#### **Item Title:**

Consideration of and possible action on the adoption of an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, appointing Christopher T. Gore as Deputy Assistant City Attorney for the City of Bellaire, Texas, for a two-year term commencing on the 1st day of October, 2018, and ending on the 30th day of September, 2020, for the purpose of serving as Deputy Prosecutor in the Municipal Court of the City of Bellaire, Texas - Submitted by Tracy L. Dutton, City Clerk.

#### **Background/Summary:**

Chapter 2, Administration, Article IV, Legal Department, Section 2-63, Appointment of assistant city attorneys, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Bellaire, Texas, authorizes the City Council to appoint, for a term as specified in the instrument of appointment, such assistant city attorneys as shall from time to time be deemed necessary and advisable, for the purpose of acting as prosecutors in the municipal court of the City of Bellaire.

As you know, Robert C. Richter, Jr., serves as the City's Assistant City Attorney/Prosecutor in our Municipal Court. In addition, the City Council previously appointed two Deputy Assistant City Attorneys to serve as Deputy Prosecutors in our Municipal Court if Prosecutor Richter is absent as follows: E. Stanley Topek (term: March 7, 2017, to March 6, 2019) and Christopher T. Gore (term: October 1, 2016, to September 30, 2018).

Deputy Prosecutor Gore's term will end on September 30, 2018. I spoke with Prosecutor Richter about Deputy Prosecutor Gore, and he provided the following recommendation by email:

"I am recommending that Chris Gore be re-appointed as Deputy City Attorney to prosecute in the Municipal Court of the City of Bellaire, Texas, for another term of two years.

Chris is an excellent prosecutor and is always happy to agree to step in to prosecute when I am not able to be in court.

I know Chris to be able, trustworthy and fully dedicated in all respects and clearly understands the role of prosecutor in the municipal court (i.e. to see that justice is done)."

An ordinance has been prepared for City Council consideration to appoint Christopher T. Gore as a Deputy Prosecutor in the Bellaire Municipal Court for an additional two-year term commencing on October 1, 2018 and ending on September 30, 2020.

#### **Previous Council Action Summary:**

Christopher T. Gore was appointed as Deputy Assistant City Attorney/Deputy Prosecutor by the City Council on September 19, 2016, by Ordinance No. 16-050.

#### **Fiscal Impact:**

Compensation for the Deputy Assistant City Attorney/Deputy Prosecutor is \$200.00 per docket during the term of appointment (Ordinance No. 13-022). Funds have been included in the fiscal year 2019 budget for this compensation.

- **2. #### **Background/Summary:**

Currently the use and consumption of alcohol within Bellaire Town Square is prohibited pursuant to Section 3-3 of the Bellaire Code of Ordinances.

Currently the curfew imposed by the City of Bellaire, Texas, for Bellaire Town Square begins at 11:00 p.m. in Bellaire Town Square pursuant to Section 27-95 of the Bellaire Code of Ordinances;

In August 2018, the City of Bellaire received a letter from Patrons for Bellaire Parks requesting that the City Council waive or suspend the provisions of the Bellaire Code of Ordinances relating to the use and consumption of alcoholic beverages (beer and wine) in Bellaire Town Square and extending the curfew start time from 11:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m. for up to ten events to be hosted by Patrons for Bellaire Parks between October 1, 2018, and September 30, 2019. Approval of which shall be granted by the City Manager on a case-by-case basis.

Each request would be subject to the same permitting requirements as outlined in the permit process to allow alcohol in the Bellaire Civic Center and the CenterPoint Energy Community Center.

#### **Previous Council Action Summary:**

Council has previously waived alcohol and curfew restrictions for The PATRONS for Bellaire Parks to host up to six events annually in Bellaire Town Square subject to the approval of the City Manager and the City of Bellaire's permitting requirements for use of alcohol in Community Centers.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLAIRE, TEXAS, GRANTING A CODE SUSPENSION FOR PATRONS FOR BELLAIRE PARKS RELATING TO A REQUEST TO WAIVE ALCOHOL AND CURFEW RESTRICTIONS IN BELLAIRE TOWN SQUARE FOR UP TO TEN EVENTS BETWEEN OCTOBER 1, 2018, AND SEPTEMBER 30, 2019.

