, similar to FY 2016, FY 2017 was a mild winter with lower natural gas expenditures related to heating workspaces.
- All Departments Electricity expenditures are a contributor to supplies being under the allocated budget. Electricity expenditures of \$221,789 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017 are 61% of the \$361,000 FY 2017 budget. A delay in the receipt of the June electric bill resulted in June's electricity expenditure of \$26,786 being recorded in July. If this amount were added to the year to date expenditure, it would increase the year-to-date amount from \$221,789 to \$248,575, which is 69% of the budgeted amount. Our Electric rates decreased beginning January 2017 pursuant to an amended electric contract. While our FY 2017 budget incorporated anticipated rate changes, our actual expenditures are lower than what we budgeted.
- All Departments In past reports, fuel expenditures have been noted as contributing to supplies being under the allocated budget; however, mid-year budget adjustments reduced the fuel budget by \$19,750 and fuel expenditures are 73% of budget at June 30, 2017.

### Other Expenditures and Transfers Out

The "other expenditures and transfers out" category is mainly the monthly transfers from the General Fund to (1) the Capital Improvement Fund and (2) the Vehicle and Equipment Replacement Fund. Other expenditures and transfers out in the nine months ended June 30, 2017, of \$1,578,050 are under the allocated budget by \$199,042, or 11%.

Total budgeted transfers out of the General Fund are \$2,057,000, or \$171,417/month. The year-to-date expenditures are \$35,297 higher than the annualized transfer amount because of banking fees. The category appears under the allocated budget because of the "unallocated" category.

# **Enterprise Fund**

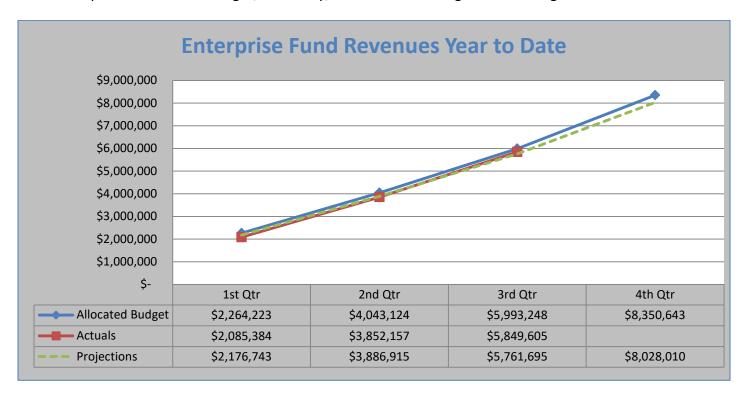
The Enterprise Fund is projected to end FY 2017 with a balance of \$669,398. This is \$49,839 less than budgeted.

Water revenues are projected to come in under budget by \$248,330. Staff will continue to monitor water revenues as this is the first year of the new water rate implementation plan to automate the reading of all water meters which will capture more accurate usage throughout the year. Solid waste revenues, as previously communicated will come in under budget approximately \$190,000 due to a budget error that occurred during the budget adoption process.

Expenditures are projected to come in under budget due to factors such as:

- Salary and benefits savings as a result of vacant positions earlier in the fiscal year
- Expenditures of natural gas, electricity, and fuel are coming in below budget



For the nine months ended June 30, 2017, the Enterprise Fund collected 70% of its total budgeted revenues and is under its allocated budget by \$143,643, or 2%.

Sales of water makes up the largest category of revenues in the Enterprise Fund at 50% of all FY 2017 budgeted revenues, followed by charges for wastewater at 26%, and charges for solid waste at 23%.

### **Water Revenue**

Water revenues of \$2,776,334 are below the allocated budget by \$101,211, or 4%.

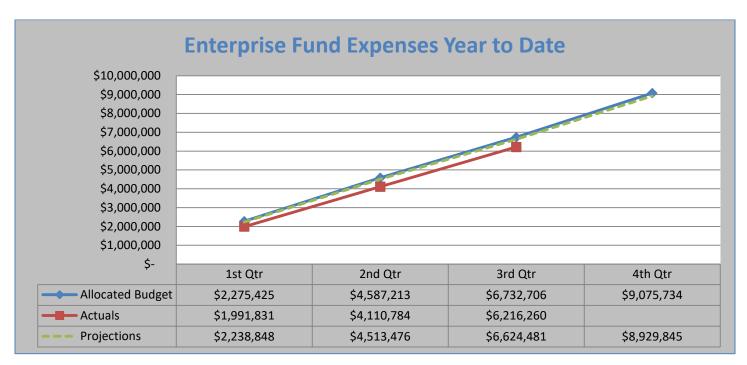
### **Wastewater Revenue**

Wastewater revenues of \$1,742,269 are over the allocated budget by \$131,467, or 8%.

### **Solid Waste**

Solid Waste revenues of \$1,266,271 are below the allocated budget by \$144,729, or 10%.

As initially reported in the first quarter report, a budget error caused the annual budgeted solid waste revenue amount to be inflated by approximately \$190,000. For the nine months ended June 30, 2017, solid waste expenditures were approximately \$268,395 less than revenues collected. As communicated previously, staff will continue to monitor to ensure the solid waste operations are self-supporting.



For the nine months ended June 30, 2017, the Enterprise Fund incurred 68% of its total budgeted expenses and is under its allocated budget by \$508,736, or 8%. The variance from allocated budget is due mainly to "Supplies" and "Purchased Services."

"Other and transfers" makes up the largest category of expenses in the Enterprise Fund at 31.4% of all FY 2017 budgeted expenses, followed by supplies (which includes water purchased from the City of Houston) at 30.7%. Other and transfers includes \$11,000 of budgeted operational expenses and \$2,746,000 of transfers out, including (1) \$624,000 to the General Fund to reimburse overhead expenses, (2) \$950,000 to the Debt Service Fund, (3) \$522,000 to the Vehicle and Equipment Replacement Fund, and (4) \$650,000 to the Capital Improvement Fund.

### **Salary and Benefits**

Salary and benefits of \$1,177,008 are under the allocated budget by \$11,320, or 1%.

### **Purchased Services**

Purchased services of \$1,059,742 are under the allocated budget by \$188,946, or 15%.

Some of the larger variances contributing to this category being below the allocated budget include:

- Water Production Other Technical Services expenditures, which includes water testing, were \$3,906 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, which is 15% of the \$25,300 FY 2017 budget.
- Water Production Generator maintenance expenditures were \$2,899 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, which is 19% of the \$15,000 FY 2017 budget.
- Water Production Water Well Maintenance expenditures were \$40,616 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, which is 65% of the \$62,440 FY 2017 budget.
- Water Distribution Water Main Maintenance expenditures were \$21,362 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, which is 12% of the \$181,792 FY 2017 budget.
- Waste Water Collection Other Contract Labor expenditures were \$35,863 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, which is 50% of the \$71,890 FY 2017 budget.
- Waste Water Treatment Building Maintenance expenditures were \$15,838 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, which is 37% of the \$42,500 FY 2017 budget.
- Solid Waste Trash Hauls expenditures were \$188,513 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, which is 63% of the \$300,000 FY 2017 budget.
- Solid Waste Vehicle Maintenance expenditures were \$106,171 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, which is 66% of the \$160,000 FY 2017 budget.

### **Supplies**

Supplies of \$1,910,847 are under the allocated budget by \$232,475, or 11%.

Some of the larger variances contributing to this category being below the allocated budget include:

- Water Purchased from Houston Water purchases were \$1,285,714 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, or 71% of the \$1,804,861 FY 2017 budget. We budgeted a 14% increase in FY 2017 water purchases from the City of Houston, as compared to FY 2016 actual expense of \$1,610,888. The overall budgeted increase was based on a price increase from the City of Houston and expected increase in the volume of water to be purchased for FY 2017. As expected, the City of Houston raised its price per 1,000 gallons by 1.4%, from \$2.842 to \$2.882. The water purchases expense of \$1,285,714 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, is \$43,161 less than the average of the prior five years of \$1,242,553, and \$42,613 more than FY 2016, or a 3.4% increase over FY 2016.
- Fuel expenditures are a contributor to supplies being under the allocated budget. Fuel expenditures were \$48,780 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017, as compared to a five-year average of \$70,364. Fuel expenditures for the same period in FY 2016 were \$47,615, which is 2% lower than the current year expenditure. While fuel prices have trended up slightly in 2017, we budgeted for a more

significant increase in fuel prices. Fuel expenditures for the nine months ended June 30, 2017 are 50% of the \$97,900 FY 2017 Fuel budget.

Electricity expenditures are a contributor to supplies being under the allocated budget. Electricity expenditures of \$251,453 for the nine months ended June 30, 2017 are 59% of the \$423,000 FY 2017 budget. A delay in the receipt of the June electric bill resulted in June's electricity expenditure of \$27,914 being recorded in July. If this amount was added to the year to date expenditure, it would increase the year-to-date amount from \$251,453 to \$279,367, which is 66% of the budgeted amount.

### **Other Expenses and Transfers Out**

The "other expenses and transfers out" category is mainly the monthly transfers from the Enterprise Fund to (1) the General Fund, (2) the Debt Service Fund, (3) The Vehicle and Equipment Replacement Fund, and (4) the Capital Improvement Fund. Other expenses and transfers out in the nine months ended June 30, 2017, of \$2,068,664 are under the allocated budget by \$75,995, or 4%.

# **Management Projects**

During the budget process Council was presented with Management Projects developed to provide service enhancements and review and develop policies which will allow the City to become more efficient.

### **MP 1701 – Public Works Site Planning:**

A contract is in place with PGAL and the work on this project will begin in late summer. Work is sufficiently underway on the Municipal Facilities Project and the Citywide Branding effort and staff is available for thorough programming. Expected completion is by the end of the calendar year 2017 to allow for incorporation into the draft CIP for FY 2019-2023.

### MP 1702 – GIS, Work Order / Online Permits:

The team has made recommendations to the City Manager for the FY 2018 Budget process as to the next steps and will be collecting requirements for new applications.

