Parks, Recreation and Facilities Update February 2018

ADMINISTRATION

- Karl and Cheryl completed Parks Board orientation with Gus Pappas and Lisa Lim.
- Post Hurricane Harvey has impacted the City's 60-day minimum fund balance, which has
 required the City to temporarily hold off on some Capital Improvement Projects, such as, a
 reduction in the pavement management program, vehicle replacement program and the Bellaire
 Family Aquatic Center Improvement project. The BFAC has been put on hold through this fiscal
 year and will be reconsidered during next year's budget process.
- Staff is working with the Evelyn's Park Conservancy to ensure a smooth transition while they seek a new Executive Director.
- Sharon Veldman did a great job of presenting the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board's 2017 annual report at the State of the City.

RECREATION

- The summer 2018 Specialty Camp schedule is set, and the City of Bellaire website has been updated with relevant links, documents and registration information for those camps. There will be over seventy (70) different half or full day camp options to choose from over the twelve week summer session, for campers ages 3 and up.
- Online summer camp registrations began on Monday, February 12, and in-person registrations for Bellaire residents will begin on Monday, February 19, with all registrations open to the public on Monday, February 26.

SPECIAL EVENTS

ATHLETICS

- Youth Basketball is half-way through the season with forty four (44) teams, kids age 8-10.
- Youth Soccer begins March 19.

BLIFE

- Eighteen (18) seniors attended Bingo in the month of January.
- Bunco's had eleven (11) seniors in attendance.
- Movie day, featuring *Gifted* had twenty six (26) seniors in attendance.
- Thirty-three (33) seniors went on the trip to the Round Top Antique Winter Show.
- Twelve (12) seniors met at Café Piquet for Let's Do Lunch.
- Three (3) seniors participated in Games Day.
- Eight (8) seniors participated in Crafts Day.
- Sixty (6) seniors attended the Lunch N Learn on Strong before Skinny.
- The trip to Lone Star Flight Museum was cancelled due to snow/ice.
- BLIFE continues to have Bridge on Mondays and Fridays and Crafts and Conversation on Wednesdays.

PARKS

- Holly St. Trail received some trail maintenance adding crushed granite in low areas, following that up with tampering to level and compact. Currently working with landscape contractor to get pricing to add some more Asian Jasmine in the first median closest to S. Rice.
- Trash enclosures have been ordered for Nature Discovery Center, Holly St., Paseo Park and BFAC.
- Working with summer intern and arborist to complete tree inventory project, identifying all
 "unknown" trees, then update all maps and graphs. Once completed the final project will be
 shared with the Parks Board.
- Removed several bushes from Evelyn's Park along Mulberry lane parking lot and replanted at Evergreen Park. The removal was necessary to improve line of sight while leaving the parking lot on Mulberry.
- Completed Tree Trimming on ten (10) oaks in and around Jessamine Field to reduce the crown and remove some lower laterals and lower suckers.
- Completed a new landscape design at railroad track and Bellaire Blvd., seasonal flowers will be

added in March.

- Completed two (2) fence panel repairs at Lafayette Park due to vehicular damage.
- Completed water fountain repairs at Mulberry, Loftin and Feld. Mulberry was the only "freeze" related repair.
- Replaced a PBV at Nature Discovery Center and Feld Park that were damaged due to cold temperatures.
- Parks Crew removed some minor graffiti from the Paver Wall behind City Hall.
- Replaced an electrical transformer at Feld Park.
- Replaced left field service gate at Feld Field on softball field.