**WHEREAS,** the use and consumption of alcohol within Bellaire Town Square is prohibited pursuant to Section 3-3 of the Bellaire Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the curfew imposed by the City of Bellaire, Texas, for Bellaire Town Square begins at 11:00 p.m. pursuant to Section 27-95 of the Bellaire Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated August 2, 2018, Patrons for Bellaire Parks has requested that the City Council waive or suspend the provisions of the Bellaire Code of Ordinances relating to the use and consumption of alcoholic beverages in Bellaire Town Square and extend the curfew start time from 11:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m. for up to ten events to be hosted by Patrons for Bellaire Parks between October 1, 2018, and September 30, 2019; and

WHEREAS, Patrons for Bellaire Parks is a not-for-profit citizen's organization that works to enhance and augment the parks and green spaces within the City of Bellaire, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, finds that granting the request of Patrons for Bellaire Parks will assist the mission of Patrons for Bellaire Parks and in turn directly benefit the City of Bellaire, Texas; NOW, THEREFORE,

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLAIRE, TEXAS, THAT:

1. The recitals set forth above are found to be true and correct.

- 2. The City Council of the City of Bellaire, Texas, hereby suspends the application of Section 3-3 of the Bellaire Code of Ordinances and extends the curfew start time from 11:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m. for up to ten events hosted by Patrons for Bellaire Parks between October 1, 2018, and September 30, 2019.
- 3. The suspension and curfew extension provided for in paragraph 2 above is subject to and contingent upon the City Manager's approval of the date of the event and, as it relates to alcohol, compliance with the requirements of Section 3-5 of the Bellaire Code of Ordinances relating to the permit procedures for the use and consumption of alcoholic beverages in City-Owned public places.
  - 4. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.

#### **Background/Summary:**

The ordinance under consideration would grant Sagstex/Wolfie's, the right to redevelop an approximately 3,125 square foot portion of the right-of-way, generally located between 5200 and 5230 of Cedar Street, as a parking lot to support the commercial buildings located at 5200 and 5230 Cedar. The additional parking would afford the property owner the added flexibility of finding tenants that better meet the local service needs. 5200 Cedar is currently undergoing a soon to be completed renovation.

The agreement gives Sagstex/Wolfie's exclusive use of the property and allows them to develop and maintain a parking lot for an initial period of 15 years, with the option of an additional 15 years. Included in the agreement is their responsibility for maintenance of the landscaping for the area. No fee for this use is proposed.

#### **Previous Council Action Summary:**

On May 21st, 2018, City Council considered a petition for the abandonment and subsequent sale of an interest of the (3,125 sqft) alley for the amount of \$155,000.00. The Development Services & Public Works Directors' recommendation was a lease agreement as an alternative. At that time, the petitioner preferred to purchase the alley.

The request was denied.

#### **City Attorney Review:**

The City Attorney has reviewed the proposed Ordinance.

#### **Recommendation:**

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLAIRE, TEXAS:

**THAT** the City Manager of the City of Bellaire, Texas, is hereby authorized to execute, for and on behalf of the City of Bellaire, Texas, a License, Use and Development Agreement by and among the City of Bellaire, Texas, Sagstex Investments, LP, and Wolfie's Swim School, in a form as attached hereto and marked as "Attachment A," for the use of city property within the right-of-way generally located between 5200 and 5230 Cedar Street for commercial parking.

#### LICENSE, USE AND DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

	This License, Use and Development Agreement (this "Agreement") is made and entered into
on	, 2018, by and between the CITY OF BELLAIRE ("Bellaire"), and Sagstex
Investr	nents, LP, a Texas limited partnership ("Sagstex") and Wolfie's Swim School, LLC, a Texas
limited	liability company ("Wolfie's").

#### **RECITALS**

Bellaire is the owner of that certain roughly rectangular tract of land, being a portion of an alley, depicted on the attached Exhibit A (the "Property"), located on Cedar Street, between the property owned by Sagstex at 5224 Cedar Street, Bellaire, Texas, and the property owned by Wolfie's located at 5230 Cedar Street, and being described on Exhibit B attached hereto ("the Alley").