### MP 1703 - Mosquito Control:

The City began fogging for mosquitoes in April 2017 and will continue to provide spraying through September 2017 and possibly into November 2017. A mosquito larvicide treatment has been implemented in conjunction with the fogging and will continue until September 2017. The mosquito treatment message continues to be communicated through our online newsletter, The Boulevard (July 2017 edition), as well as on the City website.

### **MP 1704 – Landscape Enhancements:**

All landscape enhancements have been completed excluding the landscaping at the railroad tracks. The landscape enhancement located at Bellaire Blvd. and the railroad tracks will be a separate project and the possibility of installing the utility line that currently resides in the middle of the esplanade underground is still being researched.

In June 2017, the Planning and Zoning Commission directed staff to draft a recommendation related to the Urban Design/Beautification Master Plan as it pertains to the Code of Ordinances Chapters 24 and 23.5, amendments to the comprehensive plan and inclusion in future city design standards. This recommendation is expected to be presented to Planning and Zoning in Fall 2017.

### MP 1705 – Career Website:

The Premier Employer Team has continued to meet and work with Recruiting.com to lead the City of Bellaire through the development of a career site. The team has reviewed several versions of the mock and demo sites and provided feedback and edits for improvement. The site is coming along nicely and is scheduled to launch in Fall 2017.

# Capital Improvement Program Projects

Council was presented with the FY 2017 Capital Projects which have been designed to meet today's infrastructure needs as well as those of the future. Outlined below are the milestones completed in the third quarter.

### **Fiscal Year 2017 Projects:**

### **Bonds for Better Bellaire Program:**

### Water and Wastewater Project Group A Phase I:

ARKK Engineers, LLC, the selected engineering firm, has submitted 30% plans to the City for review. A neighborhood meeting will be scheduled within the next three months after the 60% plan sets are under review. Waterline improvements on the following blocks are in this scope:

- 4900 5000 Blocks of Beech Street
- 5300 5400 Blocks of Braeburn Drive
- 5300 Block of Grand Lake Street
- 5100 5300 Blocks of Huisache Street
- 4800 4900 Blocks of Locust Street
- 4500 Block of Mayfair Street
- 4800 5000 Blocks of Palmetto Street
- 5100 5200 Blocks of Patrick Henry Street
- 5400 Block of Pine Street
- 5400 Block of Valerie Street
- A wastewater Line will be improved on the 6800 block of Mapleridge Street

### Streets and Drainage Group B Phase I:

HDR Inc., the selected engineering firm, is nearing completion of the design phase. The four roadways in this project were originally designed with a previous bond program, but limited funding caused them to be removed from the construction contract. The City has asked HDR to submit a revised Urban Forester Report that recommends how the live oak trees on the 4700 blocks of Willow and Linden will be addressed during construction. The scope includes a street replacement, storm sewer upgrade, and installing sidewalks on at least one side of the street for the following blocks:

- 4700 Block of Linden
- 4700 Block of Willow
- 4900 Block of Imperial
- 4900 Block of Mayfair
- The waterline will be improved on the 4900 block of Imperial

### Streets and Drainage Group C Phase II:

Costello, Inc., the selected engineering firm for this project, is coordinating with Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), the City of Houston and Harris County Flood Control District (HCFCD) to determine the design guidelines for the City to install flood control devices along the southern perimeter of the city. This information is expected to be submitted in the Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) in October 2017. Upon conclusion of the PER, design for the flood control devices as well as the street reconstruction, storm sewer upgrades, sidewalks and waterline improvements will begin. Streets on the following blocks are in this scope:

- 4500 Block of Maple
- 500 Block of Bolivar
- 5100-5200 Blocks of Spruce
- 700 Block of N Fifth Street (from Bellaire to Spruce)
- A waterline will be improved on the 700 block of N Fifth Street

### Sidewalks Group D Phase I:

Kelly R. Kaluza & Associates, Inc., the selected engineering firm, has submitted 30% plans to the City for review. A neighborhood meeting will be scheduled within the next three months after the 60% plan sets are under review. Sidewalks on at least one side of the street on the following blocks are in this scope:

- 4700 5000 Blocks of Braeburn Drive
- 4500 4600 Blocks of Holly Street
- 4600 Block of Laurel Street
- 4600 Block of Oleander Street
- 1000 Block of Pauline Avenue
- 5000 5100 Blocks of Pine Street
- 5300 Block of Pine Street
- 4500 Block of Teas Street
- 4800 4900 Blocks of Valerie Street
- 4500 Block of Verone Street

### Water Meter Installation and Improvements to Wastewater Treatment Plant:

Water Meter Installation - Pedal Valve, Inc. (PVI), the selected contractor, has installed 3,874 meters as of July 2017, which is approximately 50% of the total quantity to be replaced. City staff is currently transitioning the monthly billing from manual reads to automatic readings. Utility Billing updates will be phasing in as they become 100% completed by PVI for meter change outs.

Improvements to Wastewater Treatment Plant - Jones & Carter, the selected engineering firm, submitted a project summary transmittal letter to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) which was granted approval on April 12, 2017. 75% plans were submitted to the City for review. T&C Construction has begun cleaning and coating the sludge thickeners and digester basins. Two of the thickeners are completed and back in service. Repairs were also completed prior to return to service. One digester is currently being coated by the contractor. One digester and one thickener are in the process of being drained and cleaned. Various pieces of equipment have been ordered and are awaiting delivery. Upon arrival, the bulk of the work at the facility will commence.

### **Cash Funded Projects:**

### **Municipal Facilities Project:**

Notice to Proceed on the construction of the project was issued on May 5, 2017. Since then, the renovations to the Civic Center have taken place, and Police and Court staff and functions move was completed on July 12, 2017. All operations are up and running as intended. Work on underground utilities (including electrical, gas, and data communications lines) and asbestos abatement was completed in July, and demolition of the existing Police Station will occur in August. The temporary construction trailer is also in place, and restriping of South Rice Avenue to maximize available parking was completed. A portion of the parking lot at the corner of South Rice Avenue and Jessamine Street will be unavailable during the remainder of construction of the new police station. The pedestrian crossing signal located on South Rice Avenue, midblock between Linden Street and Jessamine Street will be removed prior to the beginning of school year, but the protected crossing at

Jessamine Street will remain in place. Metro has temporarily relocated the bus stop along South Rice Avenue to a new location just north of construction zone.

### FY 2017 Pavement Management Program:

ARKK Engineers, LLC has completed the design for this project. Two plan sets, one for streets and sidewalks and the other for pavement striping, will be bid by the end of summer. The streets and sidewalks project includes street repairs with an overlay to the following blocks:

- 4500 Block of Holt
- 4500 Block of Mayfair
- 5300 Block of Grand Lake
- 4900-5000 Blocks of Maple
- 4700-4800 Blocks of Evergreen (includes striping)

Sidewalks are repaired or replaced at the following blocks:

- 100 Block of Beverly
- 4500-4600 Blocks of Birch
- 4500 Block of Braeburn

The striping portion includes various streets city wide such as Bellaire, South Rice, Newcastle, Evergreen and Avenue B.

### **Decorative Standards for Major Streets:**

This project will begin later in the year. This project will be informed by aesthetic considerations and direction provided as part of the Beautification Project and the review of the Terrain Studios planning efforts, as well as the guidelines developed in the branding project.

### Rehabilitation of the Renwick Ground Storage Tank (GST):

Central Tank Coatings, Inc. has performed all interior and exterior structure blasting, exterior side tank coating, and partial interior coating of the GST. The project has experienced some delays due to weather, but is on track to meet the project deadline. The contractor anticipates the completion of all painting by the end of July. A final walkthrough is planned in late summer. The final release of retainage and project close out is scheduled for the October 2, 2017 City Council meeting.

### City-Wide Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) Systems Upgrade Project Phase 2 & 3:

Ace Controls completed the installation of the new control panel components in May 2017. The equipment has been tested and is in service. JACH Controls (contractor) ordered a new cradle point, which was programmed and then installed in early July. JACH Controls is working with vendors to resolve some minor programming issues with the unit and then the site will be fully SCADA functional. A final walk through is planned for late summer. The final release of retainage and project close out is scheduled for the October 2, 2017 City Council meeting.

The preliminary project scope for Phase III was developed by H2OMC, LLC., the City's water and wastewater consultant, and JACH Controls is developing preliminary estimates. H2OMC is currently working on the final Phase III specifications for solicitation of bids. Bid solicitation is anticipated to occur in early August 2017.

### **Bellaire Family Aquatic Center Pool Area Improvements:**

A contract is in place with Pierce Goodwin Alexander & Linville (PGAL) to design an enclosed storage area adjacent to the pool complex and develop concept designs for additional decking. The project kick off meeting

was held on July 11, 2017. Additional deck space will be designed on the north side of the pool to better accommodate patrons. The enclosure will allow for storage of large pool items, which will also allow more deck space for pool patrons. Design work is underway and is intended to be complete in the late summer. Bidding and construction will begin as soon as the summer pool season ends.

### **Community Pathways Master Plan:**

The contract for the professional services with HR Green, LLC Is scheduled for Council consideration on the August 7, 2017 City Council meeting. The outcome of this project will influence the future phases of the Sidewalk Project portion of the Bonds for Better Bellaire projects.

### Flood Plain Hazard Mitigation Plan:

The City will be entering into an agreement with ARKK Engineers, LLC for Flood Plain management planning. A planning kickoff meeting is scheduled for August between ARKK and various City staff. A resolution authorizing the City Manager to establish an advisory task force, compiled of Bellaire residents and stakeholders, will be before Council on August 21, 2017 for consideration. The task force, which is required by Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), will assist ARKK and City Staff in the development of the floodplain management plan. The same process was authorized by the City Council in 2003, when the Flood Plain Management Plan was first developed. Once the plan has been approved by the task force a public hearing will be held and ready for Council consideration in Early Spring of 2018.

### **Public Works Site Planning Project:**

Kick off meetings will be scheduled in August 2017 to review current conditions and discuss programmatic needs with City staff. PGAL is currently under contract to perform this initial conceptual phase, and the intended outcome is a preliminary site plan, building master plan and cost estimate. This phase will be sufficiently underway before the end of the calendar year so as to inform the FY 2019-2023 Capital Improvement Plan. Currently, the CIP has a new Public Works building included in a bond election tentatively scheduled for November 2019.