Sagstex and Wolfie's desire to obtain from Bellaire an agreement and right to develop, landscape and use the Property for additional parking spaces servicing the properties at 5224 Cedar Street and 5230 Cedar Street.

Bellaire is willing to grant a license to Sagstex and Wolfie's for use of the Property upon the terms, covenants and conditions hereinafter set forth.

#### **AGREEMENT**

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of good and valuable consideration paid by Sagstex and Wolfie's, and the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, Bellaire and Sagstex and Wolfie's hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Grant of Rights. Bellaire hereby grants a license to Sagstex and Wolfie's upon and subject to the terms, covenants and conditions hereinafter set forth, to the Property and the exclusive right to develop, improve and use the Property as provided herein and for no other use. Bellaire hereby consents and approves the development and improvement of the Property in substantial accordance with the site plan for the Property attached as Exhibit C hereto, provided such improvements are effected (i) in accordance with all applicable federal, state, county or local laws, statutes, ordinances, codes, regulations and/or orders, including compliance with all permitting requirements of Bellaire (collectively the "Laws"), (ii) at Sagstex and Wolfie's sole cost and expense, and (iii) within one (1) year of the date of this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Landscaping/Signage</u>. Bellaire additionally grants Sagstex and Wolfie's the right to landscape and/or otherwise decorate the Property as Sagstex and Wolfie's may determine, as well as install signage on the Property relating to 5224 Cedar Street and/or 5230 Cedar Street or any business thereon, provided the same comply with all applicable Laws and will not materially, negatively affect the drainage on the Property or any improvements located therein.
- 3. <u>No Obligation of Bellaire</u>. Sagstex and Wolfie's expressly acknowledges and agrees that Bellaire shall have no obligation or any duty to monitor or enforce in any way Sagstex and

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Wolfie's rights to use the Property or the parking thereon on behalf of Sagstex and Wolfie's or for the benefit of the properties at 5224 Cedar Street and 5230 Cedar Street. Bellaire hereby allows and consents to Sagstex and Wolfie's to mark, designate or otherwise install signage indicating the use of such parking spaces for the properties at 5224 Cedar Street and 5230 Cedar Street or any tenants or occupants thereon.

- 4. <u>Term.</u> The Term of this Agreement shall commence on the date first written above and end on the last day of the one hundred eightieth (180<sup>th</sup>) full calendar month hereafter (the "Initial Term"), after which time this Agreement shall be automatically extended for one (1) additional period of fifteen (15) years, provided, however, that either party may terminate this Agreement at the end of the Initial Term by providing written notification of such termination to the other party at least one (1) year in advance of such termination.
- 5. <u>Consideration</u>. As consideration to Bellaire for entering into this Agreement, Sagstex and Wolfie's agree to improve, operate, maintain, insure, and repair the Property in accordance with the specific terms contained herein.
- 6. Property Condition, Maintenance and Repair. SAGSTEX AND WOLFIE'S ACKNOWLEDGE THAT BELLAIRE HAS NOT MADE, AND DOES NOT MAKE, ANY REPRESENTATIONS OR WARRANTIES CONCERNING THE CONDITION OR STATE OF REPAIR OF THE PROPERTY, AND THAT SAGSTEX AND WOLFIE'S HAVE MADE THEMSELVES FAMILIAR WITH THE PROPERTY AND ITS CONDITION. SAGSTEX AND WOLFIE'S ACCEPT POSSESSION OF THE SPACES AND THE PROPERTY IN THEIR AS IS, WHERE IS CONDITION AND WITH ALL FAULTS. Except for those improvements shown or that can be inferred from the site plans attached hereto as Exhibit C, and except for the landscaping and decorations referred to in Par. 2 above, Sagstex and Wolfie's shall make no other alterations, improvements, or modifications to the Property, or any part thereof without the consent of Bellaire, not to be unreasonably withheld, delayed or conditioned. Notwithstanding the foregoing, however, Sagstex and Wolfie's improvements must comply with Bellaire's permitting requirements.

Sagstex and Wolfie's agree to keep the Property in a good, attractive condition, and shall periodically remove all trash and debris therefrom in accordance with reasonable and prudent commercial property management practices.

7. <u>Liability</u>. Sagstex and Wolfie's RELEASE AND WAIVE all liabilities, claims, damages, and causes of action against Bellaire or any of Bellaire's employees, representatives or agents (with Bellaire collectively, the "Bellaire Parties") for damage to property and for injuries or death to persons, from any cause arising, at any time, out of, or in connection with, the use and exercise by Sagstex and Wolfie's of the rights granted herein, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, ANY LIABILITIES, CLAIMS, DAMAGES OR CAUSES OF ACTION THAT MAY ARISE IN WHOLE OR IN PART FROM THE NEGLIGENT ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF BELLAIRE OR ANY OF THE BELLAIRE PARTIES.

Further, Sagstex and Wolfie's hereby agree to INDEMNIFY, DEFEND AND HOLD the Bellaire Parties, and each of them, harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims, demands, damages, causes of action, fines, costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs, which may be asserted against or suffered by the Bellaire Parties or any of them,

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and arising out of or in connection with, directly or indirectly, the exercise of the rights granted herein by Sagstex and Wolfie's or any other person or entity using the Property, or from any act or occurrence pertaining to the exercise of this Agreement granted herein that occurs on or about the Property, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION ANY LIABILITIES, CLAIMS, DEMANDS, DAMAGES, CAUSES OF ACTION, FINES, COSTS AND EXPENSES THAT MAY ARISE IN WHOLE OR IN PART FROM THE NEGLIGENT ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF THE BELLAIRE PARTIES, OR ANY OF THEM.

The terms of this Paragraph 7 shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

8. <u>Insurance</u>. During the entire term of this Agreement, Sagstex and Wolfie's shall, at their sole cost and expense, but for the mutual benefit of Bellaire and Sagstex and Wolfie's, maintain commercial general public liability insurance with a combined single limit of not less than \$2,000,000.00. Such insurance policy or policies shall expressly cover Sagstex and Wolfie's indemnity obligations under this Agreement. All such policies of insurance shall be carried with companies reasonably satisfactory to Bellaire and shall name Bellaire as an additional insured. Copies of such policies, and certificates of insurance, shall be delivered to Bellaire upon request.

In addition, Sagstex and Wolfie's agree that they, and not the Bellaire, shall be responsible for the repair or restoration any damage or destruction to the parking surface of the Property, whether or not caused or in any way arising because of Sagstex and Wolfie's, their guests or invitees, or any tenants of Sagstex and Wolfie's or their respective guests of invitees.

- 9. <u>Assignment</u>. Sagstex and Wolfie's shall have no right to assign this Agreement, or sublet or license all or any portion of the Property.
- 10. <u>No Public Dedication</u>. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to be a gift or dedication of any portion of the Property to the general public or to any governmental body or agency, or for the general public or for any public use or purpose whatsoever; it being the intention and understanding of the parties hereto that this Agreement shall be strictly limited to and for the purposes herein expressed solely for the private benefit of the parties hereto.
- 11. <u>Sagstex and Wolfie's Default/Remedies</u>. The occurrence of the following event shall constitute a default and breach of this Agreement by Sagstex and Wolfie's:
  - (a) The failure by Sagstex and Wolfie's to observe or perform any of the covenants, conditions or provisions of this Agreement to be observed or performed by Sagstex and Wolfie's, where such failure shall continue for a period of thirty (30) days after written notice thereof by Bellaire to Sagstex and Wolfie's, provided, however, that in the event that such failure cannot be reasonably cured within such 30-day period, Sagstex and Wolfie's shall not be in default hereunder and shall have a reasonable period of time thereafter to cure the same exercising due diligence.