### Park Signage Master Plan:

This project will begin later in the year. This project will be informed by aesthetic considerations and direction provided as part of the Brand Identity Project and the review of the Terrain Studios planning efforts, as well as the guidelines developed in the branding project.

### Playground and Shade Structures:

Improvements including the installation of two new shade structures at Loftin Park and two new shade structures at Officer Lucy Dog Park are complete, as well as replacement of 31 trash containers to improve aesthetics across the park system. This project has been completed for this Fiscal Year.

## **Fiscal Year 2016 and Prior Projects:**

### **Bond Funded Projects:**

### **Evelyn's Park Phase I:**

Substantial Completion of the project was reached on March 17, 2017. Construction of the project is complete, but the contractor is still establishing acceptable grass coverage. Warranty items are being addressed by Linbeck Group, and the park is almost fully operational. Examples of warranty items that are being addressed include inadequate drain lines in HVAC areas, malfunctioning door hardware, inadequate insulation, replacement of plant material, and electrical infrastructure modifications in the café area. The

decorative fountain at the southwest entrance is not operational currently, but the problems seem to revolve around warranty issues. The City is working closely with Linbeck Group to resolve the remaining issues. Project close out will occur after remaining grass and fountain work is complete; a target Council Meeting date has not been set yet.

### Rebuild Bellaire Phase 5B:

Reytec Construction Resources, Inc., was awarded the contract to complete the work for the following streets that have been completed through this project:

- Alder Street (Evergreen to Maple)
- 6900 & 7000 Blocks of Ferris
- 4400 Block of Glenmont
- 1000 1200 Blocks of Howard
- 4400 Block of Nancy
- 5300 Block of Valerie

The final punch list (list of remaining minor items to be completed) for the project was created on July 10, 2017 and the contractor is addressing items on the list. The final release of retainage and project close out is scheduled for the September 11, 2017 City Council meeting.

### **Cash Funded Projects:**

### FY 2016 Pavement Management Program:

Various Block Inspection Program items are wrapping up with this project including pavement repairs, sidewalk improvements, curb and gutter repairs, and a mill and overlay on Ferris Street from Chestnut to Palmetto. The final release of retainage and project close out is scheduled for the October 2, 2017 City Council meeting.

### FY 2015 Pavement Management Program:

The remaining contract items identified in the Storm Drainage Maintenance Needs Assessment are wrapping up. The improvements recommended by the Plan included drainage inlets and concrete / asphalt pavement point repairs. The final release of retainage and project close out is scheduled for the October 2, 2017 City Council meeting.

#### **Item Title:**

Consideration of and possible action on a recommendation from the Public Works Department to award Bid No. 17-009, Water Distribution Piping and Fittings, to HD Supply in an amount not to exceed \$75,000 and on the adoption of an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Bellaire, Texas, to execute and attest to, respectively, for and on behalf of the City of Bellaire, Texas, a Standard Form of Agreement with HD Supply for the provision of water distribution piping and fittings in an amount not to exceed \$75,000 – Submitted by Michael Leech, Director of Public Works.

#### **Background/Summary:**

The Public Works Department is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the water and wastewater infrastructure required to provide potable water and sanitary sewer services to the community. To accomplish the tasks associated with this responsibility, the department must procure necessary parts, fittings and other related materials. Bid No. 17-009 includes a variety of materials ranging from commonly used residential water line repair parts to rarely used items such as complete fire hydrant kits. The Public Works Department uses many of the items associated with this bid for system repairs daily. Other items like fire hydrant kits are used less frequently. Having a contract like this in place enables the department to promptly respond to water or wastewater issues without having to solicit bids for parts and materials for each repair circumstance that may arise.

On July 27, 2017, three bids were received in response to Bid No. 17-009. Of the three bidders, only HD Supply submitted a complete bid. The remaining two bid only on select items and can therefore be considered incomplete. However, to ensure that the City was receiving the best value through this process, all three bids were evaluated to determine if it was logical to award contracts to each of the three bidders for the items each priced the lowest. The results of that evaluation showed that HD Supply was the low bidder for a majority of the items. Because HD Supply has the lowest price in most cases, the inefficiencies associated with sourcing similar items from multiple vendors, and the fact that municipalities are getting away from awarding multiple bids in circumstances such as this, the Public Works Department recommends awarding only to HD Supply.

#### **Previous Council Action Summary:**

Council approved the FY17 Public Works operating budget and is scheduled to approve the FY18 Public Works Budget in the coming weeks. Both include funding for the procurement of the parts, fittings and materials associated with Bid No. 17-009.

#### Fiscal Impact:

Budgeted funding is available in the FY17 Public Works Operating Budget and is anticipated to be available in the FY18 Public Works Operating Budget to procure the parts, fittings and

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materials associated with Bid No. 17-009. The Public Works Department is recommending an award amount of \$75,000 which is based on an evaluation of like expenditures in prior fiscal years. As this is a unit price contract, the department will pay HD Supply only for the parts, fittings and materials which are needed.

Any explanation desired by a prospective bidder regarding the true meaning or interpretation of the bid invitation, specifications, drawings, or other documents, must be requested in writing to the City Clerk, with sufficient time allowed for a reply to reach the prospective bidder before the submission deadline of bids. Oral explanations or instructions given before the award of any bid will <u>not</u> be binding. Any information given to a prospective bidder concerning an invitation will be furnished to all prospective bidders as an amendment to the invitation, if such information is necessary to bidders in submitting bids on the invitation, or if the lack of such information would be prejudicial to uninformed bidders. All addenda so issued shall become part of the bid documents.

#### 1. SPECIFICATIONS

Bidders are expected to examine specifications, drawings, standard provisions and all instructions. Failure to do so will be at the bidder's risk. Bidders may provide a product exceeding specifications, as an alternate bid, if they so desire.

- B. Sealed bids, in triplicate form, may also be delivered in person to the above address and designated accordingly.
- C. Bids must be returned in sufficient time so as to be received and time stamped at the above location on or before the published due date and time as shown in the bid invitation. Late bids properly identified will be returned unopened to the bidder. Late bids will not be considered under any circumstances.
- D. Bid documents and necessary information are included in the bid invitation, or may be obtained from the Purchasing Technician at the above address. Bids submitted on forms other than those provided in the bid invitation or with different terms and provisions may not be considered as responsive bids. However, bid proposal forms provided in the bid invitation may be photocopied if the bidder is submitting multiple bids.
- E. If the bidder, however, believes it necessary to base its price on price adjustment, such a bid may be considered, but only as an alternate bid.

- F. Bidder MUST give full firm name and address. Failure to manually sign the bid will automatically disqualify such bid. The person signing the bid should show TITLE, and AUTHORITY TO BIND HIS FIRM IN A CONTRACT.
- G. Bids will not be accepted via FAX.

#### 3. MODIFICATION OR WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

Bids may be modified or withdrawn by written notice received by the City Clerk prior to the exact hour and date specified for receipt of bids. A bid may also be withdrawn in person by a bidder or his authorized representative, provided his identity is made known and he signs a receipt for the bid, but only if the withdrawal is made prior to the exact hour and date set for the receipt of bids. Bids CANNOT be altered or amended after opening time. No bid may be withdrawn after opening without approval, based on a written acceptable reason.

#### 4. INFORMATION REQUIRED

- A. Each bidder shall furnish the information required by the invitation. The bidder shall sign the bid invitation, bidder's certification form, bid proposal form, and, when appropriate, specifications. Erasures or other changes must be initialed by the person signing the offer. Bids signed by an agent are to be accompanied by evidence of his authority to bind his firm in a contract, unless such evidence has been previously furnished to the City Clerk.
- B. The City is exempt from State of Texas local retail sales and use taxes, as well as Federal Excise Taxes. The City does not maintain a tax-exempt number, but may provide exemption certificates upon request.
- C. The bidder should quote its lowest and best price, F.O.B. destination on each item. If delivery and shipping quantities affect unit bid price, multiple bids may be made so as to indicate "price break" quantities in order for the City to determine maximum economic benefits. Pricing should include packaging and transportation unless otherwise specified. Pricing shall be entered on the bid proposal form in ink or typewritten. Totals shall be entered in the "Total Price" section of the bid proposal form. In case of discrepancy between unit price and extended price, the unit price will be presumed to be correct.
- D. Transportation Charges. If the quoted price does not include transportation charges, such charges must be itemized separately; provided, however, that the City shall have the right to designate the method of transportation to be used to ship the goods.
- E. Time, if stated as a number of days, will include Saturdays, Sundays and holidays. Time of delivery is part of the bid and is very important. The required delivery date indicated is at point of destination. If the indicated date cannot be met or date is not indicated, bidder shall state its best delivery time.
- F. If the bid invitation indicates "approved equal" products are acceptable, the bidder may offer an "equal" product as an alternate bid. Final "approved equal" determination remains with the City.
- G. Attorneys-in-fact who sign bid bonds or performance bonds must file with each bond a certified and effectively dated copy of their Power-of-Attorney.
- H. Laws and Regulations. The bidder's attention is directed to the fact that all applicable state laws, municipal ordinances, and the rules and regulations of all authorities having jurisdiction over

- performance of the bidder shall apply to the contract throughout, and they will be deemed to be included in the bid the same as though written out in full.
- I. Deviations from bid specifications and alternate bids must be clearly shown on the bid with complete information attached. Such bids may or may not be considered.
- J. Investigation of Conditions. #### 5. EVALUATION FACTORS

- A. Most Advantageous Bid. The City will award purchase orders and/or contracts to the lowest and most responsive bidder, which represents the most advantageous bid to the City, price and other factors considered. In determining the most advantageous bid or proposal, price, quantifiable factors, and other factors will be considered. Such factors include, but are not limited to, specifications, delivery requirements, the initial purchase price, life expectancy, cost of maintenance and operation, operating efficiency, training requirements, disposal value, and other factors contributing to the overall acquisition cost of an item. Consideration may be given, but not necessarily limited to conformity to the specifications, product warranty, a bidder's proposed service, ability to supply and provide service, delivery on required schedules, and past performance in other bids with the City, including timely delivery.
- B. <u>Partial Awards.</u> Bidders may furnish pricing for all or any portion of the bid invitation. Unless the bidder specifies otherwise in the bid, the City may award the bid for any individual item, group of items, or any combination of items thereof.
- C. Reservations. The City expressly reserves the right to:
  - 1. Waive as an informality, minor deviations from specifications, provided total cost of the bid is lower and the overall function of the bid item(s) is improved or not impaired;
  - 2. Waive any defect, irregularity or informality in any bid or bidding procedure;

  - 7. Increase or decrease the quantity or quantities specified in the bid invitation, unless the bidder specifies otherwise.