Upon an uncured event of default hereunder, Bellaire shall have the right, but not the obligation, to cure such default, and Sagstex and Wolfie's shall promptly reimburse Bellaire for all sums reasonably expended in connection therewith, together with interest thereon at the rate (herein referred to as the "Default

Rate") equal to the lesser of (i) the maximum non-usurious rate allowed by applicable law, or (ii) eighteen percent (18%) per annum, from the date of demand by Bellaire for reimbursement until paid. Further, Bellaire pursue any and all rights and remedies at law or in equity to recover all of such sums. Further, if Sagstex and Wolfie's fail to cure a default after notice as provided in this paragraph, Bellaire may enforce the terms of this Agreement by restraining order and by temporary and permanent injunction prohibiting such breach and commanding Sagstex and Wolfie's to comply with all of the terms hereof, however, that the act of obtaining an injunction or restraining order shall not be deemed to be an election of remedies or a waiver of any other rights or remedies available at law or in equity.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, no breach of this Agreement shall entitle any party to cancel, rescind, or otherwise terminate the same, but such limitation shall not affect, in any manner, any other rights or remedies which the parties may have hereunder by reason of any breach of this Agreement.

- 12. <u>Right to Purchase</u>. In the event that Bellaire decides to sell the Property, Bellaire hereby grants Sagstex and Wolfie's the sole and exclusive right to purchase the Property in accordance with the procedures set forth in Chapter 27 of Bellaire's City Code. For purposes of such purchase, it is agreed that the value of the Property shall be calculated as of the date of such sale.
- 13. <u>Limitation of Liability</u>. Under no circumstances whatsoever shall any party hereunder ever be liable hereunder for consequential, speculative, punitive, or any other special damages, all of which are hereby deemed waived by the parties. Further, the liability of either party hereto shall be limited to the time period(s) during which any party owned in fee simple all or any portion of the Property and/or the Alley, and upon the conveyance of such fee simple interest such party shall have no liability or obligations hereunder arising or accruing on or after the date of such conveyance.
- 14. <u>Notice</u>. Any written notice or communication permitted hereunder shall be delivered to the address of the intended recipient set forth below. Any such notice is deemed delivered and received by the intended recipient (i) three (3) days after being deposited in the United States mail properly addressed to the party to be notified, postage prepaid and registered or certified with return receipt requested; (ii) upon delivery of the same in person to such party; (iii) when sent by telecopy transmission, on the date of transmission if prior to 5:00 p.m. local time of the recipient, otherwise the next business day, or (iv) when sent by nationally recognized overnight express delivery service, upon actual receipt as indicated on the signed receipt. For purposes of notice, the addresses of the parties are as follows:

- 15. <u>Attorneys' Fees</u>. In the event it becomes necessary for either party hereto to file suit to enforce this Agreement or any provision contained herein, the party prevailing in such suit shall be entitled to recover, in addition to all other damages, as provided herein, reasonable attorneys' fees incurred in such suit.
- 16. Estoppel Certificates. Sagstex and Wolfie's and Bellaire agree at any time and from time to time (but not more than two times in any consecutive 12 month period), upon not less than ten (10) business days' prior written request from the other party, to execute, acknowledge and deliver to the requesting party a statement in writing, in form and content reasonably acceptable to both parties, an estoppel certificate certifying that this Agreement is unmodified and in full force and effect (or if there have been modifications, that the same is in full force and effect as modified and stating the modifications), certifying that it is not in default (or if a default is alleged, stating the nature of the alleged default), and further certifying such other reasonable matters as the requesting party shall require. It is intended that any such statement delivered pursuant to this paragraph may be relied upon by any prospective purchaser, lender, subtenant, assignee or any entity which is a party to a potential merger, consolidation with or to the acquisition of substantially all of the assets or stock of Bellaire or Sagstex and Wolfie's. In the event either party shall fail to execute and deliver any such instrument within the foregoing time period as requested, the requesting party may send a completed estoppel certificate, along with a second request, which request shall state in bold, capitalized letters that the completed estoppel shall be deemed accurate if the party to whom it is sent does not respond to address any inaccuracies within five (5) business days after receipt of the second request.
- 17. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement embodies the entire agreement between the parties relative to the subject matter hereof, and there are no oral or written agreements between the parties, nor any representations made by either party relative to the subject matter hereof, which are not expressly set forth herein.
- 18. <u>Amendments</u>. This Agreement may be amended only by a written instrument executed by the party or parties to be bound thereby.
- 19. Governing Law. THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE GOVERNED BY AND CONSTRUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS. EACH PARTY HEREBY DESIGNATES THE COURTS OF TEXAS AS THE COURT OF PROPER JURISDICTION AND VENUE OF AND FOR ANY AND ALL LAWSUITS OR OTHER LEGAL PROCEEDINGS RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT AND

# IRREVOCABLY CONSENTS TO SUCH DESIGNATION, JURISDICTION, AND VENUE. THIS AGREEMENT IS PERFORMABLE IN HARRIS COUNTY, TEXAS.


- 20. <u>Memorandum of Agreement</u>. At the request of either party hereto, Bellaire and Sagstex and Wolfie's agree to execute and record a written Memorandum of Agreement in a form reasonably acceptable to both parties.
- 21. <u>Severability</u>. - 22. <u>Time of the Essence</u>. Time is of the essence in connection with Sagstex and Wolfie's performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- 23. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts with the same effect as if all signatory parties had signed the same document. All counterparts will be construed together and will constitute one and the same instrument. A signature sent by telecopy, PDF or similar format will have the same effect as an original signature.

#### **Item Title:**

Consideration of and possible action to direct the City Manager concerning the scope of the Group C Phase 2 Street, Drainage and Sidewalk project, specifically with regard to a request from residents of Bolivar Street to not construct sidewalks along their block as planned - Submitted by Michael Leech, Director of Public Works.

#### **Background/Summary:**

In the September 7, 2018 weekly memorandum to City Council (attached) it was explained that the Bonds for Better Bellaire 2016 (BBB16) Group C Phase 2 project, would be split into segments to expedite construction of some of the proposed improvements.

One of the expedited projects is the re-construction of Bolivar Street which is scheduled to receive 100 year storm sewer improvements, a new concrete roadway and sidewalk. The design of the project is 90% complete. Regardless of the decision making about a sidewalk for this project, Public Works anticipates returning to City Council in January with a construction contract for consideration.

On July 23, 2018, the City Clerk received a petition from the residents of Bolivar explaining their opposition to sidewalk. The petition is attached as is a plan view exhibit of the Bolivar improvements. Additionally several images of the existing conditions along Bolivar, Pembrook Court and Jessamine, are attached to provide perspective. Both Pembrook and Jessamine are adjacent to Bolivar.

#### **Previous Council Action Summary:**

City Council authorized the City Manager to execute a design contract with Costello Inc., on March 20, 2017 for the design of BBB16 Group C Phase 2.


This petition is in reference to the Bellaire Public Works Department's plan to install contiguous sidewalks on Bolivar Street and Pembrook Court. The property owners at these locations request the termination or at minimum the postponement of this project due to the flooding our city has experienced over the last 3 years. Most of us were fortunate to escape any flood damage during the May 2015 and April 2016 storms, but Hurricane Harvey was not so kind.


During Harvey, several homes on Pembrook Court were inundated with flood waters and the residents of Bolivar Street were inches from experiencing the same (one Bolivar resident was not as fortunate). The planned sidewalks will remove permeable ground and replace it with concrete. There is no way to know if the additional amount of concrete would have caused flooding in our homes during Harvey, but it is logical to assume it would have clearly increased the probability.

In addition, work is currently underway to modify Brays Bayou with the goal of eliminating, or at the very least, reducing the chance of flooding in the Bellaire/Meyerland areas. Until such time as that work has been completed and storm tested, we request that the Bellaire Public Works Department postpone this project.











#### **Background/Summary:**

At the December 4, 2017 City Council meeting, a professional services design contract in the amount of \$137,303.60 was awarded to MBCO Inc., to provide design services for the Bonds for Better Bellaire 2016 (BBB16) Group D phase 2 stand along sidewalk project. The streets included in this project are listed below. Please note that a sidewalk width recommendation is included as well. This recommendation is consistent with City Council direction provided on the  $20^{\rm th}$  of August to implement a five-foot sidewalk standard along street segments / blocks where there is no existing four-foot sidewalk.

As part of the BBB16 program and at the December 4, 2017 City Council meeting, a professional services design contract in the amount of \$137,303.60 was awarded to MBCO Inc., to provide design services for the Bonds for Better Bellaire 2016 (BBB16) Group D phase 2 stand along sidewalk project.