#### 6. ACCEPTANCE

#### 7. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Bidders must comply with any conflict of interest provisions in the City Charter, Code of Ordinances, State of Texas or Federal laws. Consistent and continually tied bidding may cause rejection of bids by the City and/or investigation for anti-trust violations.

#### 8. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

#### **Background/Summary:**

In accordance with Article II, The Council, Section 1, Elections, Subsection (e), Election Dates, of the Charter of the City of Bellaire, Texas, as amended November 7, 2006, and Chapter 3, Ordering Election, Section 3.004(a)(3), Election of Political Subdivision, of the Texas Election Code, an ordinance has been prepared for City Council consideration for the purpose of electing a Mayor, Councilman-Position No. 1, Councilman-Position No. 3, and Councilman-Position No. 5 for the City Council.

The City of Bellaire 2017 General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 7, 2017, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. The City Clerk's office contacted Harris County and asked to contract with them and other Harris County entities holding elections on that same date. Contracting with Harris County allows our residents to vote on all issues or offices of interest to them in one polling location. It is anticipated that a Joint Election Contract will be presented to City Council for consideration within the next month.

Due to the construction of new municipal facilities, the polling place for Precinct 128, previously held in the Bellaire Civic Center, will move to the CenterPoint Energy Community Center, Second Floor of the Bellaire Family Aquatic Center, 7001 Fifth Street, Bellaire, Texas 77401. It is anticipated that the polling places for Precincts 182, 214, 215, and 268 will remain the same as in previous years (i.e., Horn Academy (Elementary School), the Meridian Banquet Center, Faith Lutheran American Church, and Christ Church Presbyterian Fellowship Hall, respectively).

An official canvass will be held for the purpose of canvassing the results of the general election on Monday, November 20, 2017, at 6:00 p.m. Unless there is a runoff, the newly elected officials for Mayor, Councilman-Position No. 1, Councilman-Position No. 3, and Councilman-Position No. 5 will take office at the first Regular Session of the City Council in January of 2018 or on January 8, 2018.

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to *Chapter 3, Ordering Election, Section* 3.004(a)(3), *Election of Political Subdivision*, of the *Texas Election Code*, the governing body of a political subdivision (i.e., the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas) is authorized to order an election for the general election of City officers; and

**WHEREAS,** the current term of office for the Mayor of the City of Bellaire, Texas, shall expire on January 8, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the current terms of office for the City Councilmen – Position Nos. 1, 3, and 5 of the City of Bellaire, Texas, shall each expire on January 8, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bellaire, Texas, is authorized under Article II, The Council, Section 1, Elections, Subsection (e), Election Dates, of the Charter of the City of Bellaire, Texas, as amended November 7, 2006, to conduct its general election on the uniform election date designated by the State of Texas as the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November; NOW, THEREFORE,

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## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLAIRE, TEXAS:

- **1. THAT** the recitals contained herein are true and correct.
- 2. THAT the general election to elect the Mayor, Councilman Position No. 1, Councilman Position No. 3, and Councilman Position No. 5, for the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, will be held on Tuesday, November 7, 2017, in conjunction with elections to be administered by Harris County, Texas ("County") for the City of Bellaire, Texas, the City of Houston, Texas, and other local entities.
- **3. THAT** the qualified voters of the City of Bellaire, Texas, shall elect a Mayor to a two-year term commencing on January 8, 2018, and expiring on the date of the first regular City Council meeting in 2020 (i.e., on January 6, 2020).
- **4. THAT** the qualified voters of the City of Bellaire, Texas, shall elect three Councilmen for the following positions: 1, 3, and 5, to a four-year term commencing on January 8, 2018, and expiring on the date of the first regular City Council meeting in 2022 (i.e., on January 3, 2022).
- **5. THAT** the City consists of five (5) voting precincts and polling places (i.e., 128, 182, 214, 215, and 268), the polling places of which are those designated by the County.
- **6. THAT** each of the referenced five (5) voting precincts is a regular County election precinct and, therefore, the City hereby appoints the County election officials as its special officials for the purpose of this general election.
- 7. THAT the Presiding Judge, Manager, and Tabulation Supervisor shall be those special officials appointed by the County for the purposes of this General Election.

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- **8. THAT Early Voting by Mail** for the general election may be conducted by making application for an early voting ballot with Stan Stanart, Harris County Clerk, P.O. Box 1148, Houston, Texas 77251-1148. Voters qualified to vote early by mail may begin applying for a ballot by mail on January 1, 2017.
- **9. THAT Early Voting by Personal Appearance** may be conducted by the Harris County Clerk's Office, Elections Division, 1001 Preston, 1<sup>st</sup> Floor, Houston, Texas 77002, or any of the other early voting polling locations designated by the County. **Early Voting by Personal Appearance** will begin on Monday, October 23, 2017, and conclude on Friday, November 3, 2017.
- **10. THAT** ballots shall be cast utilizing direct recording equipment during early voting and during election day.
- **11. THAT** a special meeting of the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, to canvass returns of the general election shall be held on Monday, November 20, 2017, at 6:00 p.m.
- **12. THAT** the form of notice prescribed by the Secretary of State of the State of Texas shall serve as proper notice of the general election. Said notice, including a Spanish, Vietnamese, and Mandarin Chinese translation thereof, shall be given by publishing and posting it in accordance with the *Texas Election Code*.
- or other part of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, shall ever be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, neither the remainder of this ordinance, or the application of such word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, section or other part of this Ordinance to any other persons or circumstances, shall not be affected thereby.

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- **14. THAT** all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of conflict only.

#### **Background/Summary:**

On November 7, 2016, the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, adopted Ordinance No. 16-067 for the purpose of establishing a Charter Review Commission (the "CRC") as an Ad Hoc Committee for the City of Bellaire, Texas, to review the Charter of the City of Bellaire, Texas, as last amended on November 7, 2006, and to appoint five (5) members to serve on the CRC for a term of seven (7) months commencing on December 1, 2016, and ending on June 30, 2017.

The five (5) members appointed to serve on the CRC (in alphabetical order) were Jill Almaguer, James P. Avioli, Sr., Doug Christians, Aaron Swerdlin, and Neil Verma. Members of the CRC elected Neil Verma to serve as Chair and Jill Almaguer to serve as Vice Chair.

The CRC met on eight (8) separate occasions and at the conclusion of the meetings, a final report was prepared and presented to City Council at the June 19, 2017 Council meeting.

Following that meeting, the City Attorney prepared a series of propositions that could be placed on the ballot at a special election to be held on November 7, 2017, in conjunction with the City's General Election to elect a Mayor and Council Members. Those propositions were presented to City Council on July 17, 2017. Several revisions were made by City Council, and those revisions have been incorporated in the ordinance for consideration this evening.

#### ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLAIRE, TEXAS, CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION WITHIN THE CITY OF BELLAIRE, TEXAS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF AMENDING THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF BELLAIRE, TEXAS; ESTABLISHING THE DATE OF THE SPECIAL ELECTION ON THE UNIFORM ELECTION DATE DESIGNATED BY THE STATE OF TEXAS AS THE FIRST TUESDAY AFTER THE FIRST MONDAY IN NOVEMBER OR NOVEMBER 7, 2017; ESTABLISHING ELECTION PRECINCTS, POLLING PLACES, AND APPOINTING ELECTION OFFICIALS; AND SETTING FORTH CERTAIN GUIDELINES.

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 16-067, the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas appointed a Charter Review Commission and charged it with conducting an independent review of the City of Bellaire, Texas' Home Rule Charter; and

WHEREAS, on June 19, 2017 the Charter Review Commission presented its Final Report to the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas; and

WHEREAS, on July 17, 2017, the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas reviewed proposed Charter amendments and directed the City Attorney to prepare an Ordinance Calling a Charter amendment election; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 9.004 of the Texas Local Government Code, the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, is authorized to order an election for the purpose of amending the Home Rule Charter of the City of Bellaire, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, is required under Article XII, General Provisions, Section 10, Amending the Charter of the City's Home Rule Charter, to conduct its charter amendment election within 60 to 120 days after the passage of this ordinance and will hold such election on the uniform election date designated by the State of Texas as the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLAIRE, TEXAS:

**1. THAT** the recitals contained herein are true and correct.

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- 2. THAT a special election for charter amendments to the Home Rule Charter of the City of Bellaire, Texas, will be held on Tuesday, November 7, 2017, in conjunction with elections to be administered by Harris County, Texas ("County") for the City of Bellaire, Texas, the City of Houston, Texas, and other local entities.
- 3. THAT the following measures shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Bellaire, Texas, for approval or disapproval of proposed charter amendments to the Home Rule Charter of the City of Bellaire (language to be removed is shown by strike-out, language to be added is shown by underline):

## MEASURE A: Relating to conforming the Charter to the general laws of the State of Texas

Article I Incorporation; Form of Government, Corporate and General Powers

Sec. 5. - Liability of the City.

The City of Bellaire shall not be liable for personal injury or property loss or damage from any cause, including the negligence of City officials or City employees, in the performance of governmental functions, including the operation of the water system, the collection and disposition of garbage, the sewer system, the fire department, or any other governmental office, department or agency created by or operating under this Charter except as set forth in the Texas Civil Practices and Remedies Code, Title 5, Governmental Liability, Chapter 101 tort claims.