The design of the project has been stopped pending City Council Direction. However, the design consultant continues to meet with residents to address their concerns. The design of the project is approximately 70% complete.


#### **Recommendation:**



### Dear Bellaire City Council:

Some residents of the 5200 block of Laurel St. are opposed to the construction of sidewalks on any side of the street, pursuant to Bonds for Better Bellaire 2016 Program (Group D - Phase II Sidewalks). By this petition we wish to convey our preference.

Among the reasons are the following:

- 1. Potential damage to decades-old trees and landscaping due to construction, excavation and the proposed sidewalks themselves.
- 2. The proposed location of some portions of the sidewalk on the south side of the street meanders through and divides the yards of 5205 Laurel St. and 5207 Laurel St. in half, positioning the sidewalks unreasonably, unaesthetically and uncomfortably close to the front doorways of those homes.
- 3. Proposed removal of a sizeable tree at 5203 Laurel St.
- 4. Addition of impermeable surfaces at the time when better drainage and flood abatement is more critical than ever. 

# Proposal to Modify Sidewalk Design for 4800 Block of Cedar Street Respectfully submitted by Gordon and Roula Shahin (4801 Cedar) and Mari and Dale Rude (4802 Cedar)


The purpose of this proposal is to change the design of the proposed sidewalks and spare a grove of five trees in the cul-de-sac.

#### Rationale

1) Current sidewalk plan includes elimination of 5 trees in cul-de-sac (see plan below; orange means elimination). The grove of trees are integral to the cozy neighborhood feel. The trees are mature, full, and tall. They provide a visual shield for the busy commercial traffic on First Street and the parking garage across First Street. The grove blocks traffic noise from First Street and the West Loop.




- 2) As designed, the sidewalk encroaches beyond the easement and into the owners' property at 4801. The owners do not want the sidewalk to cross their property and will not give permission for the sidewalk to be placed upon their property.
- 3) The current plan requires moving the following items:
  - a) A fire hydrant,
  - b) A city drain cleanout,
  - c) A French drain (the drain will not work properly if a 4" sidewalk is placed over it),
  - d) 5 sprinkler heads and one sprinkler main at 4801 Cedar Street, the water meters at 4801 and 4803 Cedar, and
  - e) The bollards/posts at 4800.



### **Proposed Design**

We propose that 1) a crosswalk be created between 4802 and 4803 Cedar near the 4802 driveway and 2) the sidewalk around the cul-de-sac be eliminated.



#### Background

The 4800 block of Cedar Street is a model neighborhood for Bellaire and the greater Houston area. A block phone list is updated and redistributed every time a new family moves on to the street. For the 25th year, the street is hosting successful spring and fall block parties. The most recent block party had 65 attendees with 17 of the 25 block households and four households from nearby blocks represented. Our block parties have been featured in the Houston Chronicle (4/22/2002) and the Bellaire Buzz (8/2014).

The close neighborhood atmosphere is surprising give the location and social makeup of the block. The cul-de-sac ends at First Street. Across First Street is a large parking garage and associated commercial complex. The West Loop of 610 is a block away and carries over 200,000 cars per day. The majority of households are comprised of busy dual career professionals-physicians and other medical professionals, attorneys, energy professionals, accountants, educators, and business professionals.

Some residents of the **5200** of **Willow St**. are opposed to the construction of sidewalks on any side of the street, pursuant to Bonds for Better Bellaire 2016 Program (Group D-Phase II Sidewalks). By this petition we wish to convey our preference.

A few of the reasons for our preference not to construct this sidewalk follows:

- 1. The need for a sidewalk is not clearly recognized. This block has sparse foot traffic and very little vehicular traffic. The city has offered no documented traffic studies to the contrary.
- 2. With the city projecting a deficit, installing a unwanted and unneeded sidewalk is fiscally irresponsible.
- 3. The city does not need to add any more impermeable surfaces when the need for these surfaces does not clearly exist.
- 4. Three mature pine trees at 5212 Willow St. will need to be removed or likely perish within 3 years due to severe root damage.

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