#### Sec. 6. - Eminent Domain.

- (a) General Provisions. The City shall have the right, power and authority to exercise the power of eminent domain when necessary or desirable to carry out any of the powers conferred upon it by this Charter, or by the Constitution or laws of the State of Texas, except as provided in subsection (b) and (c). In all cases where the City seeks to exercise the power of eminent domain, it may be controlled, as nearly as practicable, by the laws governing the condemnation of property by railroad corporations in this State, the City taking the position of the railroad corporation in any such case. The City may also exercise the power of eminent domain in any other manner authorized or permitted by the Constitution and laws of this State, or in the manner and form that may be provided by ordinance of the governing body of the City, except as provided in subsection (b) and (c). The power of eminent domain hereby conferred shall include the right of the City to take the fee in the lands so condemned; and such power and authority shall include the right to condemn public property for such purposes.
- (b) Limitations to Eminent Domain. The City's power of eminent domain shall be limited to the taking of private property exclusively for the ownership and the use by the City, Eminent Domain shall be prohibited in those cases.

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- in which the taking is motivated by economic development which involve the intent to resell any interest in the property acquired; and
- (2) which involve a joint venture or a collaborative arrangement with a private entity.
- (c) Exceptions to Limitations. The limitations in subsection (b) of this section are not intended to apply to
  - (1) a non-adverse (or a willing and friendly) condemnation or a condemnation when the majority of partial interest owners consider the condemnation to be non-adverse; and
  - (2) a condemnation necessary to cure the cloud on title to real estate or any other condition where a condemnation is deemed necessary in lieu of the transfer of title from a willing seller.

#### Sec. 7. - Street Powers and Improvements.

The City of Bellaire shall have exclusive dominion, control and jurisdiction in, upon, and over and under the public streets, avenues, alleys and highways of the City, and may provide for the improvement thereof by paving, re-paving, raising, draining, or otherwise and shall also include, but not be limited to, the right to supervise, regulate and otherwise control, locate, relocate, remove, or prohibit the location of, all utility pipes, lines, wires, or other property. In addition, the City shall have the power to lay out, establish, open, alter, widen, lower, extend, grade, abandon, discontinue, abolish, close, care for, pave, supervise, maintain and improve streets, alleys, sidewalks, parks, squares, public places and bridges; and regulate and/or restrict the use thereof; and require the removal from the streets, sidewalks, alleys and other public property or places of all obstructions, trespasses and/or encroachments of every nature or character.

#### Sec. 8. - Street Improvements.

The City of Bellaire shall have exclusive dominion, control and jurisdiction in, upon, and over and under the public streets, avenues, alleys and highways of the City, and may provide for the improvement thereof by paving, re-paving, raising, draining, or otherwise. The provisions of Chapter 106, 40th Legislature, First Called Session, Acts of 1927, together with existing amendments and all such amendments as hereinafter may be made, are expressly adopted and made a part of this Charter. Such exclusive dominion, control and jurisdiction in, upon, over and under the public streets, avenues, alleys and highways of the City shall also include, but not be limited to, the right to supervise, regulate and otherwise control, locate, relocate, remove, or prohibit the location of, all utility pipes, lines, wires, or other property.

#### Sec. 9. - Extending and Contracting City Limits by Action of the City Council.

The City Council shall have power by ordinance to fix the boundary limits of the City of Bellaire, and to provide for the extension of said boundary limits and the annexation of additional territory lying adjacent to said City, with or without the consent of the territory and/or inhabitants annexed. Upon the passage of such an ordinance by the city council

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one time, it shall be published in the official newspaper of the City of Bellaire one time. After at least thirty (30) days have elapsed from the date of such publication, said ordinance in original or amended form as said city council in its judgment may determine, shall be acted upon again, and if passed the territory so annexed shall thereupon become a part of the City of Bellaire, and any inhabitants thereof shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of other citizens of said City, and shall be bound by the acts, ordinances, resolutions and regulations of said City.

Any amendment to an ordinance annexing additional territory shall be advertised at least ten (10) days before final passage of the annexing ordinance, but any amendment eliminating from any such annexing ordinance property proposed to be annexed in the original ordinance or any amendment thereto need not be advertised.

Any area of the City may be disannexed pursuant to any procedure allowed under state law and whenever, in the opinion of the City Council, there exists within the corporate limits of the City a territory not suitable or necessary for City purposes, the City Council may discontinue said territory as part of the City by ordinance after conducting a public hearing on the matter.

Sec. 11. - Garbage Disposal.

The City Council shall have the right by ordinance to adopt and prescribe rules and regulations for the handling and disposition of all <u>recycling</u>, garbage, trash and rubbish within the City of Bellaire, and shall further have the right to fix charges and compensation to be charged by the City for the removal of <u>recycling</u>, garbage, trash and rubbish, and to provide rules and regulations for the collection of such charges and compensation.

Article II Sec. 14. - Municipal Court.

There is hereby established a Municipal Court of the City of Bellaire. The City Council shall appoint a Municipal Court Judge to serve a term of office of two (2) years. A Municipal Court Judge who is not reappointed by the 91st day following the expiration of a term of office shall, absent action by the City Council, continue to serve for another term of office beginning on the date the previous term of office expired. term as it shall prescribe and The City Council shall appoint such other associate judge or judges as it shall determine to be necessary and appropriate, for such terms as it shall provide. Such judge(s) may be removed for incompetency, misconduct or malfeasance. The compensation for the judge(s) of the Municipal Court shall be fixed by the City Council. The City Council shall have the power to make temporary or relief appointments of Municipal Court Judges, in the event of emergencies, for shorter periods of time than provided for the term(s) of the Municipal Court Judge and associate judge(s).

All costs and fines imposed by the Municipal Court, or by any court in cases appealed from judgments of the Municipal Court, shall be paid into the city treasury for the use and benefit of the City.

The City Council shall, by ordinance, appoint a Clerk of the Municipal Court and as many Deputy Clerks as shall be necessary. The Clerk of said Court or any Deputy City Clerk shall have power to administer oaths and affidavits, make certificates, affix the seal of said Court thereto and generally do and perform any and all acts usual and necessary by clerks of courts in issuing process of said courts and conducting the

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business thereof. In the event of the absence or unavailability of the Clerk or Deputy Clerk to serve, any Judge of the Municipal Court may appoint a temporary replacement who shall have the same powers and duties as herein provided for the Clerk or any Deputy Clerk.

Article X Initiative Referendum and Recall

Sec. 8. - Submission to Electors.

If the Council shall fail to pass an ordinance proposed by initiative petition, or shall pass it in a form different from that set forth in the petition therefor and not agreeable to the petitioners, or if the Council fails to repeal a referred ordinance, the proposed or referred ordinance shall be submitted to the electors of the City at a regular or special election to be held on the earliest possible uniform election date of the State of Texas, after the City Clerk certifies the submission to the City Council. The Council may, in its discretion, and if no regular election is to be held within such period shall, provide for a special election.

Sec. 19. - District Judge May Order Election.

Should the City Council fail or refuse to order any of the elections as provided for in this Article, when all the requirements for such elections have been complied with by the petitioning electors in conformity with this Article, then any individual with legal standing may bring suit in any court of competent jurisdiction for the purpose of enforcing the requirements of this Article of this Charter, then it shall be the duty of any one of the District Judges of Harris County, Texas, upon proper application being made therefor to order such elections and to enforce the carrying into effect of the provisions of this Article of this Charter.

Article XI Sec. 4. - Right of Regulation.

All grants, renewals, extensions, or amendments of public utility franchises, whether it be so provided in the ordinance or not, shall be subject to the right of the City:

- (1) To repeal the same by ordinance at any time for failure to begin construction or operation within the time prescribed or otherwise to comply with the terms of the franchise, such power to be exercised only after due notice and hearing;
- (2) To require an adequate extension of plant and service, and the maintenance of the plant and fixtures at the highest reasonable standard of efficiency;
- (3) To establish reasonable standards of service and quality of products and prevent unjust discrimination in services or rates;
- (4) a) To prescribe the form of accounts kept by each such utility; provided, that if the utility shall keep its accounts in accordance with the <u>applicable</u> uniform <u>accounting standards</u>. systems of accounts for said utility prescribed by the National Association of Railroad and Public Utility Commissioners, the Federal Power Commission, the Federal Communications Commission, the Railroad Commission of Texas, their successor or successors, this shall be deemed sufficient compliance with this paragraph;
  - b) At any time to examine and audit the accounts and other records of any such utility and to require annual and other reports, including reports on local

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operations by each such public utility:

- (5) To impose such reasonable regulations and restrictions as may be deemed desirable or conducive to the safety, welfare, and accommodation of the public; and
- (6) To at any time require such compensation and rental as may be permitted by the laws of the State of Texas.

Article XII

Sec. 2. - Personal Interest.

No member of the Council or any officer or employee of the City shall have a financial interest, direct or indirect or by reason of ownership of stock in any corporation, in any contract or in the sale to the City or to a contractor supplying the City, of any land or rights of interests in any land, material, supplies, or service. The City Council shall never authorize the expenditure of public funds for the development of any subdivision. Any willful violation of this section shall constitute malfeasance in office, and any officer or employee of the City found guilty thereof shall thereby forfeit his office or position. Any violation of this section with the knowledge express or implied, of the person or corporation contracting with the City shall render the contract voidable by the City Manager or the Council.

For purposes of this Section term "City Official" means any individual subject to the requirements of Texas Local Government Code, Chapter 171.

It is hereby prohibited for City Council members or a City Official to violate the rules and regulations regarding conflicts of interests as set out in the Texas Local Government Code, Chapter 171.

Sec. 10. - Amending the Charter.

Amendments to this Charter may be framed and submitted to the electors of the City by a Charter commission in the manner provided by law for framing and submitting a new Charter. Amendments may also be proposed and submitted by ordinance, passed by a majority vote of the full membership of the Council, or by a petition signed by not less than twenty-five percentum (25%) of the number of those who voted at the last regular municipal election; provided, however that in the latter case the petition must bear the signatures of at least ten percentum (10%) of the qualified voters of the City. When a Charter amendment petition shall have been filed with the Council in conformity with the provisions of this Charter as to petitions for initiated ordinances, the Council shall forthwith provide by ordinance for submitting such proposed amendment to a vote of the electors. Any ordinance for submitting a Charter amendment to the electors shall provide that such amendment be submitted at the next regular municipal election if one shall occur not less than sixty (60) nor more than one hundred twenty (120) days after the passage of the ordinance; otherwise, it shall provide for the submission of the amendment at a special election to be called and held within the time aforesaid. Not less than thirty (30) days prior to such election, the City clerk shall mail a copy of the proposed amendment or amendments to each qualified voter in said City as appears from the latest rolls of the tax collector. If a proposed amendment be approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon, it shall become a part of the Charter at the time fixed therein. Each amendment

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shall be confined to one subject; and when more than one amendment shall be submitted at the same time, they shall be so submitted as to enable the electors to vote on each amendment separately.

### **MEASURE B: Relating to Qualifications of Council Members.**

Article II

Sec. 2. - Qualifications.

To be eligible to be a candidate for, or elected to, office as Mayor or City Councilman of the City of Bellaire, or to continue to hold any such office, a person must:

- (1) Be a United States citizen;
- (2) Be twenty-one (21) years of age or older on the first day of the term to be filled at the election;
- (3) Have not been determined mentally incompetent by a final judgment of a court;
- (4) Have not been finally convicted of a felony from which the person has not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities;
- (5) Have resided continuously in the State of Texas and within the corporate limits of the City of Bellaire for twelve (12) months immediately preceding the filing deadline of the regular election; and
- (6) Be a qualified, registered voter of the State of Texas, County of Harris.

In addition, all candidates or persons elected to office as Mayor or City Councilman of the City of Bellaire shall meet all other requirements for office holders as may, from time to time, be specified by the Constitution and general laws of the State of Texas. If, at any time, any person holding the office of Mayor or City Councilman of the City of Bellaire no longer possesses all of the qualifications specified in this Section or is convicted of a felony or an offense involving moral turpitude while in office, such office shall, after a public hearing and determination by City Council pursuant to Section 16 be declared immediately and automatically become vacant.

Sec. 16 - Council to be Judge of Qualifications of its Members; Hearings; Process.

The Council shall be the judge of the election and qualifications of its members, and shall have the power to remove any member for malfeasance or nonfeasance in office, after public hearing, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the whole Council; for such purpose it shall have power to subpoena witnesses and require the production of records.

<u>A</u> <u>General.</u> The Council shall be the judge of the election and qualifications of its members, and shall have the power to investigate and to remove any member for malfeasance or nonfeasance in office, after public hearing, by a two-thirds (2/3)

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vote of the whole Council; for such purpose it shall have power to administer oaths, subpoena witnesses, compel the production of records books, papers, and other evidence material to the inquiry. The City Council shall provide, by ordinance, penalties for contempt in failing or refusing to obey any such subpoena or to produce any such books, papers or other evidence. The City Council shall have the power to punish any such contempt in the manner provided by such ordinance.

## <u>B.</u> <u>Hearings Process for Forfeitures of Office and Prohibitions.</u>

- All hearings held under this subsection shall be conducted in open session, except that the City Council may conduct a closed session to get advice from its attorney pursuant to the Texas Open Meetings Act;
- The office holder subject to any investigation and/or hearing under this section shall be entitled to written notice of the specific allegations made against them;
- 3. A special meeting shall be called to hold the hearing; the office holder who is the subject of the hearing shall not sit at the dais and shall not participate in deliberation or vote; and City Council shall adopt by ordinance rules of procedures to be followed which rules shall not be amended or repealed for a particular public hearing after written notice has been provided to the office holder; except and unless, agreed to by the office holder;
- 4. The City Council shall state the nature of the hearing and the allegations to be considered, shall be provided the results of any investigation and a presentation of the evidence against the office holder including, but not limited to testimony from individuals; the individual who is subject to the hearing shall be provided an opportunity to respond to the allegations and present any relevant evidence including, but not limited to, testimony from individuals; and City Council may ask questions of any individual; and
- 5. No public comment shall be allowed unless agreed to by a majority vote of the members of City Council present and rules for public comment, if allowed, shall be set by City Council.

### **MEASURE C: Relating to Council Stipend.**

Article II Sec. 3. – Compensation Stipend of Members of the City Council.

The Mayor shall receive as compensation a stipend for his services the sum of Seventy-five Four-Hundred Dollars (\$400.00 75.00) per month.

Each Councilman shall receive as compensation the sum a stipend of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each meeting of the City Council attended by him, provided that no Councilman shall receive a greater compensation than Fifty Two-Hundred Dollars (\$200.00 50.00) per month.

The stipend may be changed by the Council; however, no increase shall take effect unless ratified by a majority of the voters in the next regular City election. The City shall pay or reimburse reasonable expenses incurred by the Mayor or Council Members in the performance of specific duties, limited to the amount appropriated for such expenses in the current budget.

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### MEASURE D: Relating to the fine for failing to obey a subpoena

Article II Sec. 20. - Investigation by Council.

The Council shall have the power to inquire into the conduct of any office, department, agency, or officer of the City and to make investigations as to municipal affairs, and for the purpose may subpoena witnesses, administer oaths, and compel the production of books, papers, and other evidence. Failure to obey such subpoena or to produce books, papers or other evidence as ordered under the provisions of this section shall constitute a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars for each offense.

### MEASURE E: Relating to clarifying currently ambiguous language in the Charter.

Article II. The Council

Sec. 5. - Mayor Pro Tempore.

The City Council shall elect a Mayor Pro Tempore, who shall act as, and have all the powers of the Mayor during the absence or disability of the Mayor, and if a vacancy should occur in the office of Mayor, shall become act as, and have all the powers of the. Mayor until the next regular election, at which election a Mayor shall be elected to fill the full or unexpired term, as the case may be. The Mayor Pro Tempore's office shall not be considered vacant during any such time he or she is acting as the Mayor.

Sec. 11. - Council Not to Interfere in Appointments or Removals.

Neither the Council nor any of its members shall direct the appointment of any person to office, and such power is confided solely to the City Manager. The City Council shall have no power to remove any person appointed by the City Manager and shall have only the power to appoint and/or remove the City Manager. The Council shall deal with the administrative service solely through the City Manager, and neither the Council nor any member thereof shall give orders to any subordinate of the City Manager, either publicly or privately.

Neither the City Council nor the Mayor or any Councilmember shall in any manner dictate the appointment or removal of any city administrative officers or employees whom the City Manager or any of his subordinates are empowered to appoint, unless otherwise provided in this Charter. Further, except for the purpose of inquiries and investigations, unless otherwise provided in this Charter, the City Council, Councilmembers and the Mayor shall deal with City officers and employees who are subject to the direction and supervision of the City Manager solely through the City Manager, and neither the City Council nor Councilmembers nor the Mayor shall give orders to any such officer or employee, either publicly or privately.

Sec. 13. - City Clerk.

The Council shall appoint some person to serve as a City Clerk of the Council. The City Clerk shall report to the City Council. He shall give notices of its meetings, shall keep the official copy of this Charter and the journal of the Council's proceedings, shall authenticate by his signature and record in full in a book kept for the purpose all

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ordinances and resolutions, and shall perform such other duties as the City Manager shall assign to him.

Sec. 15. - Meetings of Council.

The City Council shall meet regularly at such times as may be prescribed by its rules, but not less frequently than twice each month. All meetings of the Council shall be subject to the Texas Open Meetings Act open to the public; special meetings shall be called by the City Clerk upon request of the Mayor, City Manager, or a majority of the members of the Council.

Four (4) members of the Council, of whom the Mayor shall be counted as one, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The affirmative vote of four (4) members shall be required for the transaction of business. A smaller number may adjourn from time to time.

Article X Sec. 8. - Submission to Electors.

If the Council shall fail to pass an ordinance proposed by initiative petition, or shall pass it in a form different from that set forth in the petition therefor and not agreeable to the <u>committee of the</u> petitioners, or if the Council fails to repeal a referred ordinance, the proposed or referred ordinance shall be submitted to the electors of the City at a <del>regular or</del> special election to be held on the earliest possible uniform election date of the State of Texas, after the City Clerk certifies the submission to the City Council. The Council may, in its discretion, and if no regular election is to be held within such period shall, provide for a special election.

## **MEASURE F: Relating to Vacancies on Council.**

Article II Sec. 6. - Vacancies in Council.

Vacancies in <u>office of Mayor Council</u>, the effective date of which shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code, shall be filled by a candidate possessing all of the qualifications outlined in Section 2 of this Article, at an election called for that purpose pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Constitution and the Texas Election Code.

In the event of a vacancy in the office of City Councilmember, the effective date of which shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code, if there are 365 days or more remaining on the term of the vacated office, the City Council shall call a special election to fill such vacancy. If there are fewer than 365 days remaining in the term of the vacant office, the City Council may, by majority vote of the remaining Members of City Council, at its discretion, leave the office vacant, appoint a new Councilmember to fill such vacancy or call a special election to fill such vacancy.

## **MEASURE G: Relating to the City Manager's authority to sign documents.**

Article III Sec. 2. - The City Manager; Powers and Duties.

The City Manager shall be the chief executive officer and the head of the administrative branch of the City government. He shall be responsible to the Council for the proper administration of all affairs of the City and to that end he shall have the power

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and shall be required to:

- (a) Appoint and remove all officers and employees of the City appointed by him, except as otherwise provided by this Charter, and except as he may authorize the head of a department to appoint and remove subordinates in such department;
- (b) Prepare the budget annually and submit it to the Council and be responsible for its administration after adoption;
- (c) Prepare and submit to the Council as of the end of the fiscal year a complete report on the finances and administrative activities of the City for the preceding year;
- (d) Keep the Council advised of the financial condition and future need of the City and make such recommendations as may seem to him desirable; and
- (e) Sign all documents, contracts and conveyances made or entered into by the City, and all bonds, pursuant to any relevant policy adopted by City Council, except where the City Council has authorized the Mayor to sign said document as provided for in Article II Section 4 of this Charter.
- (e<u>f</u>) Perform such other duties as may be prescribed by this Charter or required of him by the Council, not inconsistent with this Charter.

### **MEASURE H: Relating to the authority to borrow money.**

Sec. 1. - Power to Incur Indebtedness by Issuing Bonds, Warrants and Notes.

The City of Bellaire shall have the right and power to borrow money on the credit of the City for any lawful public purpose, including without limitation permanent public improvements, as may be determined by the City Council, and to issue bonds, warrants, notes, or other evidence of indebtedness of the City therefor in accordance with state law.

## Sec. 2. - Bond Ordinance; Vote Required.

The issuance of tax bonds must be approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting at an election called for that purpose.

The City shall authorize the issuance of bonds by a "bond ordinance" passed by the affirmative votes of the majority of all members of its Council. Revenue bonds may be issued by the Council in accordance with state law.

The bond ordinance and the manner of conducting the election shall in all respects conform to this Charter and the general laws of the State.

#### Sec. 3. - Issuance of Bonds.

When an issue of bonds has been authorized, the City shall have the power to issue serial bonds or otherwise as in its opinion may seem best as provided in the ordinance authorizing their issuance, not to exceed thirty (30) years. However, all character of securities issued for street improvements shall be for a period of not exceeding twenty (20) years. All bonds shall specify on their face for what purpose they are issued, and they shall be invalid if sold for less than their par value, plus accrued

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interest. When any such bonds are issued by the City a fund shall be provided to pay the bonds at maturity. The regulations of this section shall likewise govern warrants, notes and other evidences of indebtedness.

Sec. 4. - Public Sale.

All bonds issued under this Charter shall be sold at public sale upon sealed proposals after at least ten (10) days' notice published at least once in a publication carrying municipal bond notices and devoted primarily to financial news, and at least ten (10) days notice published at least once in the official newspaper of the City.

If no satisfactory bid is received under the above procedure, the Council may have the power to negotiate a sale at a better price within a ten-day period following the opening of bids; otherwise, the sale of bonds must be readvertised.

#### Sec. 5. - Register of Bonds.

The City Council shall cause to be kept for and on behalf of the City a complete register and set of books showing all bonds, warrants and other evidences of indebtedness issued by the City, the date and amount thereof, the rate of interest, maturity, all bonds, warrants or other evidences of indebtedness surrendered, all transactions of the City Council having reference to the refunding of any of the indebtedness of the City, and all other information that may be desired or required. Records with reference to bonds and warrants and other evidences of indebtedness shall be kept separately. When bonds, or warrants, or other evidences of indebtedness, or their coupons, are paid, their payment or cancellation shall be noted in said register.

### **MEASURE I:** Relating to the administration of the City's finances.

Article VII Finance Administration

Sec. 4. - Director of Finance; Powers and Duties.

Under the direction of the CityManager, the Director of Finance shall have charge of the administration of the financial affairs of the City and to that end, he shall have authority and shall be required to:

- (1) Supervise and be responsible for the disbursement of all moneys and have control over all expenditures to ensure that budget appropriations are not exceeded:
- (2) Maintain a general accounting system for the city government and each of its offices, departments and agencies; keep books for and exercise financial budgetary control over each office, department and agency; keep separate accounts for the items of appropriation contained in the city budget, each of which accounts shall show the amount of the appropriation, the amounts paid therefrom, the unpaid obligations against it and the unencumbered balance; require reports of receipts and disbursements from each receiving and spending agency of the city government to be made daily or at such intervals as he may deem expedient;
- (3) Submit to the City Council through the City Manager a monthly statement of all receipts and disbursements in sufficient detail to show the exact financial

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- condition of the City;
- (4) Prepare, as of the end of each fiscal year, a complete financial statement and report;
- (5) Collect all taxes, special assessments, license fees and other revenues of the City or for whose collection the City is responsible and receive all money receivable by the City from the state or federal government, or from any court, or from any office, department or agency of this City;
- (6) Have custody of all public funds belonging to or under the control of the City, or any office, department or agency of the city government, and deposit all funds coming into his hands in such depository or depositories as may be designated by the City Council, subject to the requirements of law in force from time to time as to the furnishing of bond or the deposit of securities and the payment of interest on deposits. All such interest shall be the property of the City and shall be accounted for and credited to the proper account;
- (7) Have custody of all investments and invested funds of the city government, or in possession of such government in a fiduciary capacity, and have the safekeeping of all bonds and notes of the City and the receipt and delivery of city bonds and notes for transfer, registration or exchange;
- (8) Supervise and be responsible for the purchase, storage and distribution of all supplies, materials, equipment and other articles used by any office, department or agency of the city government; and
- (9) Approve all proposed expenditures; unless he shall certify that there is an unencumbered balance of appropriation and available funds, no expenditure shall be made.

#### Sec. 8. - Fees Shall be Paid to City Government.

All fees for City services received by any officer or employee shall belong to the City Government, and shall be paid to the Department of Finance at such times as required by the Director of Finance.

## Sec. 12. - Accounting of Property.

The Director of Finance shall maintain, or cause to be maintained, reliable accounts of the City's investment in permanent property by departments, and shall fix responsibility for the custody and property use of all City owned equipment, structures, and land.

He shall be responsible for the accounting control of all permanent property of the City.

As used herein, the term "equipment" means all items of movable property purchased by, or assigned to, a department or division which cost or have a value of Five Dollars (\$5.00) each, or more, and can normally be expected to have a useful life of one year or more.

The head of each department shall be held accountable for the safekeeping of all movable equipment in his department.

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#### Sec. 16. - City May Carry Own Paper.

The City shall have the power to purchase or otherwise acquire improvement certificates and/or mechanic's lien contracts of the owners of property abutting or adjacent to public improvements authorized by the City Council and thereafter constructed in the City. Moneys from the City's general fund may be used for such purchases and/or the proceeds of bonds may be used where such proceeds could lawfully be expended directly for such improvements, or in aid thereof.

#### Sec. 17. - Borrowing in Anticipation of Property Taxes.

In any budget year, in anticipation of the collection of the property tax for such year, whether levied or to be levied in such year, the Council may by resolution authorize the borrowing of money by the issuance of negotiable notes of the City, each of which shall be designated "tax anticipation note of the year 19\_\_\_\_" (stating the budget year). Such notes shall mature and be payable not later than the end of the fiscal year in which the original notes shall have been issued.

#### Sec. 18. - Borrowing in Anticipation of Other Revenues.

In any budget year, in anticipation of the collection or receipt of other revenues of that budget year, the Council may by resolution authorize the borrowing of money by the issuance of negotiable notes of the City, each of which shall be designated "special revenue note for the year 19\_" (stating the budget year). Such notes may be renewed from time to time, but all such notes, together with the renewals, shall mature and be payable not later than the end of the fiscal year in which the original notes shall have been issued.

#### Sec. 19. - Sales of Notes, Report of Sale.

All notes issued pursuant to this article may be sold at not less than par and accrued interest at private sale by the Director of Finance without previous advertisement, but such sale shall be authorized by the Council.

#### MEASURE J: Relating to unnecessary provisions.

Article II

Sec. 17. - Rules of Procedure; Journal.

The Council shall determine its own rules and order of business. It shall keep a journal of its proceedings and the journal shall be open to public inspection.

#### Sec. 21. - Independent Audit.

Prior to the end of each fiscal year, the Council shall designate a certified public accountant who, as of the end of that fiscal year, shall make an independent audit of accounts and other evidences of financial transactions of the city government, and shall submit a sworn report to the Council. Notice shall be given provided by publication in on the official newspaper website of the City of Bellaire that the annual audit is on file at the City Hall for inspection. Such accountant shall have no personal interest, direct or

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indirect, in the fiscal affairs of the city government. They shall not maintain accounts or record of the City business, but, within specifications approved by the Council, shall post-audit the books and documents kept by the Department of Finance and any separate or subordinate accounts kept by any other office, department or agency of the city government. Such accountants may make monthly checks, or a general audit at more frequent intervals as the Council may direct.

#### MEASURE K: Relating to Initiative.

Article X Sec. 1. - Power of Initiative.

The electors shall have power to propose any ordinance except an ordinance appropriating money or authorizing the levy of taxes, and to adopt or reject the same at the polls, such power being known as the initiative. Any initiative ordinance may be submitted to the Council by a petition signed by qualified electors of the City equal in number to at least six percent (6%) of the number of voters registered to vote at the last general City election twenty-five percent (25%) of the number of votes cast at the last regular municipal election; provided, however, that the petition shall contain the signatures of at least two hundred (200) qualified electors of the City. Bond elections may be initiated by petition to the City Council as above provided.

## MEASURE L: Relating to recall petitions.

Article X Sec. 14. - Recall Petitions.

The recall petition to be effective must be returned and filed with the City Clerk within thirty (30) days after the filing of the affidavit required in Section 13 and it must be signed by qualified electors of the City equal in number to at least fourteen percent (14%) of the number of voters registered to vote at the last general City election fifty-one percent (51%) of the total number of votes cast at the last general municipal election, and shall conform to the provisions of Section 3 herein. No petition paper shall be accepted as part of a petition unless it bears the signature of the City Clerk as required in Section 13 herein.

#### **MEASURE M:** Relating to referendum.

Article X Sec. 2. - Power of Referendum.

The electors shall have power to approve or reject at the polls any ordinance passed by the Council, or submitted by the Council to a vote of the electors, such power being known as the referendum. Ordinances submitted to the Council by initiative petition and passed by the Council without change shall be subject to the referendum in the same manner as other ordinances. Within twenty (20) days after the enactment by the Council of any ordinance which is subject to a referendum, a petition signed by qualified electors of the City equal in number to at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the number of votes cast at the last preceding regular municipal election six percent (6%) of the number of voters registered to vote at the last general City election may be filed with the City Clerk requesting that any such ordinance be either repealed or submitted to a vote of the electors; provided, however, that such petition shall contain the signatures of at least two hundred (200) qualified electors of the City.

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### **MEASURE N: Relating to referendum.**

Article X Sec. 2. - Power of Referendum.

The electors shall have power to approve or reject at the polls any ordinance passed by the Council, or submitted by the Council to a vote of the electors, such power being known as the referendum. Ordinances submitted to the Council by initiative petition and passed by the Council without change shall be subject to the referendum in the same manner as other ordinances. Within twenty (20) thirty (30) days after the enactment by the Council of any ordinance which is subject to a referendum, a petition signed by qualified electors of the City equal in number to at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the number of votes cast at the last preceding regular municipal election may be filed with the City Clerk requesting that any such ordinance be either repealed or submitted to a vote of the electors; provided, however, that such petition shall contain the signatures of at least two hundred (200) qualified electors of the City.

#### **MEASURE O: Relating to franchises.**

Article XI Sec. 2. - Franchises; Power of Council.

The City Council shall have power by ordinance to grant, amend, renew and extend all franchises of all public utilities of every character operating within the City of Bellaire and for such purposes is granted full power. All ordinances granting, amending, renewing, or extending franchises for public utilities shall be read at three two (2) separate regular meetings of the City Council with such readings being at least ten (10) days apart, and shall not be finally passed until thirty (30) days after the first reading; and no such ordinance shall take effect until sixty (60) days after its final passage; and pending such time, the full text of such ordinance shall be published once each week for four (4) two (2) consecutive weeks in the official newspaper of the City of Bellaire, and the expense of such publication shall be borne by the proponent of the franchise. No public utility franchise shall be transferable except with the approval of the Council expressed by ordinance.

#### **MEASURE P: Relating to transitory provisions**

Article XI Sec. 8. - Franchise Records.

Within six (6) months after this Charter takes effect Every public utility and every owner of a public utility franchise shall file with the City, as may be prescribed by ordinance, certified copies of all franchises owned or claimed, or under which such utility is operated in the City of Bellaire. The City shall compile and maintain a public record of public utility franchises.

#### MEASURE Q: Relating to Non-Substantive Revisions.

A. Proposed Charter Language.

Sec. 13. - Rearrangement and Renumbering of Charter and Elimination.

The City Council shall have the power by ordinance to renumber and rearrange all articles, sections and paragraphs of this Charter, or any amendments thereto. The

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City Council shall have the further power by ordinance to eliminate gender-specific references within the various provisions of this Charter and to substitute gender-neutral terms, as it shall deem appropriate. Upon the passage of any such ordinances, a copy thereof, certified by the City Clerk, shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State of the State of Texas for filing.

#### Sec. 13. Non-Substantive Revisions

The Council shall have the power, by ordinance, to make the following non-substantive revisions to the Charter, so long as such revisions do not affect the intent of the Charter:

1) renumbering and rearranging all articles, sections, and paragraphs of this Charter or any amendments; 2) to make any grammatical or typographical corrections to this Charter; and 3) to make the Charter gender neutral. Upon the passage of any such ordinance, a copy certified by the City Clerk shall be forwarded to the Clerk of the State for filing.

4. THAT the official ballot for the Special Election shall be prepared in accordance with the *Texas Local Government Code* and the Home Rule Charter of the City of Bellaire, Texas, so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid Measures, which shall be presented to the electors in the form of the following PROPOSITIONS separately which shall be set forth in substantially the following form:

Forehand to purchase said 615 square feet of vacant land from the City of Bellaire, Texas; and authorizing the City Manager and the City Clerk of the City of Bellaire, Texas, to execute and attest, respectively, any documents necessary to effectuate such abandonment and sale including, but not limited to a special warranty deed for said 615 square feet of land - Submitted by ChaVonne Sampson Development Services Interim Director on behalf of Petitioners Larry and Kristina R. Forehand.

#### **Background/Summary:**

On August 7, 2017, City Council held a public hearing on the abandonment of 615 square feet of vacant land located along the east line of Wendell Street, commonly known as 4403 Wendell Street. The petition was submitted by Larry and Kristina R. Forehand, owners of the property at 4401 Wendell Street.

Should the City Council choose to grant the Petitioners' request, an ordinance has been prepared for City Council's consideration that would abandon and sell the City's interest in said portion of land to the Petitioners.

During the Regular Session of August 21, 2017, City Council will need to determine a sales price of said portion of land utilizing either the independent appraisal performed by Celso Torres, with Torres & Associates, or George Kahle Group. In addition, a schedule detailing the history of the abandonment of public properties since 2001 (i.e., the effective date of the City's ordinance setting forth a policy and guidelines for the abandonment and sale of public property) is attached hereto for informational purposes.

The ordinance also states that the abandonment and sale is authorized for a period of six months from the date of passage of the ordinance.

#### **Recommendation:**

Interim Director of Development Services, unlike prior abandonment requests, views this petition as though it is not an abandonment of Right of way. In addition, if the portion of the lot is sold, a non-conforming lot will remain, with a lot area of 4,560 square feet and a lot width of 44 feet. Both are less than the minimum requirements set forth for a lot in the R-4 Zoning District. Staff has offered the Petitioners the option to enter into a "Right to Encroach Agreement," which would allow them to make any minor improvements to the property. The Forehands denied the offer, preferring to buy the property instead.

Although the likelihood of the removal of the lift station is minimal, maintaining the buffer of the six foot area between the lots is best for the types of activity that are currently taking place.

City Staff recommends that the section of property remain unsold at this time. This will allow for any future expansion of the site to take place, although plans of such do not currently exist. Maintenance of the property will be ongoing, and the tree located on the east property line will be removed.

Should the City Council choose to grant the Petitioners' request, City Staff recommends the land be sold at the full price of \$19,000, as shown in the appraisal prepared by George Kahle Group.

#### **Item Title:**

Consideration of and possible action on the adoption of a resolution of the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas establishing a policy that the City update the Flood Hazard Mitigation Plan in accordance with the process prescribed by the Community Rating System (CRS) of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), and authorizing the City Manager to establish a Flood Hazard Mitigation Task Force to update the aforementioned plan -Submitted by ChaVonne Sampson, Interim Director of Development Services.

#### **Background/Summary:**

The City of Bellaire has been certified with the Community Rating System (CRS) of the National Flood Insurance Program since 1993, and currently has a CRS Rating of 7. This rating provides our residents a 15% reduction on their flood insurance premiums.

The City is currently adhering to the 2007 CRS Manual. By establishing the Flood Hazard Mitigation Plan Task Force and updating the City's Current Flood Hazard Mitigation Plan, in accordance to Activity 510 as found in the CRS Planning Steps, Bellaire will be able to meet the requirements of the 2017 CRS Manual. This is a requirement of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

The Activity 510 planning steps require the planning team (the task force being established) meet at least 5 times to review, amend and adopt the Flood Hazard Mitigation Plan. Additionally, a Public Hearing is required to obtain input on the recommended plan. Once established the City along with ARKK Engineers will schedule the 5 required meetings. We anticipate holding the Public Hearing in November of this Year. The plan is expected to be before Council in February 2018 for consideration.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 17-\_\_\_\_**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLAIRE, TEXAS, ESTABLISHING A POLICY THAT THE CITY UPDATE THE FLOOD HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN IN ACCORDANCE WITH A PROCESS PRESCRIBED BY THE COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM OF THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM, AND AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO ESTABLISH A FLOOD HARARD MITIGATION TASK FORCE TO DEVELOP THE AFORMENTIONED PLAN.

**WHEREAS,** the City of Bellaire, Texas is located within an area of Harris County, which from time to time is negatively impacted by heavy rainfall, storm water run-off, drainage, and occasional flooding; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Bellaire, Texas has been certified by the Community Rating System since 1993 and currently has a rating of 7; and

**WHEREAS,** some properties within the City of Bellaire, Texas have been severely damaged due to the effects of flooding during historical rainfall events; and

**WHEREAS,** the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, recognizing the problems associated with poor drainage and potential flooding, did establish a Citizens Advisory Task Force on Drainage Issues, which was charged with the accomplishment of specific objectives to mitigate the hazards associated with flooding; and

**WHEREAS,** the Citizens Advisory Task Force on Drainage Issues, in carrying out its charge, determined that it is in the best interests of the City of Bellaire, Texas, to continue participation in the Community Rating System of the National Flood Insurance Program in order to provide flood insurance premium discounts for its residents; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive planning process resulting in an updated Flood Hazard Mitigation Plan as prescribed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency will accomplish most of the objectives of the Flood Hazard Mitigation Task Force on Drainage Issues, as well as keep the City of Bellaire, Texas, in good standing with the Community Rating System; NOW, THEREFORE,

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## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLAIRE, TEXAS:

- 1. THAT it be the policy of the City of Bellaire, Texas, that the City of Bellaire, Texas, engage in a process that results in the update of the Flood Hazard Mitigation Plan in order to identify flood hazards that will limit the impact of flood-related losses to commercial and residential property within the City of Bellaire, Texas, and to remain in good standing in the Community Rating System of the National Flood Insurance Program.
- **2. THAT** the City Manager is hereby authorized to establish a Flood Hazard Mitigation Task Force consisting of the following components as outlined in the Community Rating System:

#### **Flood Hazard Mitigation Task Force**

At least one stakeholder per staff member, to be selected from the following areas:

- Bellaire Homeowner (x2)
- Utility Company
- Builder/Developer
- Previous Board or Commission Member

#### **Staff technical Advisory Team**

At least one staff member from the following Departments:

- Development Services
- Public Works
- Parks, Recreation, & Facilities
- Public Safety (Police or Fire)
- City Manager's Office

#### **Consulting Technical Advisory Team**

- Flood Mitigation Consultant
- **3. THAT** the Flood Hazard Mitigation Task Force be charged with the following:
  - a. Update the City of Bellaire, Texas Flood Hazard Mitigation Plan;
  - Identify and assess hazards associated with the problem of flooding and provide recommended solutions for those problems;
  - c. Keep the public informed of its deliberations and recommendations, and of any proposed changes to the floodplain structure for the City of Bellaire, Texas; and

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- d. Prepare a post-flood hazard mitigation plan for the City of Bellaire, Texas, that designates target areas and recommends mitigation measures appropriate for the flood hazard facing the City of Bellaire, Texas.
- **4. THAT** property owners in the City of Bellaire, Texas are encouraged to:
  - a. Attend public meetings to review the City of Bellaire, Texas' mitigation planning activities; and
  - b. Assist in updating the mitigation plan by providing information on their experiences and damage during extreme storm events.
